History and Implementation of the ISP model at Wilson Elementary

Key Points – Students are in Gen ed and not missing instruction in preferred subjects. Challenging behaviors are decreasing due to students having more time with more appropriate models. Reading groups are based on abilities. All students are learning cultural benefits of inclusion. - We thank Ms. Velez and Mr. Barr for this valuable presentation to CAC.

SELPA Directors Report:

- The RSP position at DeAnza has been filled and the teacher has been paired with a mentor teacher.
- The dept. is still looking for aides, especially those that can work 3.5 hours.
- Also looking for preschool teachers. Pre-K has increased by approx. 200 students in the past 3 years. To be a preschool teacher, both the mod-severe credential and preschool

credential is needed. A suggestion was made to push out on more social/electronic media.

- First Student has increased the number of drivers, so fewer are doubling routes. Department website is updated and organizational charts and resources are now included on the department page.
- Sean Corson is heading up the Special Olympics events. Special Olympics school events are coming up with the first major event at ECHS. Basketball on December 5. Adaptive PE is including training for the student athletes in preparation for the events.
- The Sonday reading curriculum has been ordered for classrooms in response for requests for reading programs for students with dyslexia.
- An Inclusive Practices Conference is planned for next summer.
