The plans are available for review on the District website and at the State and Federal Programs department located at the Seaview Campus.

### \*CI G.11 Certificated Provisional Internship Permit (PIP) Request(s)

### Comment:

The Provisional Internship Permit (PIP) was created in response to the phasing out of emergency permits and became effective on July 1, 2005. It allows an employing agency to hire an individual who has not yet met the subject matter competence requirement needed to enter an internship program. Prior to requesting a PIP, the employing agency must verify that a diligent search has been made, and a fully credentialed teacher cannot be found. The PIP is issued for one (1) year and is renewable one time only provided the teacher has taken all appropriate subject matter examinations, but has not yet passed those tests.

### \*CI G.12 Notification of Claim Approval and Settlement Payment

#### Comment:

The District received a claim regarding compensation for personal injury. The District's risk management firm has investigated the claim and is requesting the School Board to ratify authorized settlement payment. #### \*CI G.14 Ratification and Approval of Engineering Services Contracts

#### Comment:

Contracts have been initiated by staff using previously qualified engineering, architectural, or landscape architectural firms to assist in completion of the referenced projects. Many of the firms are already under contract and the staff-initiated work may be an extension of the firm's existing contract with the District. Public contracting laws have been followed in initially qualifying and selecting these professionals.

Recommendation: Ratify and approve contracts

Fiscal Impact: Total for this action: \$272,719. Funding sources as noted.

#### \*CI G.15 Ratification and Approval of Negotiated Change Orders

#### Comment:

Staff is seeking ratification of Change Orders on the following current District construction projects: Pinole Valley HS Restroom Renovations; DeAnza HS Demolition, Utilities, Sitework; DeAnza HS Fieldhouse; Downer Elementary New School. Change Orders are fully executed by the District upon signature by the Superintendent's designee. Board ratification is the final step required under state law in order to complete payment and contract adjustment. Recommendation: Ratify negotiated Change Orders as noted.

Fiscal Impact: Total ratification and approval by this action: \$200,774.75.

#### \*CI G.16 Ratification of Previously Awarded Contract

#### Comment:

The following construction contract was approved by the Board at its meeting of September 17, 2008. This action was taken prior to the expiration of the Bid Protest period in order to expedite the start of the work. In this case, the Board authorized staff to issue the Notice of Award. The Education Code requires the Board to ratify this award action by staff. The following contract was awarded by staff pursuant to Board authorization after successful completion of the Bid Protest period:

**Bay Cities Paving and Grading**. Leadership Public Schools Temporary Campus. Contract award: \$1,616,000. This project had a Bid Protest which was subsequently confirmed, the apparent low bidder was declared non-responsive.

Recommendation: Ratify previously awarded contract

<u>Fiscal Impact:</u> \$66,000. Additional fiscal impact is the difference between non-responsive apparent low bidder and awarded contract amount to lowest responsive, responsible bidder.

#### \*CI G.17 Network Support Services RFP #0809-01

#### Comment:

Proposals were sought from qualified service providers with certified technicians and engineers to assist when workload priorities increase or outside expertise is required. Three vendors submitted proposals: LAN LOGIC, AEKO Consulting, and USWired. Staff recommends LAN LOGIC, a local provider based in Livermore, with consistently high scores in pricing, unlimited Help Desk monthly support, past experience with school districts, and staff qualifications.

The Board's action will be to authorize staff to negotiate the contract provisions. The contract will then be brought back for ratification at a future meeting.

Recommendation: Recommend Approval

Fiscal Impact: \$35,000 General Fund

### \*CI G.18 Student Information System (SIS) & Services RFP #0809-02

#### Comment:

The district has been using the application software SASI as its student information system (SIS) for many years. The company that developed and supported SASI over the years is discontinuing the product line and this has required the district to select another application. The application selection is just one step towards fully implementing a new SIS system district wide.

The information that sits within the SIS system generates much of the district's revenue stream. Countless reports to the state regarding attendance, proof of federal compliance related to grants and programs, tie-overs into multiple other local systems, in-district staffing models, and hundreds of other information needs depend on this system. Proposals were sought from qualified firms or individuals to provide a Student Information System and associated project management services related to the implementation of the software. Two vendors submitted proposals: Sungard and Pearson School System. Staff recommends Pearson School System, the same SIS provider the District has used since 1991. Pearson's PowerSchool was rated with consistently high scores in pricing, CA state reporting requirements, and hardware OS versatility requirements (MAC, Windows, Windows CE).

The Board's action will be to authorize staff to negotiate the contract provisions. The contract will then be brought back for ratification at a future meeting.

Recommendation: Recommend Approval

Fiscal Impact: Approximately \$398,840. Microsoft Voucher Grant

This resolution represents the West Contra Costa Unified School District's support of the Red Ribbon Campaign October 23 - 31, 2008. Red Ribbon Week may be celebrated one week during the year, but its effects last throughout the year.

This year, some of the school activities will include prevention curriculum lessons, poster/essay/decoration contests, wear-red days, letter writing, school assemblies, etc. The focus of this week is not only on drug-free youth but also on safe and healthy communities.

She provided a brief report on major funding sources and upcoming revisions to the budget based upon the 45 day review requirement within the Education Code. She reported that there is no real improvement to the unrestricted revenues based upon the Governor's budget and the questionable nature of State revenues means the district can expect mid-year reductions in 2008-09. She also reported that all the changes would be incorporated into the First Interim Report which will be presented to the Board in December.

She expects no State movement to raise taxes or correct its deficit and is projecting flat revenues. Should the district learn that specific programs are being cut in January, these will be brought to the Board.

Ms. Kronenberg asked about the parent satisfaction survey. Ms. Oklan-Arko responded that it is a district created survey mailed to parents of children with approximately a 60% return rate. The data are used for informal feedback to the CDE.

Mr. Ramsey commented on services for children of poverty.

Ms. Pfeifer asked about students taking advantage of these services. Ms. Oklan-Arko provided information regarding the funds available and the number of eligible students. She explained that when the funds are not expended they revert to Title I carryover for redistribution the following year to school sites councils. Ms. Pfeifer further asked whether the district monitors student performance before and after SES. Ms. Oklan-Arko said it is hard to isolate the impact of supplemental services from other efforts also made by Title I schools.

**Subject:** Student Information System (SIS) & Services RFP #0809-02

#### **Background Information:**

The district has been using the application software SASI as its student information system (SIS) for many years. The company that developed and supported SASI over the years is discontinuing the product line and this has required the district to select another application. The application selection is just one step towards fully implementing a new SIS system district wide.

The information that sits within the SIS system generates much of the district's revenue stream. Countless reports to the state regarding attendance, proof of federal compliance related to grants and programs, tie-overs into multiple other local systems, in-district staffing models, and hundreds of other information needs depend on this system.

Proposals were sought from qualified firms or individuals to provide a Student Information System and associated project management services related to the implementation of the software. Two vendors submitted proposals: Sungard and Pearson School System. Staff recommends Pearson School System, the same SIS provider the District has used since 1991. Pearson's PowerSchool was rated with consistently high scores in pricing, CA state reporting requirements, and hardware OS versatility requirements (MAC, Windows, Windows CE).

The Board's action will be to authorize staff to negotiate the contact provisions. The contract will then be brought back for ratification at a future meeting.
