*CI C.8 Ratification and Approval of Engineering Services Contracts

<u>Comment</u>: Contracts have been initiated by staff using previously qualified consulting, engineering, architectural, or landscape architectural firms to assist in completion of the referenced projects. Many of the firms are already under contract and the staff-initiated work may be an extension of the firm's existing contract with the District. Public contracting laws have been followed in initially qualifying and selecting these professionals

Recommendation: Ratify and approve contracts as noted.

Fiscal Impact: Total for this action: \$80,006. Funding sources as noted.

*CI C.9 Ratification and Approval of Negotiated Change Orders

<u>Comment</u>: Staff is seeking ratification of Change Orders on the following current District construction project: Dover Elementary School New Campus. Change Orders are fully executed by the District upon signature by the Superintendent's designee. Board ratification is the final step required under state law in order to complete payment and contract adjustment.

In addition to normal ratification, approval of the noted Change Orders for DeAnza High School Portable Building Installation and Sitework and for the Mira Vista Elementary Lower Playground Repair projects is required by the Board, with special findings as noted below, because these are in excess of the Public Contract Code limit of 10% of the original contract value. In accordance with Public Contract Code 20118.4, the Board, by approving and ratifying these Change Orders, finds that it would have been futile to publicly bid the work in question because of the tight time frames to complete this work without affecting the operations of the District, and that the public is best served by having this work completed by the contractor on the project.

Recommendation: Ratify and approve negotiated Change Orders as noted.

Fiscal Impact: Total ratification and approval by this action: \$97,027.39.

*CI C.10 Award of Contract for District Data Warehouse System and Services

<u>Comment</u>: The District Data Warehouse System and Services project was approved by the Board on June 24, 2009. This project follows a key recommendation from the NCEA (National Center for Educational Accountability) report.

A list of 17 vendors was identified. Research into their data warehouse and reporting products and services narrowed that list to six possible vendors who could provide a complete solution. A Request for Proposal was sent out to the six vendors and one response was received from CPSI, Ltd. As part of the RFP, a detailed requirements checklist needed to be completed that had points assigned to each requirement. Out of a total 856 possible points, CPSI, Ltd scored 841 points, meeting 98% of the district requirements.

Recommendation: Award contract to CPSI, Ltd

Fiscal Impact: \$495,400 over 5 years. Funding source: Microsoft voucher money.

*CI C.11 DeAnza High School Baseball Field Renovation Project Award of Contract

<u>Comment</u>: The next step in the reconstruction of DeAnza High School is to complete the renovation of the existing baseball field. This project includes demolition of existing improvements, site grading and drainage, removal of existing hazard trees, new irrigation system, natural turf field, infield, fencing, backstops, gates, dugouts, bleachers, landscaping, scoreboard, sitework and electrical/low voltage systems.

DLM Architects has prepared plans and specifications for the DeAnza Baseball Field project. This project has been approved as an ASI (Architect's Supplemental Instruction) under the DeAnza Track and Field Project by the DSA (Division of State Architect).

The District conducted a public bid process for this project. Bids were opened on August 4, 2009. Ten Contractors submitted bids. They are as follows: MPC \$1,706,712; Cleary Bros Landscape \$1,663,000; Maguire Hester \$1,595,000; Evans Brothers \$1,536,988; Valley Crest \$1,507,000; AJF/BHM \$1,496,690; Team Ghilotti \$1,493,377; AHI \$1,462,492; Ghilotti Bros. \$1,426,171; and, Bay Cities Paving and Grading \$1,350,000. The lowest responsive, responsible bidder is Bay Cities Paving and Grading at \$1,350,000.

Recommendation: Award contract to the lowest responsive, responsible bidder.

Fiscal Impact: \$1,350,000. Funded from the Measure J Bond.

