



Kindergarten Learning


When we return from Distance Learning to the classroom ...

How can I get my child ready?



Kindergarten School Readiness

- As your child enters school, these skills and activities will prepare them to participate productively in a classroom.
 - Following two-step directions
 - Using good manners
 - Sharing and taking turns
 - Using the bathroom independently
 - Washing your own hands
 - Managing strong emotions
 - Operating zippers, shoelaces, and buttons
 - Taking responsibility for your own actions (ex: if you spill something, you clean it up).

Kindergarten School Readiness

- Continued
 - Teach responsibility by assigning small age appropriate chores such as helping water plants, bringing clothes to the laundry room, refilling pet dishes, picking up toys, etc.
 - Establish routines—Schedules are part of life at school and at home. Planning regular daily activities such as snack time or bedtime will help your child get used to routines.
 - Teach your child to be safe. Be sure he/she/they knows and can tell his/her/their first and last name, street address, and phone number.

Preparing Your Kindergartener

While your child is at home prior to starting Distance Learning, you can work on these skills:

- Proper pencil grip
- Practice with scissors
- Practice using glue sticks
- Writing name correctly
- Counting to 20 & recognizing numbers 1-10
- Recognizing his/her/their own name
- Listen to stories, look at books
- Practice recognizing letters, sound, and numbers
- Having conversations

Getting Ready for Kindergarten


Before the First Day






Make sure we have your correct phone numbers and emails to ensure you get timely information.


