Notes from ECHS Pandemic Students

Logan, Wyatt and Dylan are students at El Cerrito High School. They have been learning virtually (remotely, on-line) for over a year.

The Archiving Project wanted to know from current ECHS students' perspectives what it was REALLY like to be learning virtually. They were asked to be honest with their answers.

School Life During Quarantine

At the beginning of my junior year, I could never have guessed that I was going to finish

it online. On March 13, 2020, my distance learning experience began. Many teachers had technology issues at the start and, as students, it was hard to transition to an environment in which you didn't have a partner sitting next to you to interact with. It wouldn't be until I started AP Calculus my senior year that I began to get used to distance learning. Mr. Pang, my calculus teacher, started hosting nightly zoom meetings in which students could study with one another in breakout rooms. It was these study sessions that allowed me to maintain a social life with my peers. Although I miss seeing them in person, I have gotten quite used to studying with my friends on zoom.

Most school-affiliated sports are happening. However, club sports have been forced to find practice space elsewhere. I play Ultimate Frisbee, which is a club sport, and we haven't been able to play or practice for over a year. Unfortunately, senior activities are not happening due to safety issues.

I think schools should start up again when every teacher and staff member has been vaccinated and when there are procedures in place requiring frequent hand washing and sanitizing. Once schools have set up these stations and teachers and staff members feel safe enough, students should be able to attend school in person with masks.

I have had difficulty learning math online, but have managed to maintain good grades overall. I haven't faced too many challenges because I have been able to adjust my study habits and discipline to meet the needs of my classes and account for the help I would receive from my peers if we were physically in school. Numerous times, however, my internet has gone out during a zoom class and even during a test. My teachers are very understanding so it hasn't become an unresolved issue for me but I'm sure others have experienced the same thing more frequently than I have.

Hello my name is Dylan Richardson, class of 2022, and like many others I have been learning virtually for close to one year now. The whole process has been pretty rough especially at the beginning however it is starting to look better. From the start, I knew it would be harder to learn online rather than in person and the first semester only made that clearer for me. There were zooms, or online lectures, maybe once a week, if that and for the majority of the time we were simply doing worksheets. Myself and many others felt that we were barely learning anything at all this way, for the most part it was simply busy work so we could get a grade. It continued like this until summer break in June.

When coming back in the Fall I was expecting something similar to the previous semester, however I was pleasantly surprised by how the new semester was looking. We had zooms every day and for the most part it felt better; however, it was not without its faults. When learning online it takes much more time and effort to fully absorb information, this normally would be ok, taking more time to learn something, but this is a school, and we have a curriculum to meet. Often, we would find ourselves needing to rush through subjects, not being given enough time to understand and process them.
