*CI C.13 Ratification and Approval of Negotiated Change Orders

Comment:

Staff is seeking ratification of change orders on the following current District construction projects: Nystrom Elementary New Multi-Purpose and Ford Elementary School New Campus. Change orders are fully executed by the District upon signature by the Superintendent's designee. Board ratification is the final step required under state law in order to complete payment and contract adjustment.

In addition to normal ratification, approval of the noted change order for the Pinole Middle School Modernization project is required by the Board, with special findings as noted below, because this is in excess of the Public Contract Code limit of 10% of the original contract value. In accordance with Public Contract Code 20118.4, the Board, by approving and ratifying these Change Orders, finds that it would have been futile to publicly bid the work in question because of the tight time frames to complete this work without affecting the operations of the District, and that the public is best served by having this work completed by the contractor on the project.

* D.3 WCCUSD Seamless Summer Feeding Program

Comment:

Summer Food Service Program Meets Children's Summer Nutritional Needs in Richmond, CA. West Contra Costa Unified School District (WCCUSD) is working to make sure that no children in West Contra Costa County go hungry when school is closed this summer. Over 16,500 children in West Contra Costa County receive free or reduced-price meals during the school year, but many of these children do not get enough to eat when school is out. The WCCUSD Summer Food Service Program (SFSP), which begins Monday, June 13, 2011, ensures that low-income children continue to grow and learn during the summer.

The Summer Food Service Program, sponsored by the U.S. Department of Agriculture, is the largest federal resource available for local programs that combine mealtime with recreational and educational activities.

Barbara Jellison, Director of Food Services, recognizes the need for the program in West Contra Costa County. Many of our children, who rely on school breakfast and lunch during the school year, do not have the energy they need during the summer. That's where we come in, by providing nutritious meals and activities to keep kids nourished and engaged. Kids who get enough to eat and have safe activities to participate in during the summer are less likely to get into trouble. Our Summer Meals Program is a building block in the community for healthy, happy kids who are ready to learn.

The Summer Food Service Program for Children is a federally funded program operated nationally by the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) and administered by a State Agency.

Eligible sponsors such as non-profit organizations, schools and local governments serve nutritious meals and snacks free to low-income children during the summer months. Summer programs are located at approved sites that are either in low-income areas or serve a group of children, most of whom are low-income.

F. <u>ACTION ITEMS</u>

* F.1 Affirmation or Reconsideration for Shannon's Closure

Comment:

In February 2009, the Board approved a comprehensive school closure plan. Over the previous six years, enrollment in WCCUSD had declined by more than 5,000 students and the district could no long afford to operate as many schools as it had in the past. Since February 2009, the District's enrollment has decreased by another 783 students.

The closure plan included a phased closure for eight schools. Shannon Elementary was scheduled to close at the end of the 2010-11 school year. In January 2011, the Board approved the reassignment of Shannon students to the three schools surrounding the Shannon attendance area, Montalvin, Collins and Tara Hills. The Board also approved the architectural services (April 13) and the bid for the relocatable classrooms (May 18) that are necessary to increase the enrollment capacity at the three schools into which the Shannon students have been reassigned. The total estimated cost for the relocatable classrooms and installation of those classrooms at the three schools is \$1.2 million. The District's Capital Facilities Fund 40 (non-bond funding) would be utilized for the one-time cost of accommodating the students from the Shannon closure. The projected General Fund operating savings from the closure is estimated to be \$325,000 per year or \$1.3 million over four years.

Recommendation:

That the Board consider the cost / benefit of the closure of Shannon and act either to affirm the closure as planned or to keep Shannon open for the 2011-12 school year in order to allow for a housing plan that would reduce the capital costs of providing relocatable classrooms. Since the District is under the financial supervision of a State Trustee, the Trustee may rescind the Board's decision on this matter or any Board decision that has a financial impact on the District.

Fiscal Impact:

The Shannon closure generates a \$325,000 per year, ongoing savings to the general fund and a one-time capital facilities fund cost of \$1.2 million.

* F.2 Resolution No. 75-1011 Intention to Levy Assessments for Fiscal Year 2011-12, Preliminarily Approving Engineer's Report and providing for Notice of a Public Hearing

Comment:

Should the Board adopt the resolution tonight, a public hearing will be held on the MRAD on June 28, 2011, at the hour of 6:30 p.m., a regular board meeting date, at Lovonya DeJean Middle School Multipurpose Room, 3400 Macdonald Ave., Richmond, CA 94805. At the conclusion of the public hearing on June 28, 2011, the Board may adopt a resolution that gives final approval to the engineer's report, levies the assessment and directs that the assessment diagram and individual assessments be filed with the County.

* F.3 Resolution No. 72-1011: Declaration to Hire 30-Day Substitutes on CBEST Waivers

Comment:

Shining Crescent Foundation submitted a petition to West Contra Costa Unified School District (WCCUSD) known as Shining Crescent Charter School on April 18, 2011 to establish an independent

charter school. Pursuant to the Charter School Act of 1992 (the "Act"), Education Code Section 47600 et seq., the Legislature has charged local school boards with the responsibility of reviewing and acting on petitions for charter schools.

Education Code section 47605(b) requires the Board, within 30 days of submission of the petition, to hold a public hearing to receive public comment on the Petition. That is the purpose of this agenda item.

The Act also requires the Board to either grant or deny the Petition within 60 days of receipt of the Petition, provided, however, that the date may be extended by an additional 30 days if both parties agree to the extension. Education Code section 47605(b). A written agreement was made between Shining Crescent Charter School and West Contra Costa Unified School District to defer the meeting until June 1, 2011.

