* D.2 Parcel Tax Survey Presentation

Comment:

At the June 28, 2011 meeting, the Board appointed a subcommittee of Madeline Kronenberg and Antonio Medrano to select a polling firm to conduct a survey and provide outreach services to determine the feasibility of a measure to renew the current parcel tax. The Attorney General has determined that a school district may legally expend district funds to hire a consultant to conduct surveys and establish focus groups to assess the potential support and opposition to a measure, the public's awareness of the district's financial needs, and the overall feasibility of developing a measure that could win voter approval.

The district distributed a request for qualifications (RFQ) to six Bay Area firms that specialize in survey research. After reviewing the proposals, the subcommittee selected Godbe Research to conduct a random sample survey to aid in determining the degree to which the community is willing to support a possible local measure that would help in replacing the vast amount of state funding that has been lost due the State's revenue shortfall. A committee that included the Board members, representatives of the four employee groups and a parent representative assisted in developing the survey that Godbe Research completed in October 2011.

Bryan Godbe will describe the process for implementing the survey and provide the Board with the results of the survey. The next steps included identifying a consulting firm to assist with the community outreach, completing a tracking poll survey sometime in the spring or early summer, and asking the Board to consider adopting a resolution to authorize an election to renew and/or extend the 2008 parcel tax.

A. OPENING PROCEDURES

President Charles Ramsey called the meeting to order at 6:00 PM.

A.1 Pledge of Allegiance

President Ramsey led those in attendance in the pledge of allegiance.

A.2 Welcome and Meeting Procedures

President Ramsey offered welcome and instructions to the public regarding the meeting.

A.3 Roll Call

B. BUSNESS ITEMS

B.1 Budget Discussion and Prioritization for Multi-Year Planning

Superintendent Harter introduced Ms. Gamba who provided a framework of the state's adopted budget, mid-year trigger cuts, and planning.

Public Comment:

Board Comment:

Ms. Kronenberg suggested reviewing previous decisions and re-affirming those decisions.

Mr. Thurmond asked Ms. Gamba about estimates for class size reduction costs while keeping Lake and Shannon Schools open and the ratio of students to teacher. Ms. Gamba provided information. Mr. Thurmond addressed the Board about newly found savings and prioritizing for the future.

President Ramsey addressed concerns regarding parcel tax revenue, deferred maintenance funds, and the potential of funds returned to the general fund as a result of litigation and a declaratory relief action filed with the Superior Court regarding a general fund expenditure which paid for a bond expenditure. He also spoke about the surplus in the ending fund balance which could be reflected in ongoing operations.

Mr. Medrano said he supported maintaining Shannon and Lake Schools as well as adult education programing. He further spoke about closing the achievement gap to provide students with additional assistance, class size reduction, college going culture and advance placement classes. Ms. Gamba responded. Mr. Medrano said he also supported payoff of the IBM debt.

Ms. Merriweather said she agreed and reminded her colleagues of the previous commitment to class size reduction, adult education and school resource officers. She urged the Board to affirm those commitments. Ms. Gamba spoke about the good job of keeping the budget in balance but being prepared for state mid-year cuts.

President Ramsey relinquished the gavel to Clerk Kronenberg in order to propose the following motion.

MOTION: Mr. Ramsey moved to authorize use of the unaudited actual ending fund balance surplus plus \$700,000 to pay off the IBM loan in order to add \$625,000 to the operation for ongoing revenue. Mr. Thurmond seconded the motion. A roll call vote was taken with Ms. Kronenberg, Mr. Medrano, Ms. Merriweather, Mr. Thurmond and Mr. Ramsey voting yes, with no abstentions and no absences. Motion carried 5-0-0-0.

MOTION: Mr. Ramsey moved to use \$600,000 of the identified \$3 million in savings to permanently remove Shannon and Lake Schools from the closure list. Mr. Thurmond seconded the motion. A roll call vote was taken with Ms. Kronenberg, Mr. Medrano, Ms. Merriweather, Mr. Thurmond and Mr. Ramsey voting yes, with no abstentions and no absences. Motion carried 5-0-0-0.

MOTION: Mr. Ramsey asked the Board to dedicate the use of \$2.4 million to K-3 class size reductions. Mr. Thurmond moved approval of this recommendation. Mr. Medrano seconded the motion. A roll call vote was taken with Ms. Kronenberg, Mr. Medrano, Ms. Merriweather, Mr. Thurmond and Mr. Ramsey voting yes, with no abstentions and no absences. Motion carried 5-0-0-0.

