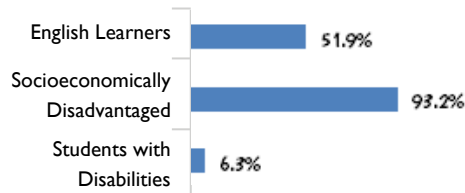

▶ LCAP AND OUR SCHOOL

The **Local Control Accountability Plan (LCAP)** is a community-driven roadmap to determine how the District will spend a portion of state funding to ensure that all our students succeed - especially low income students, English learners, and foster youth. Each school receives site funding to address goals for their school. The number of unduplicated **low income**, **English learner**, and **foster youth** students at each school determines the school's site allocations and which LCAP districtwide programs are available at that school.
