*CI C.6 Resolution No. 22-1213: Adoption of Gann Limit, 2012-2013

Comment:

Education Code Section 42132 specifies that school district governing boards shall adopt a resolution identifying their annual appropriations limit for the preceding fiscal year, known as the Gann Limit. The Gann Limit Calculation is part of the year end closing, unaudited actuals, reports submitted under separate cover. It establishes limits on allowable growth in government spending.

*CI C.7 Mandated Cost Block Grant

Comment:

As a part of the 2012-13 State Budget the legislature enacted an option for school districts regarding certain mandated activities and the financial claims that districts have traditionally filed for reimbursement. The optional mandated block grant (MBG) enables districts to access funding at the rate of an estimated \$28 per pupil for the 2012-13 fiscal year if the district is willing to forgo the traditional claim process. The MBG would provide an estimated \$772,000 in funding which would be received this year. In contrast, the District normally claims an average of \$1.5 million per year in mandated costs. However, the State has only funded an average of 7% or \$105,000 over the course of the past four years. Technically, the State still owes the District for the remaining unpaid claims but there is no meaningful plan to issue funding in the current budget except for the MBG option. Using the MBG option does not free the District from maintaining auditable records for the mandates, in addition there is one major mandate that is outside of the MBG that the District needs to continue to file. Therefore the District still needs to retain the firm that provides audit and claim service.

Opting for the MBG means the District would have the advantage of the funding provided in real time, as opposed to double the funding sometime in the unforeseeable future. The District has the option to opt in or out of the MBG program on an annual basis.

*CI C.11 Revised 2012-2013 Designation of California Interscholastic Federation (CIF) Representatives to the League

Comment:

The California Interscholastic Federation annually requires the governing board to appoint district representatives. Ed. Code 33353 (a) (1) gives the governing boards of school districts specific authority to select their athletic league representatives.

Contracts have been initiated by staff using previously qualified consulting, engineering, architectural, or landscape architectural firms to assist in completion of the referenced projects. Many of the firms are already under contract and the staff-initiated work may be an extension of the firm's existing contract with the District. Public contracting laws have been followed in initially qualifying and selecting these professionals.

*CI C.13 Ratification and Approval of Negotiated Change Orders

Comment:

Staff is seeking ratification of change orders on the following current District construction projects: New Gompers & LPS Richmond Schools, Peres Elementary School Dental Clinic, Dover Elementary School, and Ohlone Elementary School Phase I Campus Replacement. Change orders are fully executed by the District upon signature by the Superintendent's designee. Board ratification is the final step required under state law in order to complete payment and contract adjustment.

In accordance with Public Contract Code 20118.4, the Board, by ratifying these change orders, finds that it would have been futile to publicly bid the work in question because of the tight time frames to complete this work without affecting the operations of the District, and that the public is best served by having this work completed by the contractor on the project.

*CI C.14 Approval of Pinole Valley High School Replacement Campus Revised Design Fees

Comment

Pinole Valley High School Campus Replacement is one of the listed projects in Measure D-2010 Bond. The project was initiated with a typical scope of site and environmental conditions for a high school campus replacement. However, extensive and comprehensive traffic, site access, seismic, and geotechnical issues have required substantial coordination and design modifications by WLC and its consultants. The \$2,858,589 fee that addresses the additional scope will be achieved by reducing and eliminating construction administration services during the construction of the new campus, sports fields, parking, and courts restoration, phases III and V.

Recommendation:

Approve proposed Pinole Valley High School Replacement Campus Revised Contract Scope. The architect will submit an additional service proposal for the deleted scope at the time of construction.

Motion carried 4-0-1-0.

D. AWARDS, RECOGNITIONS, AND REPORTS

D.1 Report on the Efforts by West Contra Costa Unified School District on a) K-8, b) Summer Learning, and c) Enrichment/Internships

Ms. Rashidchi introduced Liz Torio who provided a report on the summer extended learning elementary program at Downer, Peres, Montalvin, Verde, Nystrom, Riverside, Stege, Tara Hills and Fairmont schools. More than 2,000 students were served during the 19 days of instruction of English Language Arts, Mathematics, English Language Development, and Academic Language Development. The enrichment providers were Destiny Arts, East Bay Center for Performing Arts, Mad Science, and Museum of Children's Art.

