*CI C.8 Approval of Common Core State Standards (CCSS) Implementation Funds Plan

Comment:

The CCSS implementation funds will be spent on professional development, supplemental instructional materials aligned to the common core, and technology. Staff presented the elements of the CCSS Implementation Funds Plan at the November 6 Board Meeting. A public hearing was also held at the November 6 Board Meeting.

*CI C.9 Ratification and Approval of Engineering Services Contracts

Comment:

Contracts have been initiated by staff using previously qualified consulting, engineering, architectural, or landscape architectural firms to assist in completion of the referenced projects. Many of the firms are already under contract and the staff-initiated work may be an extension of the firm's existing contract with the District. Public contracting laws have been followed in initially qualifying and selecting these professionals.

*CI C.10 Ratification and Approval of Negotiated Change Orders

Comment:

Staff is seeking ratification of Change Orders on the following current District construction projects: Kensington ES Moisture Abatement; Kensington ES Restroom Renovations; Kennedy HS Science Wing Renovation; Portola MS New Building; Helms MS Sports Field & Landscaping; De Anza HS Replacement Campus; Peres ES Modernization; New Gompers/LPS Schools. Change Orders are fully executed by the District upon signature by the Superintendent's designee. Board ratification is the final step required under state law in order to complete payment and contract adjustment.

In accordance with Public Contract Code 20118.4, the Board, by ratifying these Change Orders, finds that it would have been futile to publicly bid the work in question because of the tight time frames to complete this work without affecting the operations of the District, and that the public is best served by having this work completed by the contractor on the project.

<u>Recommendation</u>: Ratify negotiated Change Orders as noted

<u>Fiscal Impact</u>: Total ratification and approval by this action: \$279,451.44

*CI C.11 Approve Measure J and D 2010, Measure E 2012, Bond Program Budget Expenditure Authorization

Comment:

The District needs to update the Bond Program Budget to accommodate updated, anticipated project costs, based on recently received bids. The expenditure authorization worksheet includes these proposed adjustments.

Several other current construction estimates exceed the approved project budgets; therefore an ongoing reconciliation will be needed as projects are bid, closed out, and/or additional expenditures are incurred.

This is by far the most diverse set of awardees we have had in terms of the distribution of grants to different schools.

* F.1 Approval of Agreement with West Contra Costa Administrators Association (West Contra Costa Administrators Association / AB1200 Public Disclosure of Collective Bargaining Agreement with WCCAA)

Comment:

The contract before the Board of Education is a completion of total contract negotiations between the District and West Contra Costa Administrators Association (WCCAA) which began in 2012-2013. The District and WCCAA agreed to Salary and Benefits for 2012-13 at the January 23, 2013 Board meeting.

The contract has contractual language changes are in the following areas:

- Article 3 Salary provisions for Doctorate and Longevity
- Article 5 Agency dues are clarified
- Article 8 Extensive work to ensure all leaves are in compliance with currents laws
- Article 11 Clarifying process for filling of bargaining unit vacancies
- Article 12 Benefits clarified to reflect January 23, 2013 agreement
- Article 15 Updating evaluation dates and timelines. Appeal process for evaluation process included
- Article 17 Job Sharing and Reduced Contracts was added to the contract
- Article 18 Reclassification Process was added to the contract
- Article 21 Safety provision was added to contract
- Article 22 Updated the number of exchange day allowed was added to contract
- Article 23 End of Year release was added to the contract. The language is a reflection of current law
- Article 24 Layoff procedure was added to contract to comply with current law
- Appendix Extended Learning daily rates were corrected to the accurate amount

The West Contra Costa Administrators Association (WCCAA) has ratified the Agreement; it is now presented to the Board of Education for ratification.

School districts are required to publicly disclose the provisions of all collective bargaining agreements before they ratify an agreement. This ensures that the public is aware of the details associated with a tentative collective bargaining agreement before it becomes binding on the District. A summary of the savings associated with the agreement is provided. This summary has also been provided to the County Office of Education.

The Board will receive public comment on the proposed contract changes before the Board votes to ratify the Agreement.

We want to take this occasion to thank the representatives of both groups for their time and effort in reaching this accord through the interest based process.

Recommendation:

Recommend that the Board of Education ratify the Tentative Agreement between the West Contra Costa Unified School District and West Contra Costa Administrators Association (WCCAA).

Fiscal Impact:

F.2 Procurement Contract for Data Center and Wireless Infrastructure

Comment:

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Under Public Contract Code Section 20118 (K-12) our District is able to utilize procurement contracts which have been publicly bid or negotiated for the use by other public entities. Through CDWG we will be utilizing National Joint Powers Alliance, and CalSave contracts for the procurement of a wireless infrastructure for 13 sites and head-end equipment to be used for the District's video surveillance system, email servers, Voice over IP communications and storage.

In March 2013, the Board approved an ERATE contract to upgrade the wireless infrastructure for eleven of our ERATE eligible schools. These schools are: Downer, Ford, Nystrom, Peres, Verde, Harbour Way, Helms, King, Dover, Gompers and Kennedy. ERATE did not approve the funding and consequently these schools have not yet been upgraded. Coronado (temp campus), and Valley View were folded into the contract when it was determined that the equipment could be repurposed once Bond completes these sites. In addition, it was found that antiquated switches remain at DeJean, Grant, Lake, Lincoln and Richmond despite the recent wireless infrastructure upgrade as performed by AT&T earlier this year. Twelve switches are included in the Build of materials for this reason. The total cost of the project is \$2,144,461.56.

Competitive bids were sought for the data center piece of the project. The purpose of the data center is to serve as the "head-end" for our video surveillance system and to upgrade all older servers, to include our email servers and VOIP servers. Nine-hundred (900) VOIP phones are included for the purpose of standardizing all sites on the same communication (phone) system. The total cost for this part of the project is \$1,431,082.37.

Recommendation:

Approve the NJPA contract for the procurement of wireless infrastructure and CalSave contract for the data center for the purpose of upgrading remaining sites with new switching, wireless technology and establishing a "head-end" which will support the District's video surveillance system, email servers, VOIP communications and storage.

Fiscal Impact:

\$3,575,543.93 from Measure D 2010 and Measure E 2012