*CI C.12 Compliance with the California Environmental Quality Act: Adopt Resolution No. 30-0910 Authorizing Adoption of a Mitigated Negative Declaration and Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Plan for and Approval of the Hercules Middle High School Fields Lighting Project

Comment: District staff retained PMC to prepare a study under the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA") to evaluate the possible environmental impact of the proposed Hercules Middle High School Fields Lighting Project. PMC prepared and issued an Initial Study August 10, 2009. As part of the Initial Study, the consultants completed a traffic impact analysis, noise impact analysis, and air quality impact analysis. The District met with the City of Hercules, which is a partner in the project. The District held a public input meeting on April 20, 2009. The District has thoroughly analyzed the environmental checklist to determine that the potential impacts from the Project could be mitigated to less than significant. The District issued the Notice of Intent to Adopt a Mitigated Negative Declaration and to hold a public hearing on September 16, 2009, an item that was continued to the meeting of October 7, 2009. The 30-day Public Comment period ended on September 9, 2009. The District has received one (1) written comment to date. The District has provided a written response to the comment

received during the public comment period. This response is included in the record. In the event that the District receives any further written comments, the written comments and District's written responses to the comments, if any, will be made a part of the record at the Board meeting.

The Mitigated Negative Declaration is attached to the proposed resolution along with proposed mitigation measures, which will mitigate any environmental impacts from the Project to a level of insignificance. The Board recommendation includes the Initial Study, the Mitigated Negative Declaration, and the responses to comments. Together these documents form the final Mitigated Negative Declaration.

<u>Recommendation</u>: Adopt Resolution No. 30-0910, Authorizing Adoption of a Mitigated Negative Declaration and Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Plan for and Approval of the Hercules Middle High School Fields Lighting Project.

<u>Fiscal Impact</u>: Full fiscal impact not known. Future projects will be presented for award. Projects will be funded from the Capital Facilities Fund 25.

*CI C.13 Red Ribbon Board Resolution No. 31-0910

<u>Comment</u>: Our District has been involved in Red Ribbon Week for the past twenty years. Congress officially proclaimed the first National Red Ribbon Week October 23 – 31, 1988. The Red Ribbon has now become a symbol for drug-free environments.

This resolution represents the West Contra Costa Unified School District's support of the Red Ribbon Campaign October 23 - 31, 2009. Red Ribbon Week may be celebrated one week during the year, but its effects last throughout the year.

This year, some of the school activities will include prevention curriculum lessons, poster/essay/decoration contests, wear-red days, letter writing, school assemblies, etc. The focus of this week is not only on drug-free youth but also on safe and healthy communities.

F.1 Appointment of Youth Commission Members

<u>Comment</u>: On January 7, 2009, the Board approved the establishment of a Youth Commission. Through school announcements, invitations to students in leadership positions and word of mouth, students have been meeting to begin the planning framework for the Youth Commission. In approving the Youth Commission, the Board anticipated that a Planning Committee of students would be appointed to develop the policies and procedures including membership criteria, attendance requirements, role and duties of the commission and governing procedures. Over the spring and summer of 2009, a group of students has been actively engaged in initiating the Youth Commission. That planning group includes:

<u>Recommendation:</u> That the Board appoint above named students as the Planning Committee of the Youth Commission with the expectation that the planning committee will bring back the charter or bylaws to the Board no later than the second Board meeting in June 2010.

Fiscal Impact: None

* F.2 Public Hearing and Adoption of the Revised 2009-10 Budget

<u>Comment:</u> Education Code Section 42127 requires the governing board of each school district to adopt a budget for the subsequent year, on or before July 1st. Due to the receipt of a conditional approval, the budget is now subject to a revision and submission for approval to the County Superintendent.

At the June 24, 2009 Board meeting, the board approved adoption of the proposed 09-10 budget, along with a Fiscal Recovery Plan demonstrating the District's assurance that cost saving measures will be in place which will provide a positive ending fund balance for 2009-10, 2010-11 and 2011-12. On August 13, 2009, the Contra Costa County Office of Education issued a conditional approval of the District's budget. The letter states that the conditional budget approval is contingent upon the submission of a revised multi-year projection demonstrating cost savings achieved.

