Teachers on Special Assignment Going Back to Classroom for 2016 -17 School Year – Nia Rashidchi & Ken Whittemore

With the shortage of teachers in the State of California, and our priority for having high quality teachers in every classroom on the first day of school for our students, all Program Assistants, Teachers on Special Assignment, Project Assistants, and Classroom Coaches were informed that they would be returning to the classroom for the 2016-17 school year.

It is important for the board to know that some union contractual guidelines and state, federal, and grant mandates require the return of some of these people to roles mentioned above. To be fair to all members, we are going to post each required position and allow all to apply for these limited number of jobs. This will ensure a fair process for all of our employees. To that end, we will be working with UTR as we replace the positions needed to meet the above-mentioned guidelines.

The Educational Services Department will continue to make sure the professional development needs of our teachers are met. Human Resources will continue to diligently recruit teaching staff to meet our demand and perhaps allow us to return more of the above mentioned positions (given they are a key element to improving outcomes for students). Caliber Prop 39 and Administrative Services – Lisa LeBlanc

Beginning in the 2016-17 school year, Caliber Charter School will be utilizing the 900 wing at Kennedy High School. As a result, the staff serving students and parents in the 900 wing need to be relocated. Change often provides an opportunity, and in this case the intent is for the district to establish a full service student center in a more central location, joining the Student Service/Transfer Office at the Bissell Avenue location. The Educational Services Department and K-12 Operations Department will offer the following services at the Bissell Avenue location:

Early Learning Department Services – Provides outreach, enrollment, and assessment services for preschool students, as well as offers referrals of support services to early learning (PreK and Transitional Kindergarten) families. The department also supports sites to implement transitional kindergarten and ensures compliance with State and Federal regulations.

- Student Transfer Services
- Registration, Assessment, and Placement (RAP) Center Services

In order to accomplish this the Business Services Department will move into the building with the Facilities department. This will result in greater efficiency and synergy in pairing the accounts payable and budget departments with the highest use customer, the facilities department. It is anticipated that this move will take place in May.

Dear Dr. Harter:

Our office has reviewed your district's Negotiated Salary Settlement Disclosure documents that provide the details for the tentative agreement with the West Contra Costa Unified School District's United Teachers of Richmond (UTR) bargaining unit for the July 1, 2015 – June 30, 2018 fiscal years.

We agree with the district's certification that it will be able to provide the necessary funding for the 6.0% salary increase (on-going) effective 02/01/2016, the 3.0% salary increase (on-going) effective 07/01/2016, the 3.0% salary increase (on-going) effective 01/01/2017.Based on our analysis of the disclosure documents, it appears the agreement will result in an increase in costs of \$25,500,000 to the District for fiscal years 15/16, 16/17, and 17/18. The District will utilize its general fund, special reserves, and other funds. We agree with the District's assessment on affordability at this point in time, but based on the MYP (3 year), approximately \$5 million in reductions need to be made in 16/17 to fund this increase and maintain the District's targeted reserve. The District has made a list of potential reductions that will be presented to their Board for decisions. We encourage the District to be conservative in their spending and future salary negotiations.
