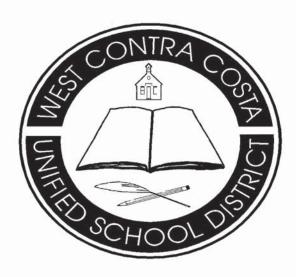

Comment:

*CI C.12 Letter in Support of AB48

Comment:

Assembly Member Nancy Skinner has introduced a bill, AB 48, which will require ammunition vendors to report all ammunition purchases to the Department of Justice, and ban possession of magazine conversion kits. AB 48 will require anyone selling or transferring ammunition to an individual in California to require proper identification, to be an authorized firearms dealer, and to report the sales to the Department of Justice.

Passage of this bill would help to make schools and the communities around them safer.

*CI C.13 Ratification and Approval of Engineering Services Contracts

Comment:

Contracts have been initiated by staff using previously qualified consulting, engineering, architectural, or landscape architectural firms to assist in completion of the referenced projects. Many of the firms are already under contract and the staff-initiated work may be an extension of the firm's existing contract with the District. Public contracting laws have been followed in initially qualifying and selecting these professionals.

*CI C.14 Ratification and Approval of Negotiated Change Orders

Comment:

Staff is seeking ratification of Change Orders on the following current District construction projects: Kennedy HS ADA Upgrades and Elevator, Portola MS Demolition of Existing Campus, Ellerhorst ES Restroom Repairs, Lincoln ES Restroom Repairs, Harding ES Restroom Repairs, Tara Hills ES Restroom Repairs and King ES Security Raceway. Change Orders are fully executed by the District upon signature by the Superintendent's designee. Board ratification is the final step required under state law in order to complete payment and contract adjustment.

In addition to normal ratification, approval of the noted Change Order for the King ES Security Raceway project is required by the Board, with special findings as noted below, because this project is in excess of the Public Contract Code limit of 10% of the original contract value. In accordance with Public Contract Code 20118.4, the Board, by ratifying these Change Orders, finds that it would have been futile to publicly bid the work in question because of the tight time frames to complete this work

without affecting the operations of the District, and that the public is best served by having this work completed by the contractor on the project

*CI C.15 Measures J and D 2010, Measure E 2012, Bond Program Budget Update

Comment:

The District needs to update the Bond Program Budget to include the recently approved Measure E projects, as well as reconciling the actual expenditure for the recently contracted projects. The expenditure authorization worksheet includes these proposed adjustments.

*CI C.16 Adoption of Resolution 66-1213 for SAB "Applications Received Beyond Bond Authority"

Comment:

It is recommended that the Board adopt Resolution 66-1213 acknowledging that the State's bond authority is exhausted for modernization and new construction funds being requested from the State School Facility Program. The State has received funding applications which exceed bond authority for the Modernization as well as the New Construction programs, and the State Allocation Board (SAB) has changed the method in which they process applications for these two programs.

The regulations, effective November 1, 2012, establish a SAB acknowledged list for projects that are received by OPSC after bond authority is exhausted. The new list is called the "Applications Received Beyond Bond Authority List." Applications placed on this list will undergo an intake review to ensure all of the required documents have been submitted, but will not be fully processed by OPSC to the SAB for approval.

Resolution 66-1213 is required in order for the District to continue to submit Modernization and New Construction applications to the State, and contains the language approved by the SAB. After adoption, this resolution will be submitted with future funding and eligibility applications.

*CI C.17 Approval of Additional Program Management General Conditions Reimbursable Expense

Comment:

The District has retained Seville Group (SGI) as the Program Manager for the Bond Program. A portion of the Program Management contract for the firm is known as General Conditions Reimbursable expense ("GCR's"). These are costs which the District has negotiated as a part of the contract for which the firm bills direct expense, plus markup. General Conditions Reimbursable expenses include computer software/hardware expenses, office equipment, legally required advertisements, postage, security, office supplies, and telephone/fax expense. These types of costs include Network Administrator, and Fiscal Controls Specialist. In addition, these costs include Cost Estimating, Scheduling, and Software Programming.

Recommendation:

Approve additional Program Management General Conditions Reimbursable Expense for Seville Group, Inc. for the remainder of the fiscal year.

* D.2 Presentation on the Random Sample Survey

Comment:

At the January 9, 2013 meeting, the Board authorized the Superintendent to enter into a contract with Godbe Research to conduct a random sample survey regarding a possible parcel tax measure. The Attorney General has determined that a school district may legally expend district funds to conduct surveys to assess the potential support and opposition to a measure, the public's awareness of the district's financial needs, and the overall feasibility of developing a measure that could win voter approval.