Pat Martin spoke about the Juan Crespi Middle High School summer program for grades 7-12. The program included credit recovery, independent study and cyber high. The high school program graduated nearly 100 students at the end of the summer program.

Kibby Kleiman reported on the Richmond High summer school program. The program benefited students by offering cyber high independent study credit recovery and programs for supplemental and support classes for rising 9th graders as well as SAT preparatory classes. Advanced Placement support classes were offered for the first time. California High school Exit Exam preparation was also offered for multiple grade levels as well as intervention for rising 9th graders who were given programs in study skills and integrating with the high school campus.

Philip Gonsalves provided a Mathematics Achievement Academy (MAA) summer program report. He spoke of California State University East Bay and Chevron as funders, as well as additional funding from the Lesher Foundation for 2012-2014. He spoke of the success of the ten sections of Algebra I, Geometry and Algebra II offered at Crespi, Helms, Portola and Stewart schools serving 203 students.

Finy Prak reported on various high school student programs, including Junior Achievement, UC Berkeley Summer Bridge, Academy of Art Pre-College Program, Holy Names Summer Bridge Program, Summer Legal Fellowship Program, Health Academy Summer Intern Program, STEM Contra Costa Economic Partnership through Chevron, Ivy League Connection, and the WCCUSD Summer School program. Over 2,000 students were able to participate in these summer enrichment programs. Ms. Prak introduced students who shared their experiences: Iris Wong, DeAnza junior; Hannah Lee Pablo, Pinole Valley junior; and Sayetsi Sanchez, Richmond High senior.

Ms. Merriweather had questions about the elementary summer program. Ms. Torio responded with information about the students from the Youth Works program participating in classes and as needed at the seven elementary schools. Ms. Merriweather also asked about the high school programs for 8th graders. Mr. Kibby responded with information about a program for students currently at grade level as well as an intervention program for students needing study skills and an introduction to high school. Twenty-five were served.

Mr. Medrano asked about the summer extended learning mathematics and about the kindergarten level learning. Ms. Torio responded. He also had questions about Crespi's enrollment and the loss of students in the 7th and 8th grades over the course of the program. Mr. Martin responded with information about the kinds of contacts made to homes in effort to retain students. Mr. Medrano continued by asking about data to follow the students who participated in these programs to determine success. Mr. Greer responded that the goal was to provide necessary interventions to engage students and keep them active in school toward graduation. Mr. Medrano had further questions about high school math. Mr. Kleiman responded.

Mr. Thurmond had questions about the Mathematics Achievement Academy and participation at DeJean Middle School. Mr. Gonsalves responded. Mr. Greer spoke about the selection of summer school sites. Mr. Thurmond offered congratulations to the students and teachers who participated.

Ms. Kronenberg asked Ms. Torio about the elementary summer school comparisons with last year's program. Ms. Torio spoke about the children's enjoyment of the enrichment programs and the balance with academics. Mr. Kleiman spoke about teacher feedback regarding students getting ahead as well as picking up new skills. He felt this made a difference in the mood around the campus throughout the program.

President Ramsey asked the Ivy League Connection students about their experiences and what they can do to bring awareness to their own high school campus. The young ladies shared strategies about sharing their experiences with other students.

D.2 Report on the partnership with West Contra Costa Public Education Fund (The Ed Fund) and West Contra Costa Unified School District to lead a district-wide commitment to increase college access services and improve alignment of services to support the District's reform strategy, College and Career Readiness

Mr. Greer introduced Executive Director Joel Mackey and Program Director Robert Bunce of The Ed Fund and the challenge to create a college going culture in the District. They announced that The Ed Fund is the recipient of a grant of \$400,000 from the College Access Foundation to be used to serve students and promote a college going culture. Their goal is to increase the number of students who complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and provide financial aid advising and support. Studies show that students who complete the FAFSA are more likely to go on to college. The second strategy is to provide students with the counseling support needed to succeed. And lastly scholarships provided to students will continue to be a high priority with support from funders. The grant will also enable The Ed Fund to build the College Access Network to accomplish those goals. Mr. Bunce spoke about providing every student with the opportunity to get to college.

