*CI C.9 Ratification and Approval of Negotiated Change Orders

Comment:

Staff is seeking ratification of Change Orders on the following current District construction projects: De Anza HS Replacement Campus. Change Orders are fully executed by the District upon signature by the Superintendent's designee. Board ratification is the final step required under state law in order to complete payment and contract adjustment.

In addition to normal ratification, approval of the noted Change Orders for the Kennedy HS Concession Stand and Lights project is required by the Board, with special findings as noted, because these projects are in excess of the Public Contract Code limit of 10% of the original contract value. In accordance with Public Contract Code 20118.4, the Board, by approving and ratifying these Change Orders, finds that it would have been futile to publicly bid the work in question because of the tight time frames to complete this work without affecting the operations of the District, and that the public is best served by having this work completed by the contractor on the project.

*CI C.10 Leadership Public Schools Gompers New Campus Project - Approval of three agreements, conditional for funding under State's Charter School Facilities Program

Comment:

- 1. Memorandum of Understanding By and Among Leadership Public Schools, Inc., West Contra Costa Unified School District, and the State of California (State Allocation Board and California School Finance Authority);
- 2. Facilities Use Agreement (by and between WCCUSD and LPS, Inc.); and,
- 3. Supplemental Agreement By and Between the West Contra Costa Unified School District and Leadership Public Schools, Inc.

Documents are available upon request from the Operations Office.

The District has received a Preliminary Apportionment under the Charter School Facilities Program for State funding of the new Leadership Public Schools ("LPS") Charter High School at the Gompers campus. In order for the Gompers project to receive funding under the Facilities Program, the District is required to complete a series of agreements with the State of California and LPS, Inc. The project has been approved for an advance release of funds for a portion of the total preliminary apportionment. The State Allocation Board has set aside proceeds from a recent state bond sale to fund this design phase apportionment which the District will use for current project costs. Each of the documents, provided under separate cover, were required to be executed and received by the state by May 2, 2012 in order to receive advance fund release. The Board is now asked to ratify these agreements to secure the funds.

D.1 The Ed. Fund's 2012 Scholarship Finalists

Comment:

Between 2005 and 2011, The Ed. Fund awarded \$524,000 to 151 scholarship winners from WCCUSD. In 2012, thanks to an outpouring of support from our donors, including the College Access Foundation of California, the Chevron Corporation, the Irvine Foundation, the Schroeder Family Fund and others, The Ed. Fund will be awarding nearly \$200,000 in scholarships, almost four times the amount awarded in 2011. The growth of our program has allowed us to increase the number of scholarships finalists from 20 in 2011 to 76 in 2012.

The 76 finalists for our scholarships hail from 9 different public high schools located in West County. A list of high schools represented and the number of scholarship finalists from each school is as follows:

DeAnza High School: 8 El Cerrito High School: 9 Hercules High School: 3 Kennedy High School: 6

Leadership Public Schools-Richmond: 16

Middle College High School: 8 Pinole Valley High School: 4 Richmond High School: 21

West County Community High School: 1

Finalists will be declared winners in July 2012 following confirmation of their eligibility and a review of their financial need. Scholarships will range from \$1,000 to \$5,000 depending on the finalist's individual need.

All Ed. Fund scholars have overcome tremendous odds to graduate near the top of their class and were chosen for their vision to succeed in college and dedication to community service. They are also involved in a wide range of extracurricular activities which have made them well-rounded individuals. The Ed. Fund believes these students will return to our community to serve as leaders and role models in West Contra Costa County.

Board PolicyUse of School Facilities

BP 1330 Community

The Governing Board recognizes that district facilities and grounds are a community resource and authorizes their use by community groups for purposes provided for in the Civic Center Act when such use does not interfere with school activities.

All school-related activities shall be given priority in the use of facilities and grounds under the Civic Center Act. Thereafter, the use shall be on a first-come, first-served basis.

The Superintendent or designee shall maintain procedures and regulations for the use of school facilities and grounds that: (Education Code 38133)

- 1. Aid, encourage, and assist groups desiring to use school facilities for approved activities
- 2. Preserve order in school buildings and on school grounds and protect school facilities, designating a person to supervise this task, if necessary
- 3. Ensure that the use of school facilities or grounds is not inconsistent with their use for school purposes and does not interfere with the regular conduct of school work

All facilities use determinations shall be made by the sSuperintendent or designee in accordance with Board policy. Facility use guidelines, regulations and procedures will be updated annually by the Superintendent or designee.

