

The CAHSEE is a test that high school students must pass to receive a high school diploma. The ELA section tests state standards through the 10th grade. The passing score for the ELA part of the CAHSEE is approximately 60 percent of items correct or a scale score of 350.



Yearly Indicator 5: 10th Grade CAHSEE Math Pass Rate will increase by 2%

The CAHSEE is a test that high school students must pass to receive a high school diploma. The mathematics section tests 6th and 7th grade state standards in Algebra 1. The passing score for the mathematics part of the CAHSEE is approximately 55 percent of items correct or a scale score of 350.



Yearly Indicator 6: PSAT Selection Index will increase 3%

The PSAT is a standardized test that measures <u>Critical Reading</u>, <u>Mathematics</u>, and <u>Writing</u> skills. All WCCUSD 9th, 10th, and 11th graders take the PSAT in October each year. The Selection Index is the sum of the three scores in each test section (CR + M + W) and ranges from 60 to 240.









Yearly Indicator 37: % students meeting at least 5 of 6 PFT standards will increase by 2%

The Physical Fitness Test (PFT) tests six fitness areas including: 1) Aerobic Capacity, 2) Abdominal Strength and Endurance, 3) Upper Body Strength and Endurance, 4) Body Composition, 5) Trunk Extensor Strength and Flexibility, and 6) Flexibility. Students in grades five, seven, and nine take the fitness test.