Bryan Godbe will describe the process for implementing the survey and provide the Board with the results of the survey. At the March 6, 2013 meeting, the Board will need to determine whether to place a measure on the June ballot.

This change would expand the KHS boundaries to Wall Street on the North, the I-80 Freeway on the East, Potrero Avenue on the South and Carlson Blvd on the West. The change would become effective with the current 8th graders, Class of 2017, who live in that area.

Dear Assemblymember Skinner:

The Board of Education of the West Contra Costa Unified School District is writing in support of your bill, AB 48, which will require ammunition vendors to report all ammunition purchases to the Department of Justice, and ban possession of magazine conversion kits.

AB 48 will require anyone selling or transferring ammunition to an individual in California to require proper identification, to be an authorized firearms dealer, and to report the sales to the Department of Justice.

Currently, it is more difficult to purchase over the counter cold medicine like pseudoephedrine, than ammunition. Furthermore, current state law does not require tracking of ammunition sales. AB 48 will provide oversight of our state's ammunition market and makes buying ammunition at least as difficult as buying cold medicine.

Additionally, this bill will make it unlawful to possess any parts that can be assembled into a complete high capacity magazine, capable of accepting more than 10 rounds. Currently, it is illegal to possess large-capacity magazines that can accept more than 10 rounds of ammunition in California. Unfortunately, some individuals obtain parts that allow them to assemble such a complete magazine themselves; AB 48 will close this loophole.

Communities throughout our state and across the nation have been stunned with the horrific and tragic events that have recently occurred due to gun violence. The mass shooting in Aurora, Colorado, where the alleged shooter amassed 6,000 rounds of ammunition over a few-week period without raising red flags highlighted the need for further protection to help reduce the threat of gun violence in our communities. In Newtown, Connecticut, police found the shooter with multiple high-capacity magazines and hundreds of unspent rounds.

While incidents like Aurora and Newtown may be rare, gun violence is an ongoing, yet unnecessary threat in communities throughout California.

We have an obligation to minimize gun violence and make our communities safer.

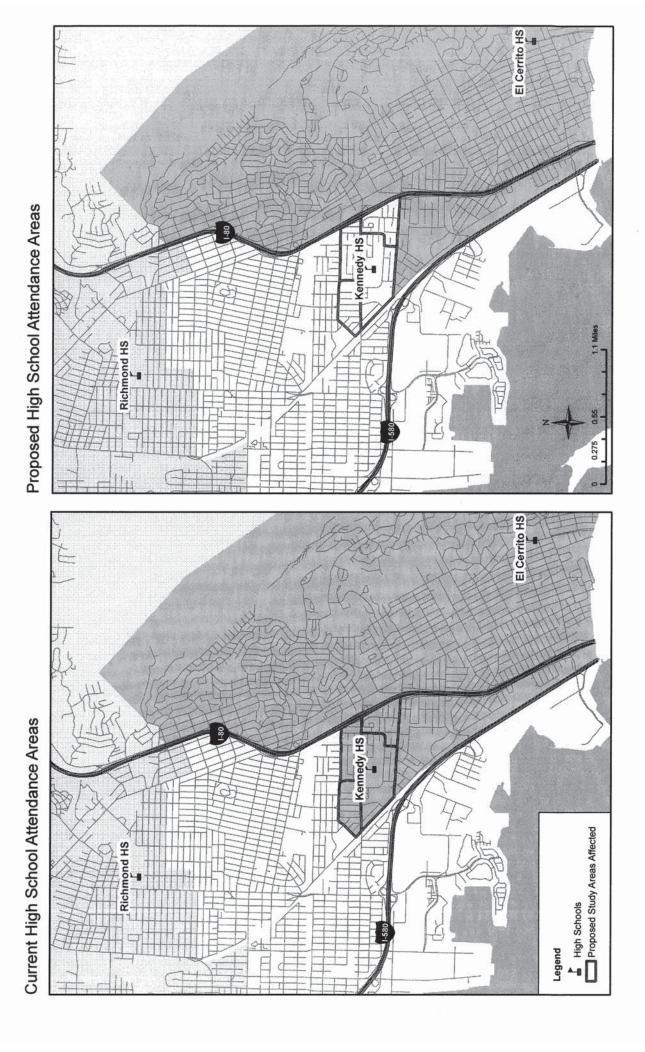
