followed that with an internal medicine internship and residency at Boston City Hospital, along with work at the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) in Atlanta during the Vietnam War. At the CDC he worked to prevent salmonella infections, which commonly result after ingesting contaminated food and result in gastroenteritis, which, when severe, can be fatal. After academic jobs at Harvard and George Washington (DC) medical schools, Steve returned to the Bay Area in 1976 to join the faculty at the University of California, San Francisco (UCSF) School of Medicine. At UCSF, he practiced as a general internist in the hospital and the clinic and did research in health policy. In 1980, he founded the Division of General Internal Medicine at UCSF.

In 1990, Steve went to Princeton to be the president and CEO of the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation (RWJF), the nation's largest health-care philanthropy. During his 12-1/2 years at RWJF, the foundation made more than \$4 billion in grants to improve the health and health care of all Americans. Highlights of those years included major progress against tobacco use, better patterns of care at the end of life, expanding health insurance coverage for children, and enriching opportunities in medicine for minority students and young minority faculty.

Although Steve loved the RWJF years, there was a strong pull to come back to the Bay Area. His father was still living in El Cerrito, both sons were in medical residencies on the west coast, and he and wife Sally still owned their home in Tiburon. So, in 2003 they returned to the Bay Area. For the past 14 years Steve has been Distinguished Professor of Health and Health Care in the Department of Medicine at UCSF, as well as director of the national Smoking Cessation Leadership Center (SCLC). The SCLC works to help national organizations do a better job at helping smokers quit. Despite amazing progress in smoking over the years-with smoking rates among adults declining from 42% in 1964 to 15% today-smoking still accounts for some 500,000 deaths each year in the United States alone, and 6 million world-wide. In contrast to when he was in high school, smoking today is concentrated among vulnerable populations, including those with mental illnesses and substance use disorders such as alcoholism and drug abuse, the homeless, those in prison, the LGBT population and persons living in the southeastern parts of the United States. His Center works to reach those populations and help them to stop smoking and thus avoid premature death and

Steve continues to work full-time and also sits on many organizational boards, some national and some local. He has won many honors, including receiving six honorary doctoral degrees.

Steve married Sally Ross, whom he met in Boston, in 1967, and they have two sons, both physicians, and four grandchildren, three girls and one boy. His son David is a cardiologist in Portland, Oregon, and son Alan is a pediatrician at Stanford.

Steve's parents, Arthur and Norma, lived out their long lives in El Cerrito. Norma died in 2001 at age 91, and Art died in 2006, shortly after his 99th birthday. Art was very active in many El Cerrito organizations, and in the last years of his life he and Steve set up a scholarship fund-named after Art and Norma-for ECHS graduates. In addition, Steve and Sally have established a family foundation that has made contributions in Richmond to programs that improve childhood literacy and revitalize neighborhood parks. He is still in touch with a few ECHS classmates, and wishes all his fellow Gauchos a good life.
