*CI C.10 NCLB Supplemental Educational Services (SES) Tutoring Contracts

Comment:

The No Child Left Behind (NCLB) Act of 2001 requires school districts to set aside an amount equivalent to 20% of the Title I entitlement for the purposes of providing Transportation for Choice and Supplemental Educational Services (SES). In WCCUSD 20% of the entitlement is \$1,747,536. Of this amount, \$128,500 is needed for Transportation for Choice leaving \$1,619,036 available for SES tutoring.

Federal guidance regarding Supplemental Educational Services was released on January 14, 2009. The guidance specifies the roles and responsibilities of the U.S. Department of Education, the State Board of Education and the Local Educational Agency. The guidance has been used to inform the implementation of this initiative in WCCUSD. Each year the Department of Education sets the official per pupil allotment (PPA) for each district, which represents the maximum amount to be expended per participant. The official rate for 2009-10 has not yet been released. For planning purposes, the PPA estimate is \$1,300; therefore, approximately 1,245 students may be served.

Parent/Guardians of all students participating in the free and reduced lunch program at the 17 Title I schools in year 2 and beyond of NCLB improvement were appropriately informed of the opportunity to receive these tutoring services. An informational catalog and application were created in English and Spanish with descriptions of the programs offered by all of the State-approved providers. These materials were mailed to all eligible families in August. In addition, catalogs are available in the front office for Back to School Night. Furthermore, many of the participating schools have hosted provider fairs for their school communities.

Permission is requested of the Board of Education to approve contracts between the District and named State-approved SES providers per parental choice for the period of October 22, 2009 through June 30, 2010 per the attached list.

Comment:

Contracts have been initiated by staff using previously qualified consulting, engineering, architectural, or landscape architectural firms to assist in completion of the referenced projects. Many of the firms are already under contract and the staff-initiated work may be an extension of the firm's existing contract with the District. Public contracting laws have been followed in initially qualifying and selecting these professionals.

Recommendation: Ratify and approve contracts as noted.

<u>Fiscal Impact:</u> Total for this action: \$8,200. Funding sources as noted.

*CI C.14 Ratification and Approval of Negotiated Change Orders

Comment:

Staff is seeking ratification of Change Orders on the following current District construction projects: Ford Elementary Demolition and Sitework, Dover Elementary School New Campus, and Multi-site Exterior Painting. Change Orders are fully executed by the District upon signature by the Superintendent's designee. Board ratification is the final step required under state law in order to complete payment and contract adjustment.

Recommendation: Ratify and approve negotiated Change Orders as noted.

<u>Fiscal Impact:</u> Total ratification and approval by this action: \$59,771.17.

*CI C.15 Approval of Contract for Furniture, Setup and Installation at Helms Middle School

Comment:

The construction of the new campus at Helms Middle School is nearly complete. The next step for the District is to purchase new furniture for the school. We have completed work with the site staff on classroom configurations, specialty spaces including science lab furnishings, library, offices, and staff work areas. New furnishings will be comparable to those installed in our other completed secondary sites Pinole Middle and El Cerrito High.

The proposed contract is through Young Office Solutions. The pricing for the furniture is by a competitively bid bulk purchasing contract through The Cooperative Purchasing Network ("TCPN"). This is a "piggyback" type contract which meets the state's procurement requirements for these furnishings.

<u>Recommendation:</u> Approve contract with Young Office Solutions for Helms furniture, setup and installation.

Fiscal Impact: \$674,751.51. Funded by the Measure J Bond.

* F.1 Approval of Agreement with Local One (Local One / AB1200 Public Disclosure of Collective Bargaining Agreement with Local One)

Comment:

District and Local One Collective bargaining proposals were sunshined for the 2008-09 year. Tentative Agreement has been reached with representatives of Local One. A copy of the Tentative Agreement is provided. Local One has ratified the Agreement. It is now presented to the Board of Education for ratification.

School districts are required to publicly disclose the provisions of all collective bargaining agreements before they ratify an agreement. This ensures that the public is aware of the details associated with a tentative collective bargaining agreement before it becomes binding on the district. A summary of the savings associated with the agreement is attached. This summary has also been provided to the County Office of Education.

