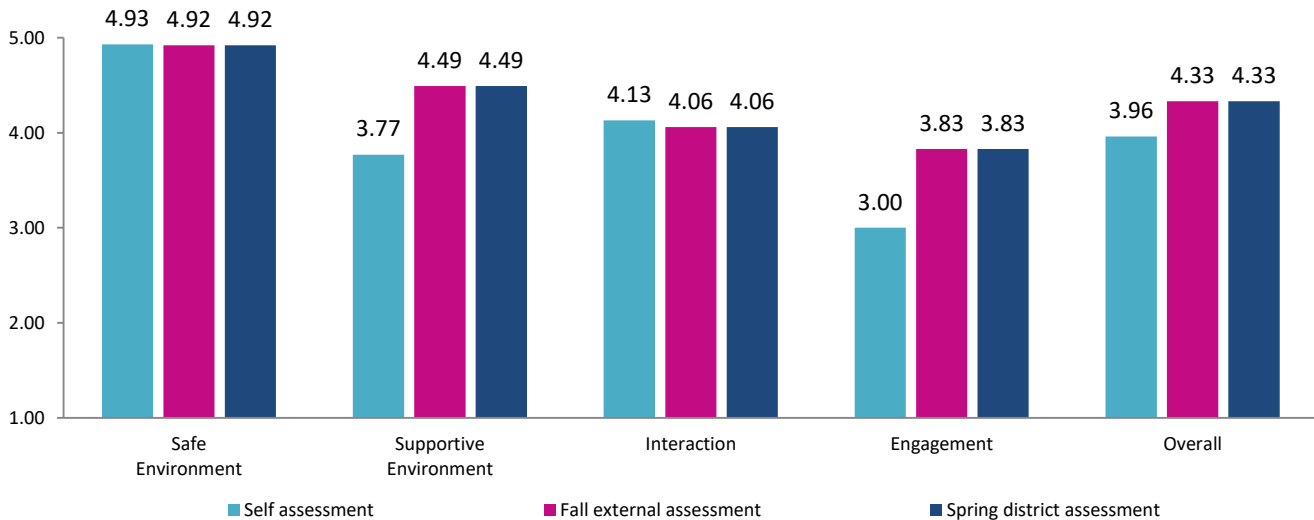

Site Visit Summary



Observations used the Program Quality Assessment (PQA), a research-validated observation tool used in youth development programs around the country.

What the domains mean

- **Safe Environment** – Students experience both physical and emotional safety; the program environment is safe and sanitary; the social environment is safe.
- **Supportive Environment** – Adults support children to learn and grow; adults support children with opportunities for active learning, for skill building, and to develop healthy relationships.
- **Interaction** – There is a positive peer culture in the program. Children support each other and experience a sense of belonging, participate in small groups, and partner with adults.
- **Engagement** – Children experience positive challenges and pursue learning. Children plan, make choices, and learn from their experiences.

What the ratings mean

The ratings indicate the following levels of performance:

- A rating of one (1) indicates that the practice was not observed during the observation, or that the practice is not a part of the program.
- A rating of three (3) indicates that the practice was implemented relatively consistently across staff and activities, based on the observation.
- A rating of five (5) indicates that the practice was implemented consistently and well across staff and activities, based on the observation.

Expanded Learning Program Goals

What are the three primary goals for the 2018-19 Expanded Learning Program?

GOAL 1: By May 2019, 100% of ELP 2nd grade students will see a 15% increase in their reading fluency as measured by AR assessments.
GOAL 2: By May 2019, 100% of ELP 3rd grade students will see an increase of at least two levels as measured by school day AR assessments.
GOAL 3: By May 2019, ELP will have hosted eight family nights to support in school initiative of connecting families with learning or community resources.

Provide an implementation update for each of the three primary goals.

GOAL 1: Second grade instructor continued to facilitate skill building activities three times a week. Instructor implemented the model: I read, We read, You read to support fluency. Staff modeled appropriate pace for students. Site Coordinator and Literacy Coach created academic action plans that supported in fluency activities and facilitation. As well as provided 20 min. of daily buddy reading or reading circle time using books Lead teacher suggested based on teacher feedback.
GOAL 2: Third grade instructor continued facilitating skill-building activities three times a week. Site Coordinator and Literacy Coach created academic action plans that support in reading comprehension activities and facilitation. As well as provided 20 min. of daily buddy reading or reading circle time using books Lead teacher suggested based on teacher feedback. Follow up activities to buddy reading were not implemented.
GOAL 3: Nystrom ELP has hosted eight family nights in collaboration with the day school that focused around student learning and community resources. Site Coordinator met with the SSSS to discuss upcoming events and cross collaboration for next school year.

Data review of progress towards primary goals.

GOAL 1: 2nd grade students were assessed using Accelerated Reader program. 85% of students have met the goal of 15% increase. 10% of students have shown an average increase over the 15%. The remaining students increased their reading fluency by 8%.
GOAL 2: 3rd grade students were assessment using the Accelerated Reader program. 14% have met the goal. 43% have seen, on average, a year or more of reading growth. The remaining have grown half a year or less.
GOAL 3: In collaboration with day school, Nystrom ELP has hosted two more parent nights, bringing the total to 8 out of 8.

Recommendations and next steps for each of the primary goals, informed by data.

GOAL 1: Based on program planning meetings with the Principal, the program has decided focus reading growth for second grade.
GOAL 2: Based on program planning meetings with the Principal, the program has decided to focus students feeling that the Expanded Learning Program helps them understand their school work.
GOAL 3: Based on program planning meeting with the Principal, the program has decided to focus on parent participation in events.
