

MARVIN NELSON MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

A scholarship fund is being established in memory of Marvin Nelson, band director at ⊟ Cerrito High School from 1962 to 1967. The annual aw ard will be made to a graduating senior at ⊟

Cerrito High School who has made significant contributions to the music department. To celebrate the inauguration of this fund, a special concert will be given at the John and Jean Knox Center for the Performing Arts at Contra Costa College on Thursday evening, December 13th at 8 p.m. The El Cerrito High School Concert and Symphonic Bands will perform with the West County Winds, a community band that was founded by Terry Clark, also a former El Cerrito High Band Director. Dr. Jonathan Knight, El Cerrito music parent and a former trumpet student of Mr. Nelson, will be the featured soloist in "Dramatic Essay" for trumpet and band by Clifton Williams.

ABOUT MARVIN NELSON

Marvin Nelson w as born in rural Nebraska on October 10, 1929. The family then moved to Portland, Oregon. Noticing Marv's enthusiasm for "big band" music, his parents bought him a trumpet w hen he w as 14 years old. By the age of 18, he w as playing principal trumpet in the Portland Symphony.

After moving to the Bay Area as a young man, Marv played in the San Francisco Symphony, was principal trumpet in the Oakland symphony for over twenty years, and was an avid performer in many dance bands and jazz ensembles. He obtained his teaching credential from San Francisco State University in 1957, taught at Roosevelt Middle School in San Francisco, and was director of bands at \Box Cerrito High School from 1962 to 1967.

He w as then appointed director of bands at Cal State Hayward, (now CSU "East Bay") where he remained until his retirement in the early 1990s. As a result of his tenure at CSUEB, his impact on music education in the Bay Area was enormous, and the number of fine musicians and teachers who were trained by Marv during this time is legion. His influence was powerful even during his brief stay at \Box Cerrito High School. Distinguished graduates of those classes include Loretta McNulty, who teaches strings in the Lafayette schools, and Bill Holmes, who plays trumpet in the San Francisco Opera orchestra. Everyone who had the privilege of working with Marvin remembers his passion, energy, and commitment to music and to education.

A longtime resident of \Box Cerrito, Marv and his wife, Marilyn, raised their children, Vickie, Laurie, Susie, and Ron, in their home on Rivera Street. Marv continued to live there until shortly after Marilyn's death in 2004, and spent his remaining months in a retirement home in the east bay. Marv passed away on April 23, 2006.

Interview with Roddy Lee

Class of 1967

Roddy Lee is a real local. He was born in Oakland, grew up in Kensington, attended Kensington Elementary, Portola Junior, and El Cerrito High School's. He obtained a bachelor's degree and teaching credential at Cal and a master's degree in physical education from Hayward State University. He now lives in El Cerrito with his wife, Karen, and teaches at El Cerrito High School. Roddy's 28 year old son, Adam, lives in Beijing, China, and his 25 year old daughter, Jessica, is a teacher at El Sobrante Elementary School. Both graduated from El Cerrito High School.

Olympics Roddy competed in track and field for the University of California, Berkeley. In 1969, as a junior at Cal, he was approached by Taiw an and asked if he was interested in competing for them in the 1970 Asian Games. He did and took silver medals in the 110 meter high hurdle and the 400 meter intermediate hurdle races. Taiw an gave Roddy a \$300 per month scholarship to Cal. There he continued to train with the Cal team in 1971 and 1972. A month before the 1972 Olympics, Roddy went to Taiw an to train and then on to the Munich Olympics. At the Olympics, he competed for the Republic of China Track Team as a hurdler.

<u>Teaching and Coaching</u> Roddy began his teaching career at Kennedy High School and w as the head track coach for ten years. After short assignments at Helms and Downer, he began teaching at ECHS in 1984. He currently teaches physical education and computers applications. He coached volleyball for over 20 years and is currently the Head Golf coach.

<u>The Archiving Project and Memories</u> The ECHS Archiving Project is fortunate to have Roddy as a key member. He maintains the Archiving New sletter and email database for the Archiving Project. In addition he chairs his Reunion Committee.

Roddy attended \boxminus Cerrito during the time Hale Roach w as the track coach and w as part of the memorable six year period w hen ECHS did not lose a single dual meet. Roddy asked Hale Roach for advice, as he w anted to be a coach. Hale encouraged him to be a teacher and coach. Roddy enjoys the relationship a coach has w ith his athletes. There is a sense of belonging and a special bond that sports gives to students. Those w ho participate in sports learn how to w ork cooperatively as a team, an attribute that helps prepare them for life.