Fees

<u>In accordance with the Civic Center Act</u>, the Board may set fees not to exceed direct costs for the use of school facilities or grounds. by nonprofit organizations, clubs, or associations organized to promote youth and school activities. Qualifying Specific activities and organizations shall to be charged an amount not to exceed direct costs shall be (as outlined in Administrative Regulation 1330). Direct costs are defined as the cost of supplies, utilities, janitorial services, services of any other district employees, and salaries necessitated by the organization's use of the facilities and grounds.

Fair Rental Value

Groups that do not qualify for "direct costs" fee structure are still eligible to use school facilities and shall be charged "fair rental value" in accordance with subdivision (h) of section 38134 Cal Ed Code (as outlined in Administrative Regulation 1330). when using school facilities or grounds for entertainment or meetings where admission is charged or contributions solicited and net receipts are not to be expended for charitable purposes or for the welfare of the district's students. (Education Code 38134)

All fees for fields and other applicable outdoor use requests shall be subject to and in compliance with the West Contra Costa Unified School District, Maintenance and Recreation Assessment District (MRAD) pursuant to the Landscape and Lighting Act of 1972 and Article XIIID of the California Constitution.

Sale, Lease, Rental Of District-Owned Real Property

BP 3280

Business and Noninstructional Operations

The Governing Board believes that the district should utilize its facilities and resources in the most economical and practical manner. To that end, the Superintendent or designee shall periodically study the current and projected use of all district facilities in order to ensure the efficient utilization of space and the effective delivery of instruction.

Upon determination that district property is no longer needed or may not be needed until some future time, the Board shall offer to sell or lease district-owned real property in accordance with priorities and procedures specified in law, including, but not limited to, Education Code 17230, 17464, 17485-17500, and Government Code 54222.

When required by law, the Board shall appoint a district advisory committee to advise the Board in the development of policies and procedures governing the use or disposition of schools or school building space which is not needed for school purposes. (Education Code 17388)

Before ordering the sale or lease of any real property, the Board shall adopt a resolution by a two-thirds vote of all of its members at a regular, open meeting. The resolution shall describe the property proposed to be sold or leased in such a manner as to identify it, specify the minimum price or rental, describe the terms upon which it will be sold or leased, and specify the commission or rate, if any, which the Board will pay to a licensed real estate broker out of the minimum price or rental. The resolution shall fix a time, not less than three weeks thereafter, for a public meeting, held at the Board's regular meeting place, at which sealed proposals to purchase or lease will be received and considered. (Education Code 17466)

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that notice of the resolution of intention to sell or lease property is provided in accordance with Education Code 17469-17470.

At the public meeting specified in the resolution, the Board shall open, examine, and declare all sealed bids. Before accepting any written proposal, the Board shall call for oral bids in accordance with law. The Board may reject any and all bids, either written or oral, and withdraw the properties from sale when the Board determines that rejection is for the best public interest. (Education Code 17472, 17473)

Of the proposals submitted by responsible bidders which conform to all terms and conditions specified in the resolution of intention to sell or lease, the Board shall finally accept the highest bid, after deducting commission, if any, to be paid to a licensed real estate broker, unless the Board accepts a higher oral bid or rejects all bids. (Education Code 17472)

The final acceptance of the bid may be made either at the same meeting specified in the

resolution or at any adjourned/continued meeting of the same meeting held within 10 days. Upon acceptance of the bid, the Board may adopt a resolution of acceptance that directs the Board president, or any other Board member, to execute the deed or lease and to deliver the document upon performance and compliance by the successful bidder of all of the terms and conditions of the contract. (Education Code 17472-17478)

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that proceeds from the sale or lease with an option to purchase of district surplus property are used in accordance with law.

Gifts, Grants And Bequests

BP 3290

Business and Noninstructional Operations

The Governing Board may accept any bequest or gift of money or property on behalf of the district.

Before accepting a gift, the Board shall consider whether the gift:

- 1. Has a purpose consistent with the district's vision and philosophy.
- 2. Begins a program which the Board would be unable to continue when the donated funds are exhausted.
- 3. Entails undesirable or excessive costs.
- 4. Implies endorsement of any business or product. endorsement of any business or unduly commercialize or politicize the school environment.
- 5. Promotes the use of violence, drugs, tobacco, or alcohol or the violation of any law or district policy.

