4a	4a Transition Program Discussion - Ken Talken ■ Discusión del Programa de Transición - Ken Talken						
	The Transition Fair held on Saturday was a great success. It was well attended and received by the comm						
	Ken Talken reported that an ongoing dialogue around transition issues continues. The goal of the program is to move towards establishing a seamless approach to transition for students with disabilities. He reported that creating competitive employment opportunities for adults with disabilities in our communities continues to be a challenge facing WCCUSD.						
	Transition Kitchen issues continue: He reported that it is a dream of the program to establish a community kitchen to hold community events and serve food out of, which would be staffed and run by students with disabilities. Presently the district has a teacher on staff with a career education credential and a makeshift room has been set up to build a kitchen for use as a training facility. Currently a cafe exists but it does not meet the needs they can no longer serve coffee due to a number of issues, thereby reducing the amount of needed revenues for the program.						
	Warming Oven issues: There are presently no hot meals served at the transition program. It is the only program in the district that does not offer hot meals. He is seeking support to remedy this.

- Masking Update On February 28, Governor Gavin Newsom announced an update to the state masking guidance, moving from a mask requirement to recommendation for schools beginning at 11:59 pm on March 11. We responded initially by lifting our outdoor mask requirement.
- Superintendent Hurst believes in <u>guidelines from the California Department of Health Services (CDPH)</u> and <u>following its considerations</u>.
- Beginning Monday, March 14, we are strongly recommending masks, but no longer requiring them, at all WCCUSD middle schools, high schools, and central offices. Starting on April 15, after we return from spring break, masking will be strongly recommended but no longer required for all WCCUSD schools and central offices, including Pre-K, TK, elementary and K-8 schools.

Sonja Neely-Johnson reported the following update:

- The Special Education Local Plan Area (SELPA's) full Local Plan was submitted on June 20, 2020
 - 3 year plan
- The local plan includes two sections that must be developed and adopted annually following all legal requirements:
 - annual budget plan
 - annual service plan

SELPA LOCAL PLAN:

Under AB602 (1998) all SELPAs are required to submit a annual service and budget plan to the California Department of Education (CDE) for approval.

- The purpose of the plan is to: 1) assure access to special education and related services for all
 individuals with exceptional needs residing within the geographic areas served by the plan; and 2) to
 assure compliance with all federal and state codes and statutes
- Local Plan Template Contents
 - Section A: Contacts and Certifications
 - Section B: Governance and Administration (3yrs)
 - Section C: Annual Assurances Support Plan*(will be implemented for the 2026 school year if approved in June)
 - Section D: Annual Budget Plan
 - Section E: Annual Services Plan
- Attachments
 - Attachment IV

Annual Budget and Service Plans and Requirements:

- Prior to submission, the Local Plan, including the Annual Service Plan and Annual Budget Plan, must be
 adopted at a public hearing and notice of the hearing must be posted in each school for the budget plan
 and each district for the service plan at least 15 days prior to the hearing
- The budget and service plans may be revised during the fiscal year
- The Annual Budget Plan (ABP) must include:
 - Administrative costs of the plan
 - Services to students with severe and low incidence disabilities
 - Services to students with non-severe disabilities
 - Supplemental aids and services to meet the individual needs of students placed in general education
 - Regionalized operations/services and direct instructional support by program specialists
 - The use of special education property taxes
 - This Plan does not capture all of the funding for special education services, but rather describes how the federal and state funds are allocated.
 - The nature of the services, including Related services

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- The physical location where the services are provided which may include:
 - Alternative Schools
 - Charter Schools
 - Opportunity Day Schools operated by school districts
 - Community Day Schools operated by the County
 - Office of Education regardless of whether the district or county office of education participates in the Local Plan
 - Nonpublic Schools
- WCCUSD SELPAs Annual Budget is comprised of revenue from:
 - Assembly Bill (AB) 602 State Aid
 - Federal IDEA Part B K-22
 - Federal IDEA Part C preschool
 - State Infant/Toddler
 - State Mental Health
 - Federal Mental Health
 - Other Revenue DOR/ Workability/ Medical Billing
 - Contributions from the district General Fund (Local Contribution)*
 - Typical district contributions from the general fund for special education is between 60 and 70% (up from 50% 5 years ago) WCCUSD projected contribution for 2021-22 is 70.6%. This is a major topic at Leg Day

- Obtain signatures from the Board of Education and County Office superintendent;
- Obtain signatures from the Community Advisory Committee (CAC) chairperson;
- Submit the plan to CDE for final approval.

Gilberto: Inquired about the root causes resulting in over identification of African American Students as special education students. Ms. Neely Johnson listed the five root causes identified and the process that has taken place over the last year. She invited him to consider joining the stakeholder group. Zelon Harrison expressed her appreciation for all those working in the district for our kids. She also raised the issue that it is extremely difficult for African American families.
