*CI C.8 2013-14 Consolidated Application for Funding

Comment:

The Consolidated Application and Reporting System (CARS), formerly known as the Consolidated Application, is the vehicle used by the California Department of Education to gather routine district data regarding categorical programs and compliance with NCLB requirements.

CARS includes basic information about student demographics which is used to report and calculate state and federal allocations for Title I, Title III, and State Compensatory Education (EIA-LEP and SCE).

*CI C.9 Ratification and Approval of Engineering Services Contracts

Comment:

Contracts have been initiated by staff using previously qualified consulting, engineering, architectural, or landscape architectural firms to assist in completion of the referenced projects. Many of the firms are already under contract and the staff-initiated work may be an extension of the firm's existing contract with the District. Public contracting laws have been followed in initially qualifying and selecting these professionals.

*CI C.10 Ratification and Approval of Negotiated Change Orders

Comment:

Staff is seeking ratification of Change Orders on the following current District construction projects: Ohlone ES Phase I New Campus; and Richmond HS Emergency Lighting. Change Orders are fully executed by the District upon signature by the Superintendent's designee. Board ratification is the final step required under state law in order to complete payment and contract adjustment.

In addition to normal ratification, approval of the noted Change Order for the Richmond HS Emergency Lighting project is required by the Board, with special findings as noted below, because this project is in excess of the Public Contract Code limit of 10% of the original contract value. In accordance with Public Contract Code 20118.4, the Board, by ratifying these Change Orders, finds that it would have been futile to publicly bid the work in question because of the tight time frames to complete this work without affecting the operations of the District, and that the public is best served by having this work completed by the contractor on the project.

*CI C.11 Ratification of Staff Awarded Contract: Grant ES & Lake ES Restrooms Renovation

Comment:

Hamilton + Aitken has prepared plans and specifications for the project. Scope of work includes renovation of the existing restrooms, including the removal and installation of existing toilet fixtures, toilet accessories, toilet partitions, diffusers, electrical devices, and providing power to new electrical hand dryers. Work also includes removal of existing restroom finishes to install new finishes, installation of new gypsum wallboard, porcelain tile, restoration and reglazing existing windows and painting finishes.

The District conducted a public bid process for the project. Six bids were received for the project, which included a line item for unit costs. Bids were received on June 4, 2013. Six contractors submitted bids. They are as follows: AM Woo Construction, \$155,600; Streamline Builders, \$163,600; Hung Construction, \$172, 500; Affordable Painting Services, \$183,290; ERA Construction, \$184, 550; and World Priority Construction, \$207,250. The apparent low bidder is AM Woo Construction.

In consideration of the need to complete the work expeditiously, the Superintendent's designee authorized award of a contract for the project to the lowest responsive bidder: AM Woo Construction in the amount of \$149,600 (without unit costs).

The Education Code requires the Board to ratify this award action by the Superintendent's designee.
