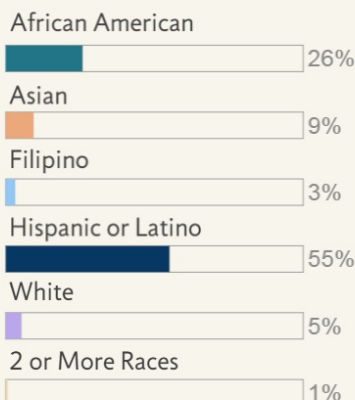


\$56,031 Total Site LCAP Allocation