Therefore, a revised multi-year projection has been prepared which demonstrates the cost savings achieved through the implementation of the United Teachers of Richmond contract as well as the

agreements ratified with the School Supervisors Association and West Contra Costa Administrators Association and the tentative agreement reached with Local One. In July, the State of California adopted a significant change to the student attendance revenue component of the budget. That change is also reflected in this multi-year projection.

This revised proposed budget, in the form of a multi year projection as required by the County is presented to the Board of Education for approval.

Recommendation: Recommend Approval of the revised 2009-10 Budget

Fiscal Impact: Balanced Budget

* F.3 Public Hearing: Grades K-12 Textbook and Instructional Materials Compliance for Fiscal Year 2009-2010

Comment: Education Code Section 60119 guidelines require the governing board to hold a public hearing after which the Board will determine, through a resolution, as to whether each pupil in each school in the District has sufficient textbooks and instructional materials that are aligned with the academic content standards and are consistent with the content and cycles of the curriculum framework adopted by the State Board of Education in these subjects: English/Language Arts, including English language development; Mathematics; Science; History/Social Science; Foreign Language (if the student is enrolled in a Foreign Language course); and Health (if the student is enrolled in a Health course). The governing board shall also determine the availability of science laboratory equipment as applicable to science laboratory courses in grades 9 through 12.

Staff will provide the Board with an update on the sufficiency of textbooks during the public hearing.

Immediately after this hearing, as a separate action item, the Board is requested to approve Resolution No. 32-0910: Grades K-12 Textbook and Instructional Materials Compliance for Fiscal Year 2009-2010.

<u>Recommendation:</u> The Board conduct the above hearing in compliance with the Education Code of the State of California.

Fiscal Impact: None

* F.4 Adoption of Resolution No. 32-0910: Grades K-12 Textbook and Instructional Materials Compliance for Fiscal Year 2009-2010

<u>Comment:</u> The proposed resolution is required in order for the District to receive funding as part of the California State Pupil Textbook and Instructional Materials Incentive Program and/or other funding for instructional materials from any California State sources.

In addition to the proposed resolution, the Board is being asked to verify continued approval of the accompanying list of currently adopted texts for the District. Prior to adopting this resolution, the Board will hold a public hearing to discuss the area of textbook sufficiency for all district schools

* F.5 Benefit Cap for Board Members

<u>Comment:</u> Board Bylaw 9250 and Government Code allows Board members to participate in the District's health benefit program.

Board members may participate in the health and welfare benefits program provided for the employees of the district. The district shall pay the cost of all premiums required for Board members electing to participate in the district health and welfare benefits program to the same extent that the district pays premiums for district staff in accordance with Government Code 53208.5.

Although the Board had capped the benefits that Board members received in 2008-09, the Board needs to reduce the level of District payment of benefits to a level equal to that of one of the employee groups within the District, i.e., WCCAA, SSA, UTR or Local One.

<u>Recommendation:</u> That the Board approve a benefit cap for 2009-10, 2010-11 and 2011-12 equal to that of the four employee groups within the District and allow each Board member to participate in one of the plans for benefit caps and work year reduction approved for one of the employee groups.

Fiscal Impact: Savings of \$6,400 for the 2009-10 Fiscal Year

As part of the Initial Study, the consultants completed a traffic impact analysis, noise impact analysis, and air quality impact analysis. The District met with the City of Hercules which is a partner in the project. The District held a public input meeting on April 20, 2009. The District has thoroughly analyzed the environmental checklist to determine that the potential impacts from the Project could be mitigated to less than significant. The District issued the Notice of Intent to Adopt a Mitigated Negative Declaration and to hold a public hearing on September 16, 2009, an item that was continued to the meeting of October 7, 2009. The 30 day Public Comment period ended on September 9, 2009. The District has received one (1) written comment to date. The District has provided a written response to the comment received during the public comment period. This response is included in the record. In the event that the District receives any further written comments, the written comments and District's written responses to the comments, if any, will be made a part of the record at the Board meeting.