The Board will receive public comment on the proposed contract changes and salary adjustments before the Board votes to ratify the Agreement.

We want to take this occasion to thank the representatives of both groups for their time and effort in reaching this accord.

<u>Recommendation:</u> Recommend that the Board of Education ratify the Tentative Agreement between the West Contra Costa Unified School District and Local One

Fiscal Impact: Savings of \$1,841,370 for the 2009-10 budget

* F.2 Coronado Site Master Plan and Architectural Services Contract

Comment:

The Board approved educational programming and master planning for the renovation/reconstruction of Coronado Elementary School at its regular meeting of June 24, 2009. WLC Architects was awarded a contract for this phase of services. At this time they have completed work on the educational

programming and updated Master Plan after a series of meetings with the Coronado Site Committee. In addition, the architects and the District have met and reviewed the project parameters, including phasing options. The preferred option for the work is construction of a full new campus for the site. The architects have also completed a cost estimate which will provide a basis for the District to consider how to find funds for the completion of the work.

The architects have prepared a presentation for the Board and community at the joint meeting with the Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee.

At this time it is appropriate to proceed to the next level and authorize preparation of construction documents for the project. This will allow the District to be ready for construction pending additional funds which may become available.

Recommendation: Approve Master Plan and authorize architectural services contract to WLC Architects.

<u>Fiscal Impact:</u> \$2,155,800. Funded from the Measure J Bond.

* F.3 Portola Middle School at the Castro Site Master Plan and Architectural Services Contract

Comment:

The District has completed Environmental Review of the Portola Middle School at the Castro site. The Board has adopted the Final Environmental Impact Report. There is currently a legal challenge to the District's actions related to the Environmental Review which the District is actively fighting. It appears that the risk of the legal challenge completely stopping the project is low. In consideration of the need for completing the project in a timely fashion and creating a permanent campus for Portola Middle School, the Board authorized preliminary architectural services to complete educational programming and updated master planning at its regular meeting of March 19, 2009.

HY Architects has completed work on the educational programming and updated master plan after a series of meetings with the Portola Site Committee. In addition, the architects and the District have met with City of El Cerrito staff to review their concerns. The Master Plan for the campus is in conformance with the EIR documents and represents a refinement of the educational programs and spaces. The District has also completed a cost estimate from the updated Master Plan, which indicates that the project construction is within the current District budget.

The architects have prepared a presentation for the Board and community at the joint meeting with the Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee.

At this time, it is appropriate to proceed to the next level and authorize preparation of construction documents for the project. This will allow the District to be ready for construction upon the resolution of the current litigation.

Recommendation: Approve Master Plan and authorized architectural services contract to HY Architects.

<u>Fiscal Impact:</u> \$2,790,000. Funded from the Measure J Bond.

WHEREAS, the governing board, in order to comply with the requirements of Education Code Section 60119, is required to hold a public hearing at which the governing board shall encourage participation by parents, teachers, members of the community, and bargaining unit leaders and;

WHEREAS, the governing board is required to make a determination through resolution as to whether each student, including English Learners, has sufficient textbooks or instructional materials, or both, aligned to the academic content standards in Mathematics, Science, History-Social Science, and English/Language Arts, including the English Language Development component of an adopted program, aligned to the academic content standards consistent with the cycles and content of the curriculum frameworks, and;

WHEREAS, the definition of "sufficient textbooks or instructional materials" means that each pupil has a textbook or instructional materials, or both, to use in class and to take home, and;

WHEREAS, the governing board is required to make a determination as to whether sufficient textbooks or instructional materials were provided to each pupil enrolled in Foreign Language or Health courses, consistent with the cycles and content of the curriculum frameworks, and;

WHEREAS, the governing board is required to determine the availability of laboratory science equipment for science laboratory classes offered in grades 9-12, inclusive;

WHEREAS, all necessary textbooks for meeting the requirements of this resolution and the associated Ed. Code have been purchased by the District.

THEREFORE, be it resolved that for the 2009-2010 school year, the West Contra Costa Unified School District held a public hearing noticed at least ten days in advance on October 7, 2009 and determined that the District has provided each pupil with sufficient textbooks and instructional materials aligned to the academic content standards and consistent with the cycles and content of the curriculum frameworks in each of the areas described above and that sufficient laboratory science equipment is available to students in grades 9-12.