After review of the petition and the public hearing, the governing board of the school district shall either grant or deny the charter within 60 days.

Staff and legal counsel are receiving and analyzing information related to the Petition, as well as the operation and potential effects of the proposed charter school, and will make a recommendation regarding the Petition at a subsequent board meeting.

CREDENTIAL ASSIGNMENT OPTIONS

WHEREAS, the Commission on Teacher Credentialing provides employing districts with assignment options of a temporary nature in which a teacher with an appropriate credential is not available to the school district. Listed below are summaries of these options, which require the consent of the teacher and Board approval.

- Ed Code 44263 allows the holder of a teaching credential to serve in a departmentalized class if the teacher has completed 18 semester hours of course work, or 9 semester hours of upper division of graduate course work, in the subject to be taught.
- **Title 5 Section 80027** allows for the issuance of a Limited Assignment Option to any teacher employed by the district who holds a credential based on a bachelor's degree and student teaching. Six semester hours of appropriate course work are required for renewal.
- Ed Code 44256 (b) allows the Governing Board of a school district to authorize the holder of a multiple subject teaching credential or a standard elementary credential to teach any subject in departmentalized classes to a given class or group of students below grade nine, provided that the teacher has completed 12 total semester units, or 6 upper division or graduate units of course work at an accredited institution in each subject to be taught.
- Ed Code 44258.2 allows the Governing Board of a school district to assign the holder of a single subject or standard secondary teaching credential, with his or her consent, to teach classes in grades 5 through 8 in a middle school provided the teacher has a minimum of twelve semester units, or six upper division or graduate semester units of course work at an accredited institution in the subject to be taught.
- Ed Code 44285.3 allows the Governing Board of a school district to authorize the holder of a multiple subject; standard elementary, single subject or standard secondary, with his or her consent, to teach departmental classes in grades K-12 provided the teacher has adequate knowledge of subject matter.
- Ed Code 44258.7 (c)(d) Allows the Committee on Assignments to authorize the holder of a multiple subject or single subject credential to teach a course outside of their credential area that is considered to be an elective in the grades K-12.
- Ed Code 44328 (a) Unless the commission determines that substantial evidence exists that a person is unqualified to teach, upon the completion of successful service as a district intern pursuant to subdivision (b) of Section 44325, and upon the recommendation of the school district governing board, the commission shall award preliminary credentials to district interns in the same manner as applicants recommended for credentials by institutions that operate approved programs of professional preparation.

Affirmation or Reconsideration for Shannon's Closure

Background Information:

Subject:

In February 2009, the Board approved a comprehensive school closure plan. Over the previous six years, enrollment in WCCUSD had declined by more than 5,000 students and the district could no long afford to operate as many schools as it had in the past. Since February 2009, the District's enrollment has decreased by another 783 students.

The closure plan included a phased closure for eight schools. Shannon Elementary was scheduled to close at the end of the 2010-11 school year. In January 2011, the Board approved the reassignment of Shannon students to the three schools surrounding the Shannon attendance area, Montalvin, Collins and Tara Hills. The Board also approved the architectural services (April 13) and the bid for the relocatable classrooms (May 18) that are necessary to increase the enrollment capacity at the three schools into which the Shannon students have been reassigned. The total estimated cost for the relocatable classrooms and installation of those classrooms at the three schools is \$1.2 million. The District's Capital Facilities Fund 40 (non-bond funding) would be utilized for the one-time cost of accommodating the students from the Shannon closure. The projected General Fund operating savings from the closure is estimated to be \$325,000 per year or \$1.3 million over four years.

Recommendation:

That the Board consider the cost / benefit of the closure of Shannon and act either to affirm the closure as planned or to keep Shannon open for the 2011-12 school year in order to allow for a housing plan that would reduce the capital costs of providing relocatable classrooms. Since the District is under the financial supervision of a State Trustee, the Trustee may rescind the Board's decision on this matter or any Board decision that has a financial impact on the District.

Fiscal Impact: The Shannon closure generates a \$325,000 per year, ongoing savings to the general fund and a one-time capital facilities fund cost of \$1.2 million.

RESOLVED, by the Board of Education (the "Board") of the West Contra Costa Unified School District, (the "District"), County of Contra Costa, State of California, that

- 1. On March 16, 2011, this Board adopted Resolution No. 58.1011, A Resolution Directing Preparation of Annual Report for the West Contra Costa Unified School District Maintenance and Recreation Assessment District (the "Maintenance District"). Pursuant to this resolution, the Engineer of Work prepared a report in accordance with Section 22565, et seq., of the California Streets and Highways Code (the "Report"). The Report has been made, filed with the Clerk of the Board and duly considered by this Board and is hereby deemed sufficient and preliminarily approved. The report shall stand as the Engineer's Report for all subsequent proceedings under and pursuant to the foregoing resolution.
- 2. It is the intention of this Board to levy and collect assessments within the Maintenance District for the fiscal year 2011-12. Within the Maintenance District, the existing and proposed improvements and any substantial changes proposed to be made to the existing improvements are generally as described on Exhibit "A" attached and by this reference made a part of this Resolution.
- 3. The Maintenance District consists of the lots and parcels shown on the boundary map of the Maintenance District on file with the Clerk of the Board, and reference is hereby made to such map for further particulars.
- 4. Reference is hereby made to the Report for a full and detailed description of the Improvements, the boundaries of the Maintenance District and the proposed assessments upon assessable lots and parcels of land within the Maintenance District. The assessment for fiscal year 2010-11 is proposed to be the same as for the previous year and does not exceed the formula or range of assessments previously specified in the formation of the Maintenance District.