The Mitigated Negative Declaration is attached to the proposed resolution along with proposed mitigation measures which will mitigate any environmental impacts from the Project to a level of insignificance. The Board recommendation includes the Initial Study, the Mitigated Negative Declaration, the responses to comments. Together these documents form the final Mitigated Negative Declaration.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING ADOPTION OF A MITIGATED NEGATIVE DECLARATION AND MITIGATION MONITORING AND REPORTING PLAN FOR AND APPROVAL OF THE

HERCULES MIDDLE HIGH SCHOOL ATHLETIC FIELD LIGHTING PROJECT

- WHEREAS, the West Contra Costa Unified School District ("School District") proposes to install night lighting for physical education and athletic uses at all of the fields at Hercules Middle High School ("Project"); and
- WHEREAS, the School District has previously completed major upgrades to these fields; and
- WHEREAS, the School District and the City of Hercules have need of playable facilities during evening hours for both practices and games; and
- WHEREAS, the School District and the City of Hercules will contribute significantly to the recreational opportunities available to the Hercules Community through the installation of field lighting at the Middle High School; and
- WHEREAS, prior to commencement of the Project, the School District must comply with the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA"); and
- WHEREAS, the School District has retained PMC to prepare an initial study for the Project ("Initial Study") to ascertain whether the Project may have significant effects on the environment; and
- WHEREAS, on the basis that the Initial Study, which indicated that with mitigation measures the Project would have no significant impacts on the environment, School District staff determined that a draft Initial Study/Mitigated Negative Declaration should be prepared for the Project; and
- WHEREAS, a Draft Initial Study/Mitigated Negative Declaration ("Draft Mitigated Negative Declaration") was prepared pursuant to CEQA and the State CEQA Guidelines. A copy of the Draft Mitigated Negative Declaration is attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and incorporated herein; and
- **WHEREAS**, the scope of the Project is further described in the Draft Mitigated Negative Declaration; and
- WHEREAS, pursuant to Public Resources Code Sections 21091 and 21092, on August 10, 2009, the School District, as the lead agency for the Project, provided copies of the Draft Mitigated Negative Declaration and Initial Study to the public for review and comment for a thirty (30) day period ending September 9, 2009; and
- WHEREAS, the School District received, considered and responded to one (1) comment received from the public and other interested agencies regarding the Mitigated Negative Declaration ("Response to Comments"); and
 - WHEREAS, the governing board of the School District ("Board") has carefully

reviewed the Final Mitigated Negative Declaration for the Project, which includes without limitation, the Draft Negative Declaration, Initial Study, Response to Comments from the public and interested agencies, all other relevant information contained in the record for the Project ("Final Mitigated Negative Declaration") as well as the Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program ("MMRP") for the Project. A copy of the Final Mitigated Negative Declaration is attached hereto as Exhibit "A," and incorporated herein and a copy of the Mitigation Monitoring Program is attached hereto in Exhibit "B" and incorporated herein; and