MOTION: Mr. Ramsey made a motion about developing the budget once state cuts are determined to dedicate further funds for additional K-3 class sized reduction, class size reduction at the secondary level, and instructional materials, while maintaining the proposed levels of funding for adult education, and school resource officers. Mr. Thurmond seconded the motion. A roll call vote was taken with Ms. Kronenberg, Mr. Medrano, Ms. Merriweather, Mr. Thurmond and Mr. Ramsey voting yes, with no abstentions and no absences. Motion carried 5-0-0-0.

President Ramsey resumed the gavel and continued to conduct the meeting.

President Ramsey asked whether Dr. Harter wanted to bring a message or share some information. Superintendent Harter spoke about the Board setting priorities to pay off the 20 year old IBM loan, and using \$2.4 million generated from the pay-off of the state loan to keep Shannon and Lake Schools open and off set class size reduction. G.2 Project Status Report – Facilities Planning and Construction

Mr. Fay introduced Mr. Hibser, lead architect of HY Architects for the Portola Middle School project. Mr. Hibser gave a presentation with an overview of the project and a status report.

Mr. Medrano asked if the green roof design is similar to one used in San Francisco. Mr. Hibser stated that they are using a design that will use the least maintenance possible. Mr. Brad Steen of Kleinfelder gave an overview of geological investigation and geological hazard assessment. He confirmed that two reports have been approved. Mr. Ramsey request to have copies provided of the approval letters. President Ramsey suggested staff and consultants work with the City of El Cerrito. Mr. Hibser stated that they have been working closely with the City.

Ken Yang, structural engineer, gave an overview of the design structure. President Ramsey asked what they are doing to the design to make it earthquake safe. Mr. Yang responded. President Ramsey asked why they are keeping the wood structure from the original Castro building as part of the new Portola Middle School. Mr. Hibser responded that it is part of the agreement with the community and result of the environmental impact report.

Mr. Medrano asked for clarification of Building A and why it isn't being rebuilt instead being structurally sound. Mr. Hibser responded. President Ramsey and Mr. Medrano both expressed concern that the building is not going to be as seismically safe as the rest of the buildings. Mr. Steen responded that the seismic codes are more stringent on existing buildings in schools when retrofitted. Ms. Merriweather wanted clarification on the different levels. Mr. Hibser clarified.

Ms. Kronenberg asked if there have been any conversations with the archiving people to save anything from Portola before it is demolished. Mr. Hibser responded that Go Portola group will be addressing it. She also asked if they have brought this presentation to the City of El Cerrito. Mr. Hibser responded.

Mr. Thurmond asked about the traffic measures. Mr. Hibser explained that they worked with a traffic consultant and city staff. He explained where the students will be dropped off by public transit as well by parents. Mr. Ramsey asked about Special Education classrooms. Mr. Hibser responded that they have provided them with specialized facilities for severely disabled students. The Special Education classes have been integrated within the regular classroom buildings.

Kevin MacQuarrie and Sisi Meng of WLC Architects gave a presentation with an overview of the temporary housing at Kennedy for the Coronado project. President Ramsey asked whether there is a need for a geotechnical work. Mr. Brad Steen of Kleinfelder responded that requirements for portables are less stringent. The District has elected to do a geotechnical investigation. Mr. Medrano asked about a covered area for students to eat lunch. Ms. Meng responded that the student will have a multipurpose room.

Mr. MacQuarrie and Sisi Meng gave an overview presentation of the Coronado project. Ms. Meng also talked about the Health Center at Coronado. Simon Makdessi, Principal of RMA Group, talked about the geologic hazard assessment and geotechnical investigation reports for Coronado. Warren Pottebaum, structural engineer from Thornton Tomasetti spoke about the structure design of Coronado. Mr. Ramsey asked whether they have received any comments back from DSA. Mr. Pottebaum said they have a back check appointment with the Division of State Architects (DSA) on December 1, 2011. President Ramsey asked about the estimated construction time. Mr. MacQuarrie responded that they are looking at about eighteen months. Mr. Medrano asked Ms. Cohen for her comments. Ms. Cohen said it has been a long process but well worth the wait.

Andrew Butt from Interactive Resources gave a presentation with an overview of the Nystrom project. President Ramsey asked if they have done any revisions. Mr. Butt responded. WHEREAS, the California Cancer research Act is a state initiative which if passed by voters in June 2012 would raise the state's tobacco tax by an additional \$1.00/pack.

