

# LCAP AND OUR SCHOOL

The Local Control Accountability Plan (LCAP) is a community-driven roadmap to determine how the District will spend a portion of state funding to ensure that all our students succeed - especially low income students, English learners, and foster youth. Each school receives site funding to address goals for their school. The number of unduplicated low income, English learner, and foster youth students at each school determines the school's site allocations and which LCAP districtwide programs are available at that school.
