Coronado Elementary School believes that public education provides opportunities and experiences that are essential to the future and success of our community.

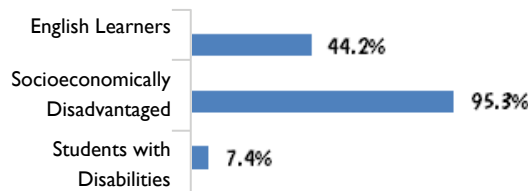
