Additionally, there will be elementary classes for mild to moderate NSH students who are used to mainstreaming that will be held at general education elementary sites.

Additional classes for next fall will include new transitional kindergarten, new 18-22 transition and the creation of a mental health class for 18-22.

The department is adding the position of coordinator of special education for mental health services and director of special education for secondary.

Teacher trainings in the fall may include a strand for special education teachers on the use of assistive technology and autism training for general education teachers.