- **WHEREAS**, all other legal prerequisites to the adoption of this Resolution and approval of the Project have occurred.
- **NOW, THEREFORE,** the governing board of the School District hereby finds, determines, declares, orders and resolves as follows:
- Section 1 Recitals. That all of the recitals set forth above are true and correct, and the Board so finds and determines.
- <u>Section 2 Compliance with CEQA</u>. That Board reviewed and considered the information contained in the Final Mitigated Negative Declaration. The Board hereby makes the following specific findings with respect to the Final Mitigated Negative Declaration:
- (a) that the Final Mitigated Negative Declaration prepared for the Project contains a complete and accurate reporting of the environmental impacts associated with the Project; and
- (b) that the Final Mitigated Negative Declaration has been completed in compliance with CEQA and the State CEQA Guidelines; and
- (c) that the Project will not result in a significant effect upon the environment because the mitigation measures described in the Mitigation Monitoring Program have been added to the Project; and
- (d) that there is no substantial evidence in the record supporting a fair argument that the Project may result in significant impacts to the environment; and
- (e) that the Final Mitigated Negative Declaration reflects the independent judgment of the School District; and
- (f) that additional mitigation measures added, if any, ("Additional Mitigation Measures") to the Final Mitigated Negative Declaration subsequent to the circulation of the Draft Negative Declaration are either minor changes to the Project and do not result in a fundamental reorganization of the Final Mitigated Negative Declaration, and/or the purpose of the Additional Mitigation Measures are to reduce the effects on the environment that were already identified in the Draft Negative Declaration as insignificant, and further that the Additional Mitigation Measures do not have the potential to have a significant impact upon the environment; and
- (g) that any Mitigation Measures which have been changed or substituted subsequent to the circulation of the Draft Negative Declaration, if any, are equivalent or more effective in mitigating the environmental impacts then the prior mitigation measures, and that the change and/or substitution of such mitigation measures and not itself cause any potentially significant effect upon the environment.
- Section 3 Location and Custodian of Records. The location and custodian of records with respect to all of the relevant documents and any other material which constitutes the administrative record for the Final Mitigated Negative Declaration are as follows: District Engineering Officer, West Contra Costa Unified School District, Facilities Planning and Construction Division, 1300 Potrero Avenue, Richmond, California 94804.

<u>Section 4 - Wildlife Findings</u>. That the proposed Project will have no adverse impacts on wildlife as defined in Fish and Game Code Section 711.2, nor will it adversely impact the resources governed by the State Department of Fish and Game.

<u>Section 5 - Adoption of Final Mitigated Negative Declaration and Mitigation Monitoring Program</u>. That the Board hereby adopts the Final Mitigated Negative Declaration and the Mitigation Monitoring Program including all of the mitigation measures set forth in the Mitigation Monitoring Program.

<u>Section 6- Approval of Project</u>. The Board hereby approves the Project as identified and evaluated in the Final Mitigated Negative Declaration and authorizes the Superintendent, or his authorized designee, to take all steps necessary to proceed with the Project.

<u>Section 7 - Notice of Determination</u>. That the Board hereby directs School District staff to file a Notice of Determination within five (5) working days after the Board's adoption of the Final Mitigated Negative Declaration.

WHEREAS, the governing board is required to make a determination through resolution as to whether each student, including English Learners, has sufficient textbooks or instructional materials, or both, aligned to the academic content standards in Mathematics, Science, History-Social Science, and English/Language Arts, including the English Language Development component of an adopted program, aligned to the academic content standards consistent with the cycles and content of the curriculum frameworks, and;

WHEREAS, the definition of "sufficient textbooks or instructional materials" means that each pupil has a textbook or instructional materials, or both, to use in class and to take home, and;

WHEREAS, the governing board is required to make a determination as to whether sufficient textbooks or instructional materials were provided to each pupil enrolled in Foreign Language or Health courses, consistent with the cycles and content of the curriculum frameworks, and;

WHEREAS, the governing board is required to determine the availability of laboratory science equipment for science laboratory classes offered in grades 9-12, inclusive;

WHEREAS, all necessary textbooks for meeting the requirements of this resolution and the associated Ed. Code have been purchased by the District.

THEREFORE, be it resolved that for the 2009-2010 school year, the West Contra Costa Unified School District held a public hearing noticed at least ten days in advance on this date and has determined that the District has provided each pupil with sufficient textbooks and instructional materials aligned to the academic content standards and consistent with the cycles and content of the curriculum frameworks in each of the areas described above and that sufficient laboratory science equipment is available to students in grades 9-12.
