As part of our SPSA Math SMART Goal, the assessment Olinda will utilize to measure our student's progress is STAR Math. We recently received our subscription and the month of October will serve as our testing window. Teachers in grades K through 6th will administer the STAR Math assessment to their students. You may connect with your child's teacher to find out the specific testing dates as they pertain to your child's classroom. These results will be available to families during Parent Teacher conferences, which take place in November. In addition, teachers will be sharing our ELA and Math SMART goals to students in grade level kid-friendly language, so they are aware of the school wide expectations we have for our scholars.

<u>ELA SMART Goal</u>: By May 2018, 70% of students in grades Kindergarten through 6th grade will move up one Instructional Reading proficiency level and 75% will be at or above grade level, as measured by the Renaissance Learning STAR and Early Literacy Reading Assessment.

<u>Math</u> <u>SMART Goal</u>: By May 2018, all students in grades Kindergarten through 6th grade will move up one proficiency level as measured by the STAR Math assessment.

Tablet deployment will take place by the end of this month for students in grades 3rd through 6th. To support this endeavor our ILT will be hosting a Parent Night around technology, for families of students in grades 3rd through 6th, on Thursday 10/19 in the MPR from 6-7pm. Topics covered will include tablet care, troubleshooting, online learning and more. Please RSVP by 10/12. In addition, all students in grades 3rd-6th will need to provide the following items to in order to take the tablets home: 1. Student acceptable use policy, 2. Electronic mobile device agreement and 3. Technology agreement. Please submit these forms to your child's teacher or the office.
