




LCAP SUMMARY

LCAP = The Local Control Accountability Plan is the district's 3-year plan for how it will use state LCFF funding to serve all students, including Low-Income students (LI), English Learners (EL), and Foster Youth (FY).

School Site Councils (SSCs) review data and collaboratively determine site needs. Actions/Services are then added to the Single Plan for Student Achievement (SPSA).