The Board shall carefully evaluate any conditions or restrictions imposed by the donor in light of district philosophy and operations. If the Board feels the district will be unable to fully satisfy the donor's conditions, the gift shall not be accepted.

Gift books and instructional materials including technology shall be accepted only if they meet regular district criteria.

All gifts, grants and bequests shall become district property. Donors are encouraged to donate all gifts to the district rather than to a particular school. At the Superintendent or designee's discretion, a gift may be used at a particular school.

The Superintendent or designee shall provide a report to the Board indicating the gifts, grants, and/or bequests received on behalf of the district. The report shall include a statement of gifts of money and an inventory of all gifts of physical assets or materials.

Background Information:

Background information:

- 1. Memorandum of Understanding By and Among Leadership Public Schools, Inc., West Contra Costa Unified School District, and the State of California (State Allocation Board and California School Finance Authority);
- 2. Facilities Use Agreement (by and between WCCUSD and LPS, Inc.); and,
- 3. Supplemental Agreement By and Between the West Contra Costa Unified School District and Leadership Public Schools, Inc.

Documents are available upon request from the Operations Office.

The District has received a Preliminary Apportionment under the Charter School Facilities Program for State funding of the new Leadership Public Schools ("LPS") Charter High School at the Gompers campus. In order for the Gompers project to receive funding under the Facilities Program, the District is required to complete a series of agreements with the State of California and LPS, Inc. The project has been approved for an advance release of funds for a portion of the total preliminary apportionment. The State Allocation Board has set aside proceeds from a recent state bond sale to fund this design phase apportionment which the District will use for current project costs. Each of the documents, provided under separate cover, were required to be executed and received by the state by May 2, 2012 in order to receive advance fund release. The Board is now asked to ratify these agreements to secure the funds.

Recommendation: Approve the three agreements.

Fiscal Impact: \$12,398,181 is the total State Funding Preliminary Allocation under the Charter School Facilities Program. (\$9,398,181 match obligation of the District and \$3,000,000 loan from the State by LPS, Inc.) This is budgeted revenue for the LPS/Gompers Project Budget.

RESOLUTION TO SUPPORT CITY OF SAN PABLO'S MEASURE Q ON THE JUNE 2012 ELECTION BALLOT

WHEREAS, on February 21, 2012, the San Pablo City Council authorized that Measure Q be placed on the June 2012 ballot due to a fiscal emergency; and

WHEREAS, if Measure Q passes, it will authorize a temporary (10-year) tiered increase in the City's sales tax. Presently, the sales tax charged for purchases made in San Pablo is 8.25%; the passage of Measure Q will increase the sales tax by 1/2-cent for 5 years (to 8.75%), the sales tax will then be reduced by 1/4-cent (to 8.5%) for the next 5 years. After 10 years, the temporary increase will be terminated, reverting back to the 8.25% rate; and

WHEREAS, the decision to place Measure Q on the local ballot followed a process in which the City's voters were surveyed about priorities, and important community members discussed priorities and debated options; and

WHEREAS, the City and the West Contra Costa Unified School District have established a partnership to both improve services to children and young people and make those services more efficient and effective; and

WHEREAS, the City provides direct services to students such as crossing guards, support for after school programs, support for the Helms Full Service Community School, and other program and services that benefit school-aged children and young people; and

WHEREAS, the money generated from the temporary increase in sales tax will be used to pay for services provided by/through the City of San Pablo to local residents, including but not limited to public safety, gang prevention, job training for residents who reside in San Pablo, and youth services; and

WHEREAS, Measure Q will protect all City services as these are vital to the preservation of public peace, health and safety of San Pablo; and

WHEREAS, there is no other place to cut. To date, the City has eliminated a \$3.3 million deficit without cutting City services; City employees, including Police, have agreed to concessions in their retirement package, caps on health benefits, and the City Council has agreed to reductions in their in-lieu medical benefits; and

WHEREAS, even with the increase, sales tax in San Pablo will be less than it was prior to July 1, 2011 when a 1% State Sales tax expired and was taken off the tax rolls; and

WHEREAS, the sales tax ordinance requires that there be Citizens' Oversight throughout the duration of the tax, annual audits and consistent community reporting on how the monies are spent; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Governing Board of the West Contra Costa Unified School District supports the City of San Pablo's Measure Q as placed on the June 2012 ballot calling for a temporary ten-year tiered sales tax increase to generate revenue to protect city services.
