<p>Essay due dates: Essays are worth 20% of the quarterly grade!</p>		<p>Homework: We read a book each quarter of the school year.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Students are expected to keep up with the chapters that we read each week. • There will be an assignment every week with questions and vocabulary words from the chapters that we are reading that week. Students will have some time in class to complete those questions, but any work that they don't finish during class must be completed before the quiz that we take each week. • The purpose of the assignments is to help students study for the quizzes. The more thoroughly students complete the questions, the better prepared they'll be for that week's quiz.

<p>Quizzes/Tests: We will take a quiz <i>almost</i> every Thursday. Quizzes will cover the meanings of vocabulary words, the spelling of vocabulary words, and knowledge of important details from the chapters that we have read that week.</p>

REQUIRED MATERIALS:

GRADES:

The following areas will make up the student's total grade.

Classwork/Homework	= 40%
Tests & Quizzes	= 40%
Projects/Essays	= 20%

(For the first quarter of this school year, we will forgo an essay in order to focus on grammar skills that might have gotten a bit rusty over the past year of online learning. We will also try to improve students' keyboarding/typing skills. Hopefully, this will serve as a less-stressful re-entry to in-person classes for the students. As a result, classwork and assessments will make up the entire grade for the first quarter.)

MAKEUP WORK:

- 1.) Always contact the teacher (email is the best method), or a classmate when you need to find out about missed assignments, or need help completing them. Most assignments will be posted in Google Classroom, so check there first.
- 2.) Students are responsible for arranging makeup tests & quizzes with the teacher. Make sure that you speak with Mr. Gadd when you know that you need to make up a quiz or test. We take a quiz almost every week.
- 3.) Most assignments can be turned in via Google Classroom or StudySync, even if you can't be present in the classroom on the day when the assignment is due. If you still aren't able to turn in an assignment on time, please contact Mr. Gadd directly.