WHEREAS, over 332,000 California high school students are current smokers and 36,900 California youth start smoking this year and 3,383,000 California adults are current smokers; and

WHEREAS, according to the Campaign for Tobacco Free Kids, the \$1 tax increase <u>alone</u> would prevent 228,000 children from becoming smokers in adulthood and more than 118,000 adult smokers in California would quit smoking; and

WHEREAS, by providing the funding we need to keep California's anti-smoking programs strong, we can keep our kids from smoking and give smokers the help they need to quit; and

WHEREAS, the California Cancer Research Act would produce more than \$156 million in annual revenue to provide programs to the state's existing tobacco control programs to prevent and reduce the use of tobacco; and

WHEREAS, the California Department of Education would receive \$31.2 million for programs to reduce youth smoking; and

WHEREAS, The California Cancer Research Act would produce \$23 million in annual revenue to provide support for law enforcement efforts to reduce illegal sales of tobacco products to minors, and other anti-tobacco law enforcement; and

WHEREAS, cigarette smoking and other uses of tobacco remain the leading causes of cancer in California, and a leading cause of many other life-threatening health problems, including heart disease and emphysema; and

WHEREAS, despite continuing advancements in medical treatment and prevention, cancer remains a leading cause of death in California, with more than 140,000 Californians diagnosed with cancer every year; and

WHEREAS, the California Cancer Research Act would produce nearly \$600 million in annual revenue to fund research into prevention, causes and treatment of cancer and other tobacco related diseases; and

WHEREAS, by providing funding to help leading researchers we can make important advances in the detection, treatment, prevention and cure of cancer, heart disease, stroke emphysema and other smoking-related illnesses; and

WHEREAS, by achieving significant health savings, the California Cancer Research Act will help respond to the staggering cost of tobacco in California. The savings accrued over the lifetimes of persons alive today who stop smoking or never start is \$5.1 billion dollars.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the West Contra Costa Unified School District Board of Education does hereby support the California Cancer Research Act of 2012, which will reduce smoking, especially among children and fund critical research to prevent and treat cancer and other tobacco related diseases. Teacher Misassignments and Teacher Vacancies:

Based on last year's report to CCTC, all misassignments were cleared in the 2010-11 school year. Subsequent quarterly reports will include any misassignments and vacancies identified in the current year.

Uniform Complaints:

One facility complaint was reported to the CCCOE during this time.

At the October 4, 2011 meeting, the Board revised the policy. The proposed revisions will allow the CBOC to establish its own bylaws and operational rules. The proposal also eliminates a position that has been unfilled for several years.

Facilities

Proposition 39, approved by California voters in the General Election of November 7, 2000 provides that the Governing Board of a school district may pursue the authorization and issuance of general obligation bonds passed by a vote of 55 percent or more of the electorate.

As a result of the passage of Proposition 39, language was added to the Education Code requiring school districts passing a bond designated as a Proposition 39 bond to establish a Citizens' Oversight Committee ("Committee" or "CBOC") to actively review and report on uses of bond proceeds to ensure that they are spent only on school facilities improvements allowed under each bond measure and not for any other purpose. The Committee shall be established within sixty (60) days of the date that the Board enters the election results in its minutes. A school district may also establish a voluntary bond oversight committee for a general obligation bond adopted by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the electorate.

1. Committee's Purpose

The purpose of the Committee is to inform the public concerning the expenditure and uses of bond revenues. The Committee's legal charge is to actively review and report on the expenditure of taxpayer's money for school construction. The Committee shall convene to provide oversight of the following:

- a) That bond revenues from bonds adopted by a 55 percent vote of the electorate are expended only for the purpose described in Article 13A, section 1, subdivision (b)(3) of the California Constitution including the construction, reconstruction, rehabilitation or replacement of school facilities, including for a Proposition 39 bond measure the furnishing and equipping of school facilities, or the acquisition or lease of real property for school facilities; and
- b) That, for bonds adopted by a 55 percent vote of the electorate, as prohibited by Article 13A, section 1, subdivision (b)(3)(A) of the California Constitution, no funds are used for any teacher and administrative salaries or other school operating expenses, except for salaries of bond facilities project administrators paid pursuant to the November 2001 and February 2003 resolutions validated by the Judgment of Validation in the Superior Court of California, Contra Costa County Action No. N03-0216; and
- c) That, for bonds adopted by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the electorate, funds are used only for the purposes described in Article 13A, section 1, subdivision (b)(2) of the California Constitution including the acquisition or improvement of real property.

2. Committee's Duties

The Committee may engage in the following activities in furtherance of its purpose:

- a) Receiving and reviewing copies of the annual performance audits required by Article 13A, section 1, subdivision (b)(3)(C) of the California Constitution.
 - 1. The Auditor shall deliver directly to the Audit Subcommittee a draft copy of each audit report at the same time as delivery is made to the District.