1. Article 11: Holiday Schedule:

The following shall be paid holidays:

December 23 (or workday preceding December 24^{th)}
(12 month employees only)
December 31 (or workday proceeding New Years Day)

2. Workyear

Reduced Workyear: The work year for each classification within the bargaining unit (12 month employees) shall be reduced by six work days, with a corresponding reduction of salary equivalent to those six days. The work year for each classification within the bargaining unit (less than 12 month employees) shall be reduced by five work days, with a corresponding reduction of salary equivalent to those five days. The unpaid work days will be as follows: Three days during the February Break, Classified Training Day, the workday preceding December 24th (12 month employees only) and the workday preceding New Years Day.

The reduced workyear will remain in effect for the 2009-2010, 2010-2011 and 2011-2012 school years. Beginning in 2012-2013, the unpaid/non-work days set forth above shall be restored and those days previously identified as holidays will be restored as

holidays and those days previously identified as work days will be restored as workdays.

3. Article 15: Benefits

The following will be effective January 1, 2010. Therefore, the current contract related to benefits is in effect through December 31, 2009.

A. Medical Benefits

The District shall provide all eligible employees, their spouses, dependents, and domestic partners an opportunity to enroll in medical benefits as currently offered by CalPERS. Effective January 1, 2010, the District's maximum contribution to medical benefits shall be as follows:

- a. For unit members choosing Employee Only coverage, the amount of \$373.00 per month;
- <u>b. For unit members choosing Employee Plus One coverage, the amount</u> of \$745.00 per month;
- c. For unit members choosing Family coverage, the amount of \$969.00 per month.

Effective January 1, 2012, the District's maximum contribution to medical benefits shall be as follows:

- <u>a. For unit members choosing Employee Only coverage, the amount of</u> \$383.00 per month;
- b. For unit members choosing Employee Plus One coverage, the amount of \$755.00 per month;
- c. For unit members choosing Family coverage, the amount of \$979.00 per month.

B. Dental Benefits

The District shall provide all eligible employees, their spouses, dependents, and domestic partners with the dental insurance plan currently offered by Delta Dental Service. Effective January 1, 2010, the District's maximum contribution to dental benefits will be \$1,140.00 per year (\$95.00 per month) per employee.

D. Cash in Lieu

Status quo.

E. Part-time Employees

- 1. An employee whose regular assignment is less than 7-1/2 hours per day is considered part-time. The District agrees that it will not split a full time position into part time positions in an attempt to prevent employees from receiving health benefits.
- 2. Part-time employees hired before July 1, 2009 who currently receive health benefit coverage shall be eligible for health benefits subject to the cap referenced in #3A above effective January 1, 2010. Part-time employees hired before July 1, 2009 may elect to forego their eligibility for contribution to health benefits, including post retirement benefits, and receive a cash in lieu payment of \$400 per month.
- 3. Part-time employees whose primary assignment is less than 7-1/2 hours per day hired on or after July 1, 2009 shall not be eligible for medical, dental or vision benefits.

Retiree Health Benefits

The District shall offer to eligible retiring employees the same health plans as are offered to active employees during the term of the employee's retirement. To be eligible for this benefit the employee must retire from WCCUSD, directly into PERS or STRS, be eligible for health benefits at the time of retirement and have attained the required years of service to the District as stated below.

To be eligible for these benefits, employees must meet the requirements stated in the above paragraph and one of the following years of service requirements:

- 1. Current regular employees hired prior to January 1, 2007 who attain five continuous years of service with WCCUSD (as defined by PERS/STRS) shall have met the required years of service to the District for the purposes of this section. The maximum district contribution towards benefits for employees in this category shall be \$450.00 per month. The effective date of this section will be January 1, 2010.
 - a. For employees who have attained twenty years of continuous years of service with WCCUSD (as defined by PERS/STRS) by 12/31/09, the District shall pay a maximum contribution of \$550.00 per month.
- 2. <u>Current regular employees hired after January 1, 2007 but prior to July 15, 2009</u> who attain ten continuous years of service with WCCUSD (as defined by

PERS/STRS) shall have met the required years of service to the District for the purposes of this section. The maximum district contribution towards benefits for employees in this category shall be \$450.00 per month. The effective date of this section will be January 1, 2010.

