Ivy League Connection:



Rising Scholars: We had a great turn out for our Rising Scholars, led by Ms. Jacqueline Rushing. The Rising Scholars program focusses on empowering students of color providing them opportunities to enhance their capacity to achieve success at a 4 year university.

PSAT/SAT: Academic counselors have been making the rounds to present results of these test to all students. PSAT/SAT tests are reported on a scale from 200-800, with additional subscores reported for the essay (ranging from 2-12) and for multiple-choice writing questions on a 20-80 scale. PSAT/SAT scores compare individual performance with the performance of other students taking the same test nation and world wide.