- 2. The Auditor shall deliver directly to the Committee progress reports at the same time at these reports are issued to the District.
- 3. The Committee shall participate with the District in a yearly review of the Auditor's performance.
- b) Receiving and reviewing the annual financial audits required by Article 13A, section 1, subdivisions (b)(3)(D) of the California Constitution.
 - 1. The Auditor shall deliver directly to the Audit Subcommittee a draft copy of each audit report at the same time as delivery is made to the District.
 - 2. The Auditor shall deliver directly to the Committee progress reports at the same time at these reports are issued to the District.
 - 3. The Committee shall participate with the District in a yearly review of the Auditor's performance.
- c) Inspecting school facilities and grounds to ensure that Bond revenues are expended in compliance with the requirements of Article 13A, section 1, subdivision (b)(3) of the California Constitution.
- d) Receiving and reviewing copies of any deferred maintenance proposals or plans developed by the District, including any reports required by Education Code section 17584.1.
- e) Reviewing efforts by the District to maximize Bond revenues by implementing cost-saving measures including, but not limited, to the following:
 - 1. Mechanisms designed to reduce the costs of professional fees;
 - 2. Mechanisms designed to reduce the cost of site preparation;
 - 3. Recommendations regarding the joint use of core facilities;
 - 4. Mechanisms designed to reduce costs by incorporating efficiencies in school site design;
 - 5. Recommendations regarding the use of cost-effective and efficient reusable facility plans.

3. Committee Operations

The Committee's legal charge is to review Bond expenditures and to inform the public about the uses of Bond proceeds.

The Committee shall have the authority to:

- a) Inspect a job site or construction project in coordination with the District Superintendent or designee. Visits to job sites require that the Committee member(s) be accompanied by a representative of the District and require that all safety measures in effect at the job site be followed.
- b) Contact District staff, District contractors or consultants, including without limitation, accountants, auditors, architects, financial advisors and legal counsel in coordination with District Superintendent or designee.

The Committee shall not have the authority to:

- a) Participate in the bond sale and issuance process or make decisions concerning the timing, terms or structure of a bond issuance, except that the Committee may review the District's plans for any bond sale and may review bond issuance documents upon the conclusion of a bond sale if desired:
- b) Determine how bond funds shall be spent;
- c) Select contractors or consultants for bond projects or participate in the negotiation or bid process for such contractors and consultants;
- d) Require the District to prepare reports or conduct audits more frequently than those required by law.

The Committee shall not be entitled to legal representation by District legal counselor at District expense, unless permitted by the Board.

The Superintendent or his/her designee shall attend Committee meetings. Members of the Board shall attend as necessary or desirable.

Upon completion of all Bond projects, the Committee shall prepare a final written report summarizing its activities and conclusions.

The Board shall, without expending Bond funds:

- a) Provide the Committee with any necessary technical assistance;
- b) Provide administrative assistance in furtherance of the Committee's purpose; and
- c) Provide the Committee with sufficient resources to publicize the Committee's conclusions.

The Associate Superintendent of Operations will serve as a resource to the Committee. He/she shall assign such other District staff and professional service providers as needed to assist the Committee in carrying out its duties.

The Committee and Board shall hold joint meetings during the first quarter (January through March) and third quarter (July through September) of each year.

The Committee shall make reports to the Board of Education at each regular Board meeting. This report shall be placed on the Board's agenda. All recommendations approved by the Committee shall be presented to the Board of Education. The Board shall respond to the Committee's recommendation(s) within sixty (60) days after receipt of the recommendation(s).

The CBOC shall establish a set of bylaws and operational rules to manage the operation of the committee. These bylaws and operational rules shall be in compliance with Board Policy and all applicable laws.

4. Financial Operations

- a) The Board of Education shall adopt an annual Facilities Program Budget.
- b) District staff shall identify the budget by fund and account code on each Board action memo that recommends the expenditure of funds for facility projects.
- c) The Facility Program Budget shall be formally amended by the board of Education during the calendar year, as needed, for new and revised projects and change orders.

5. Committee Selection and Composition

The Committee shall be comprised of individuals who either live or work within the boundaries of the District. The Superintendent or designee shall solicit applications for membership on the Committee, and, in the event the number of applicants exceeds the number of spaces available, shall conduct interviews of interested citizens and make recommendations to the Board for appointments.

Applicants shall submit a written application form to the Superintendent and CBOC Chair delineating the applicant's qualifications to serve on the CBOC. On this form applicants shall acknowledge their commitment to faithfully attend the meetings of the CBOC and to serve the best interests of the community.

