West Contra Costa Unified School District Criteria for Cost Neutral K-8 January 2009

- 1. While there may be one-time costs for changes to the campus such as adding relocatable classrooms, there are no on-going or additional operating costs. To qualify for adding 6th, 7th and 8th grade classrooms, there must be sufficient acreage for the additional classrooms without substantially displacing playground or other space for the current K-5 or K-6 students. Gym space or specialty classrooms (science, music) would not be added.
- 2. Seats available are limited to allow parents to choose to keep or transfer 6th, 7th and then 8th graders in or into an elementary school environment;
- 3. The K-8 program will be built around an elementary school schedule with 7th and 8th graders taught at standards in the core academic subjects in a self-contained model;
- 4. In order to make space available for added 7th and 8th graders in that attendance area, transfers may be revoked and ancillary programs (child care) occupying school owned facilities may be required to move;
- 5. Equipment for science labs, technology, textbooks, materials would be brought in to the K-8 school from other schools where available due to decreased enrollment or school closure; there would be no additional expense for equipment and materials;
- 6. Students who wish to take instrumental music, foreign language, tech labs, career wheels, etc. would have to take them at other schools or in after school programs;
- 7. Multi-subject teachers would be assigned to 7th and 8th grade classrooms rather than attempting to hire single subject teachers. In this respect, K-8 schools would help the district have sufficient single subject teachers for the remaining middle schools.
