School Characteristics:

Hercules High School is located at 1900 Refugio Valley Road in Hercules, California. The location is shared with a middle school and a high school with the administrative complex and library separating the two sides. The school was originally established in August, 2001 as a 6-12 educational institution. In June, 2013, the WCCUSD Board approved Hercules High School as a 4 year comprehensive high school serving 9 - 12th grades.

The current school enrollment is 800 which includes 210 seniors. Hercules High School offers a college preparatory program including 12 AP and 2 Honors courses.

Student Body:

Hercules High School reflects the community's rich cultural diversity. Our gender make up is 52% male, 48% female. The student ethnicity make up is: 22% African American; 21% Asian; 28% Filipino; 22% Hispanic/Latino; 5.5% Caucasian, and the remaining 1.5% Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islander, Am. Indian/Alaskan, or declined to choose. Approximately 2% of our high school students are English Language Learners; 42% qualify for free or reduced lunch. The student/counselor ratio is 400:1.

Community Characteristics:

The city of Hercules is located in the western portion of Contra Costa County along the I-80 corridor that runs through the San Francisco Bay Area. The city of Hercules is within twenty five miles east of San Francisco, ten miles North of Berkely, and sixty-five miles West of Sacramento The current population of Hercules is 25,500. The city continues to expand with additional housing units and a safeway/gas station complex all under current construction. As the city expands, it still maintains an abundance of open space giving it a country/suburban feeling.

School Programs:

- Hercules High School students have the opportunity to concurrently enroll in Contra Costa,
 Diablo Valley, or other Community College courses.
- Students are encouraged to start or join one or more of the many clubs on campus. Clubs include: Interact. Kiwanis, JSA, BSU, GSA, Mock Trial, Robotics, MESA.
- Award winning music programs include: Orchestra and Advanced Orchestra, Symphonic Band and Concert Choir.
- Hercules High School offers two Career Technical Education (CTE) pathways including Computer Science and Medical Careers. The Computer Science pathway includes courses in Computer Programming, Cyber Security, AP Computer Science Principles, and AP Computer Science A. The Medical Careers pathway includes courses in Medical Careers, Anatomy and Physiology, and Rehabilitation Therapies/Sports Medicine.
- In addition, HHS offers 12 Advanced Placement (AP) courses that expand over all core departments. AP courses are college-level courses that follow CollegeBoard curriculum.

Athletics:

All athletic teams participate in the CIF, North Coast Section Tri-County Athletic League (TCAL). Team/Individual sports include: Badminton (B/G), Basketball (B/G), Cross-country (B/G), Football (B), Golf (B/G), Soccer (B/G), Swimming (B/G), Water Polo (B/G), Volleyball (B/G), Tennis (B/G), Track and Field B/G), and Wrestling (B/G).

COVID-19:

***Due to COVID-19, instruction for the current year is 100% remote Distance Learning. The distance learning bell schedule is a modified block that splits a 7 period day into two separate schedules. Monday/Wednesday has 4 55 minute periods assigned and Tuesday/Thursday has 3 55 minute periods assigned. with classes held on Monday - Thursday. Each Friday is dedicated to homeroom/advisory period and asynchronous instruction for all students and professional development for all staff. There are two 18-week semesters, August 17, 2020 through June 5th, 2021. ***Due to COVID-19 the grading scale for Spring 2020 was Pass/NoMark, with Pass indicating the equivalent of a C- or higher and the NoMark indicating the equivalent of a D+ or lower. The re-opening of the 2020-21 school year returns to the traditional A-F grading scale.

Graduation Requirements:

Students must earn a minimum of 225 credits, specified by category below. Five units per semester are granted in all courses when a passing grade of D- or above is earned.

The lowest passing grade is a D-. The cumulative GPA is the average of all courses since the beginning of the ninth grade, including non-college preparatory classes, such as PE. Honors courses are designated [H] and Advanced Placement courses are designated [AP]. College preparatory courses are indicated on the transcript with a "P" and meet the University of California A-G requirements. Plus and Minus signs appear on the transcript but are not used in computing grade point averages. Final transcripts reflect weighted and unweighted averages. AP, Honors and some community college courses are assigned an extra grade point for C or better work. Class rank is computed by the weighted GPA of 10th-11th grades.

Honors and Advanced Placement
