2015 Scholarships

The ECHS Archiving Project Scholarships are awarded annually to deserving graduates with plans to attend two- or four-year colleges. Selection of the awardees is a two-step process performed by the Archiving Scholarship Committee. First, the committee reviews the students' written submissions, including the completed application form, a one-page essay, two letters of recommendation, and a transcript. These submittals are scored by each member of the committee according to a point system. Next, the highest-scoring applicants are invited for an interview with the committee. The interview result is also scored by each member using a separate interview point system. Upon completion of the interview, the results of the written submission and interview scores are combined, and the total scores for each candidate by each judge are reviewed together. The highest-ranked candidates are selected to receive the awards. In case of very close results, the committees discusses each candidate and his or her particular circumstances and awards the scholarship(s) to the candidate(s) that the committee feels will best represent and carry forward important elements of the Gaucho spirit, especially overcoming adversity and appreciating diversity.

Sam Burns, ECHS Class of 1971

Sam Burns was born in 1953 and grew up in Richmond, California. His father came from Texas; his mother from Louisiana. Both parents are now deceased. His father served in the military during

World War II, and while his father was away at war, his mother became a "Rosie" and helped to build ships in the Kaiser Richmond Shipyards. One of three kids, Sam had a sister who was a year older and a brother who was a year younger.

As a youth, Sam babysat for the sons of former Richmond Mayors Booker and Irma Anderson. Reverend Booker T. Anderson served at Easter Hill United Methodist Church, which Sam's family attended. Sam thinks that his later ability to handle his own students was a result of those years of

Sam was also active in the El Cerrito Boys Club in the building now occupied by the Contra Costa Civic Theater and was a member of Boy Scout Troup 179 which met on 43rd St. in Richmond at the Pilgrim's Rest Baptist Church.

A local school product all the way, Sam attended Stege Elementary School, went to Granada Junior High School for one year and then finished junior high at Portola. After Portola, Sam enrolled at El Cerrito High School. There he competed on the track team coached by the famous Hale Roach. Playing football and track created an important social network for Sam. At ECHS, he also became politically active in the Black Student Union.

After graduating from ECHS, Sam attended UC Berkeley between 1971 and 1976, with a dual sports scholarship in track and football. After college, Sam worked for the Contra Costa County Sheriff's Office as a Deputy and then as a county court bailiff, primarily in the courtroom of Judge Steve Easton. He retired from the Sheriff's Office six years ago after serving for 25 years.

In addition to his work at the Sheriff's office, Sam has served as an after-school, high-school coach for many years. Beginning in 1979, he coached at several local high schools: ECHS, Kennedy and Pinole Valley. He was at ECHS for nine years and was head coach of the boys' and girls' track teams for eight of those years. He coached six years at Pinole Valley High School, 2008 to 2013, and at Kennedy High in Richmond from about 1999 to 2001. Besides Coach Roach, other coaches who influenced Sam were John Nules, football coach, and Phil Clifton, his first track coach. He is currently assistant sprint coach for the track team at Pinole Valley High School.

Sam now lives in Hercules and has two grown sons, Sam III and Kajari, who is a coach at Riordan High School in San Francisco. And, importantly, Sam is now a board member of the El Cerrito High School Archiving Project. Welcome, Sam!
