*CI C.6 Waiver – Allowance of Attendance at Chavez Elementary (Form J-13 A)

Comment:

When one or more schools are closed due to an emergency a school district may request a waiver for the lost instructional minutes and day(s) of attendance. The waiver is submitted to the County Office of Education and if approved is submitted to the California Department of Education. On Friday, May 18, 2012 Chavez Elementary School was closed due to a gas leak. The school was evacuated and student attendance was not taken for the day. The waiver requests an authorization to obtain credit for the minutes and day of attendance lost due to the emergency. Instructional days and minutes are a component of the annual audit, without a waiver this day would be an audit exception. Penalties are assessed when schools do not meet the annual day and minute requirements.

*CI C.10 Approve New Job Description: After School Program Coordinator

Comment:

The After School Program (ASP) has evolved from being a self-contained program into utilization of Community Based Organizations (CBO's), which profoundly impacts the job description of the job classification providing ASP oversight, management, reporting and coordination. The title change from After School Program Manager to After School Program Coordinator accurately reflects new duties and commensurate placement on the SSA salary schedule.

*CI C.11 Ratification and Approval of Engineering Services Contracts

Comment:

Contracts have been initiated by staff using previously qualified consulting, engineering, architectural, or landscape architectural firms to assist in completion of the referenced projects. Many of the firms are already under contract and the staff initiated work may be an extension of the firm's existing contract with the District. Public contracting laws have been followed in initially qualifying and selecting these professionals.

*CI C.12 Ratification and Approval of Negotiated Change Orders

Comment:

Staff is seeking ratification of change orders on the following current District construction projects: DeAnza High School Replacement Campus and Nystrom Elementary School Multi-Purpose Room. Change orders are fully executed by the District upon signature by the Superintendent's designee. Board ratification is the final step required under state law in order to complete payment and contract adjustment.

In addition to normal ratification, approval of the noted change order for the El Cerrito High School Sports Field project is required by the Board, with special findings as noted below, because these projects are in excess of the Public Contract Code limit of 10% of the original contract value. In accordance with Public Contract Code 20118.4, the Board, by approving and ratifying these change orders, finds that it would have been futile to publicly bid the work in question because of the tight time frames to complete this work without affecting the operations of the District, and that the public is best served by having this work completed by the contractor on the project.

*CI C.13 Approval of Additional Program Management General Conditions Reimbursable Expenses

Comment:

The District has retained Seville Group (SGI) as the Program Manager for the Bond program. A portion of the Program Management contract for the firm is known as General Conditions Reimbursable expenses ("GCR's"). These are costs which the District has negotiated as a part of the contract for which the firm bills direct expense, plus markup. General Conditions Reimbursable expenses include computer software/hardware expenses, office equipment, legally required advertisements, postage, security, office supplies, and telephone/fax expense. These types of costs also include personnel such as the Facilities Operations Center Receptionists, Network Administrator, and Fiscal Controls Specialist. In addition, these costs include Cost Estimating, Scheduling, and Software Programming.

President Ramsey called the meeting back to order at 6:25 p.m.

D.1 Parcel Tax Survey

Superintendent Harter introduced Mr. Bryan Godbe, of Godbe Research, who was contracted to conduct a random sample survey regarding a possible November parcel tax measure. During the same period of time, For the Children of West County, a community political action committee, contracted with Godbe Research to conduct a separate survey regarding both a parcel tax and bond measure for the November ballot.

Mr. Godbe presented a report on the survey results and provided statistics regarding a potential November ballot measure for a bond measure, a parcel tax measure, or both. Mr. Godbe responded to questions.

Board Comment:

Mr. Thurmond asked about the phrasing of questions to those polled about support of both a parcel tax and a bond measure. Mr. Godbe responded that the questions were asked by two distinct questions for each ballot measure. Mr. Thurmond continued with questions about methodology in asking about multiple measures. Mr. Godbe responded that the survey questions did not reference the community college of soda tax measures, but did reference the State wide ballot measures.

Mr. Medrano asked whether the survey explained the purpose of bond and parcel tax measures. Mr. Godbe responded that the survey language referenced both measures as programs and projects for the District.

President Ramsey asked why the senior citizen exemption from the first measure was excluded from Survey One and included on Survey Two. Mr. Godbe responded that only the parcel tax measure contained a senior exemption.

Mr. Thurmond asked clarification of Mr. Godbe's statement regarding data not be extended to include a bond and a parcel tax renewal with an additional 3¢ per square foot. Mr. Godbe responded

President Ramsey confirmed that \$360 million was requested for the bond measure initiative for a ten year program.

Ms. Merriweather had questions about how the survey was completed for two different areas. Mr. Godbe explained random sampling into demographic subgroups including the entire district with age, gender, and other factors. Survey Two looked into a 2013 ballot measure.

Ms. Kronenberg commented that Mr. Godbe's margin of error has always been correct.

Ms. Merriweather suggested that the bond measure to be placed on the March 2013 election ballot. President Ramsey responded that bond measures can only be on general election ballots. If the district didn't seek a bond measure in November 2012, the next opportunity would be in 2014.

Mr. Thurmond commented on the poor state of the economy and that citizens have been generous. At the current state level of funding the district needs to ask citizens for their support in both bond and parcel tax measures on the ballot for November 2012.

Mr. Thurmond asked Mr. Godbe when funds would be received from a parcel tax measure. Mr. Godbe responded that it depended on the fiscal year. If the parcel tax passed by the end of the fiscal year, it would be on the tax roll of the next fiscal year.

MOTION: Ms. Kronenberg moved approval of a \$360 million Bond Measure and a Parcel Tax Renewal Measure for 5 Years with no increase. Mr. Medrano seconded. Ms. Kronenberg, Mr. Medrano, Ms. Merriweather, Mr. Thurmond and President Ramsey voted yes with no abstentions and no absences. Motion carried 5-0-0-0.

President Ramsey asked clarification of statement on page B-3 "as well as the refinancing of outstanding general obligation bond debt of the District." Mr. Olsen responded that this would make sure for old programs that were built in a time of a better economy and pushed payments to the back are able to remain within their tax rate targets over the long term. This will allow the District to spend the new bond monies to pay down the tax rate, so it keeps the District's commitments to voters from when they voted on past elections.

President Ramsey asked where the debt limit waiver is located in the resolution. Mr. Heuer responded it is located on the bottom section of page B-4.

Mr. Thurmond asked what the future interest rates would be for the measures. Mr. Olsen responded that while interest rates vary with the market, the assumption that underlies the projection is a conservative 5-3/4% interest rate. Mr. Thurmond said it is important for the public to know the District's intent to rebuild Grant, Lake, Collins, Shannon and Olinda Elementary Schools, as well as Crespi Middle and Kennedy High School.