The Board shall have the authority at its sole discretion to select and appoint the Committee. While the Committee must consist of at least seven members, the Board intends the Committee to consist of between 15 and 21 members. However, the Board shall determine the final size of the Committee.

As required by law, Committee membership shall include the following categories:

- a) One member shall, at the time of appointment, be active in a business organization representing the business community of the District;
- b) One member shall, at the time of appointment, be active in a senior citizens' organization, which may be a local, regional, statewide or national organization;
- c) One member shall, at the time of appointment, be active in a bona fide taxpayers' organization, which may be a local, regional, statewide or national organization;
- d) One member shall, at the time of appointment, be the parent or guardian of at least one child currently enrolled in a school of the District;
- e) One member shall, at the time of appointment, be a parent or guardian of at least one child currently enrolled in a school of the District and be an active member in a District parent-teacher organization, such as the PTA or school site council.
- f) Committee membership shall also include but not be limited to, at the discretion of the Board, the following community members:
 - 1. One member shall be recommended by each City Council from the cities of EI Cerrito, Hercules, Pinole, Richmond and San Pablo;
 - 2. Two members shall reside in unincorporated areas of the District and shall be recommended by the County Supervisors of each respective unincorporated area;
 - 3. One member shall be recommended by each member of the Board of Trustees;
 - 5. One member shall, at the time of appointment, represent the Contra Costa Building and Construction Trades Council.
 - 6. One member shall, at the time of appointment, be a member of Public Employees Union Local 1 (without being a District employee).
 - 7. One member shall, at the time of appointment, be a member of the Citizens Advisory Committee for Special Education.

Pursuant to Education Code Section 15282(b), no employee or official of the District shall be appointed to the Committee. Additionally, no vendor, contractor, or consultant of the District shall be appointed to the Committee. If, while serving on the Committee, a member becomes an official or employee of the District or becomes a vendor, contractor or consultant of the District, their membership on the Committee shall cease immediately.

After appointment to a two-year term, Committee members who wish to be appointed for a second two-year term shall reapply to the Board for consideration. Committee members shall receive no remuneration for their participation on the Committee.

A Committee member who no longer serves as a representative of the designated group she/he was appointed to represent (e.g., ceases to be active within a taxpayers' organization, or ceases to have a child enrolled in the District) shall be allowed to complete his/her term. However, that Committee member shall not be entitled to serve a subsequent term as a representative of the designated group.

Within sixty (60) days of being notified of a Committee vacancy, the Board will appoint a new member to complete the term of the vacancy following the process used to select the original Committee members, provided an eligible and willing candidate is available and ready to serve.

Committee members shall be subject to prohibitions regarding incompatibility of office pursuant to Government Code 1125-1129 and financial interest in contracts pursuant to Government Code 1090-1098.

The Committee shall establish an attendance policy and procedures for the removal from the Committee for a violation of this policy.

The Committee will determine when a seat on the Committee becomes vacant and a new Committee member will be named by the Board if one or more of the following events occur:

- a) The Committee member submits a written resignation;
- b) The Committee member fails to meet the participation requirements above

An individual who replaces such a member shall serve until the completion of the original member's term. Thereafter, the member must apply for an additional term if she/he wishes to remain on the Committee. A member who is replaced may appeal to the Board for the Board to reappoint that person to the Committee.

Parcel Tax Survey Presentation

Background Information:

At the June 28, 2011 meeting, the Board appointed a subcommittee of Madeline Kronenberg and Antonio Medrano to select a polling firm to conduct a survey and provide outreach services to determine the feasibility of a measure to renew the current parcel tax. The Attorney General has determined that a school district may legally expend district funds to hire a consultant to conduct surveys and establish focus groups to assess the potential support and opposition to a measure, the public's awareness of the district's financial needs, and the overall feasibility of developing a measure that could win voter approval.

The district distributed a request for qualifications (RFQ) to six Bay Area firms that specialize in survey research. After reviewing the proposals, the subcommittee selected Godbe Research to conduct a random sample survey to aid in determining the degree to which the community is willing to support a possible local measure that would help in replacing the vast amount of state funding that has been lost due the State's revenue shortfall. A committee that included the Board members, representatives of the four employee groups and a parent representative assisted in developing the survey that Godbe Research completed in October 2011.

Bryan Godbe will describe the process for implementing the survey and provide the Board with the results of the survey. The next steps included identifying a consulting firm to assist with the community outreach, completing a tracking poll survey sometime in the spring or early summer, and asking the Board to consider adopting a resolution to authorize an election to renew and/or extend the 2008 parcel tax.

Recommendation:

That the Board review the survey results and provide directions for the next steps.