- 3. For employees hired on or after July 15, 2009, who attain twenty-five years of continuous years of service with WCCUSD (as defined by PERS/STRS) shall have met the required years of service to the District for the purposes of this section. The maximum district contribution towards benefits for employees in this category shall be \$450.00 per month until the employee reaches the age of 65. Thereafter, the District shall only pay a total of the CalPERS Health Benefits Program minimum allowable monthly unequal contribution amount for the enrollment in a health benefits plan of each eligible retiree, including enrollment of a maximum of one dependent. This amount shall increase by the minimum increase required by law. The District shall make no payment to retirees for prescription coverage not covered by CalPERS Health Benefits Program, vision or dental insurance.
 - a. (a) For employees hired on or after July 15, 2009, who do not attain twenty-five years of continuous years of service with WCCUSD (as defined by PERS/STRS), but do attain, under CALPERS rules, five years of service as defined by PERS/STRS, the District shall only pay a total of the CalPERS Health Benefits Program minimum allowable monthly unequal contribution amount for the enrollment in a health benefits plan of each eligible retiree, including enrollment of a maximum of one dependent. This amount shall increase by the minimum increase required by law. The District shall make no payment to retirees for prescription coverage not covered by CalPERS Health Benefits Program, vision or dental insurance.

4. Term of Agreement

This Agreement shall remain in full force and effect from July 1, 2008 through June 30, 2012. After July 1, 2010, the parties agree that each party may open one article, and any mutually agreeable articles, for each of the last two years of the contract. The parties agree that for any agreements reached as a result of the reopeners during the 2010-2011 and 2011-2012 years, will be limited in duration to the term of this agreement.

- 5. Local One agrees to withdraw its unfair labor practice upon ratification of this agreement.
- 6. For the 2009-2010 school year, if the District enters into any agreement which results in a better workyear/benefits/salary package, for any unrepresented or represented employee group, such package shall be offered to Local One.

Background Information:

The Board approved educational programming and master planning for the renovation/reconstruction of Coronado Elementary School at its regular meeting of June 24, 2009. WLC Architects was awarded a contract for this phase of services. At this time they have completed work on the educational programming and updated Master Plan after a series of meetings with the Coronado Site Committee. In addition, the architects and the District have met and reviewed the project parameters, including phasing options. The preferred option for the work is construction of a full new campus for the site. The architects have also completed a cost estimate which will provide a basis for the District to consider how to find funds for the completion of the work.

The architects have prepared a presentation for the Board and community at the joint meeting with the Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee.

At this time it is appropriate to proceed to the next level and authorize preparation of construction documents for the project. This will allow the District to be ready for construction pending additional funds which may become available.

Recommendation: Approve Master Plan and authorize architectural services contract to WLC Architects.

Background Information:

The District has completed Environmental Review of the Portola Middle School at the Castro site. The Board has adopted the Final Environmental Impact Report. There is currently a legal challenge to the District's actions related to the Environmental Review which the District is actively fighting. It appears that the risk of the legal challenge completely stopping the project is low. In consideration of the need for completing the project in a timely fashion and creating a permanent campus for Portola Middle School, the Board authorized preliminary architectural services to complete educational programming and updated master planning at its regular meeting of March 19, 2009.

HY Architects has completed work on the educational programming and updated master plan after a series of meetings with the Portola Site Committee. In addition, the architects and the District have met with City of El Cerrito staff to review their concerns. The Master Plan for the campus is in conformance with the EIR documents and represents a refinement of the educational programs and spaces. The District has also completed a cost estimate from the updated Master Plan, which indicates that the project construction is within the current District budget.

The architects have prepared a presentation for the Board and community at the joint meeting with the Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee.

At this time it is appropriate to proceed to the next level and authorize preparation of construction documents for the project. This will allow the District to be ready for construction upon the resolution of the current litigation.

Recommendation: Approve Master Plan and authorized architectural services contract to HY Architects.
