

What is it?

Early Literacy development begins from birth to three years old and is closely linked to a child's experience with text and oral language.

The interactions that young children have with literacy materials and caregivers in their lives are the building blocks for language, reading, and writing development.

In WCCUSD, Early Literacy instruction is based on the areas of reading comprehension, fluency, vocabulary, phonemic awareness and writing in grades PreK through 2nd grade.





Why is it important?



A 30 million word gap exists, between low-income and high-income students, BEFORE they enter Kindergarten. We need to provide targeted and direct supports in Early Literacy in order to bridge this gap.

Powerful early literacy practices engage families, educators, and the community to support students' literacy development and lead to reading proficiency.

Current Number of Prek-TK students enrolled in WCCUSD Pre K and TK classes is 885.
