



Percent of Students That Met or Exceeded Standards




Change Over Time




Percent of Students That Met or Exceeded Standards






Percent of Students That Met or Exceeded Standards




Change Over Time





Average Cohort Graduation Rate





Percent of 12th Graders Taking SAT




Percent of Test Takers Scoring at or Above English Benchmark




Percent of Test Takers Scoring at or Above Math Benchmark






Percent of 12th Graders Taking ACT








Percent of Test Takers Scoring 21 or Better