Mr. Medrano asked about students who don't have necessary immigration papers. Mr. Bunce spoke about assisting undocumented students in completing the DREAM Act application. Mr. Bunce further spoke about the upcoming Getting Ready for College Conference.

Mr. Thurmond offered congratulations for receiving the grant. He also spoke about the great work The Ed Fund does. He continued with questions about staffing at the campus centers. Mr. Mackey responded that their plan is to approach member community based organizations to supplement funding.

President Ramsey asked that Item E.2 WCCUSD Public Comment be moved up on the agenda to accommodate members of the audience.

MOTION: Mr. Thurmond moved approval of moving item E.2 WCCUSD Public Comment up on the agenda. Mr. Medrano seconded. Ms. Kronenberg, Mr. Medrano, Ms. Merriweather, Mr. Thurmond, Student Board Representative Alexander Hale (advisory vote only) and President Ramsey voted yes, with no abstentions and no absences. Motion carried 5-0-0-0.

RESOLUTION FOR ADOPTING THE "GANN" LIMIT

SEPTEMBER 19, 2012

WHEREAS, in November of 1979, the California electorate did adopt Proposition 4, commonly called the Gann Amendment, which added Article XIII-B to the California Constitution; and,

WHEREAS, the provisions of that Article establish maximum appropriation limitations, commonly called "Gann Limits", for public agencies, including school districts; and,

WHEREAS, the District must establish a revised Gann limit for the 2011-12 fiscal year and a projected Gann Limit for the 2012-13 fiscal year in accordance with the provisions of Article XIII-B and applicable statutory law;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that this Board does provide public notice that the attached calculations and documentation of the Gann limits for the 2011-12 and 2012-13 fiscal years are made in accord with applicable constitutional and statutory law;

Background Information:

As a part of the 2012-13 State Budget the legislature enacted an option for school districts regarding certain mandated activities and the financial claims that districts have traditionally filed for reimbursement. The optional mandated block grant (MBG) enables districts to access funding at the rate of an estimated \$28 per pupil for the 2012-13 fiscal year if the district is willing to forgo the traditional claim process. The MBG would provide an estimated \$772,000 in funding which would be received this year. In contrast, the District normally claims an average of \$1.5 million per year in mandated costs. However, the State has only funded an average of 7% or \$105,000 over the course of the past four years. Technically, the State still owes the District for the remaining unpaid claims but there is no meaningful plan to issue funding in the current budget except for the MBG option. Using the MBG option does not free the District from maintaining auditable records for the mandates, in addition there is one major mandate that is outside of the MBG that the District needs to continue to file. Therefore the District still needs to retain the firm that provides audit and claim service.

Opting for the MBG means the District would have the advantage of the funding provided in real time, as opposed to double the funding sometime in the unforeseeable future. The District has the option to opt in or out of the MBG program on an annual basis.

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION, WEST CONTRA COSTA UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT IN SUPPORT OF CONTRA COSTA COUNTY FIRE PROTECTION MEASURE O

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the Contra Costa County Fire Protection District (the "District") has determined that it is in the best interests of the District's citizens to prevent significant service cutbacks and provide the appropriate level of fire protection and emergency medical services for the community; and

WHEREAS, the amount of revenue available to the District from property taxes is inadequate to meet the cost of maintaining adequate levels of fire protection and emergency services; and

WHEREAS, a special tax is necessary for public protection and public safety in order to assist in meeting the costs of providing these services; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors proposes to establish a levy of a parcel tax upon parcels of land within the District for the purpose of providing fire protection and emergency services and to ensure prompt response times for 9-1-1 emergency calls; and,

WHEREAS, if approved by two-thirds of the votes voting on it, the ordinance will establish an annual parcel tax of \$75 per single family home, with tiered rates for commercial and industrial property, for seven years and concurrently raise the annual appropriations limit of the District to allow the District to expend the amount raised by the tax; and

WHEREAS, the Contra Costa County Fire Protection District has demonstrated the need for additional resources to provide fire protection to community residents and the schools in the area; and

WHEREAS, the Contra Costa County Fire Protection District is facing a severe financial shortfall that will impact the quality of life to all residents as well as children and young people in the area; and

NOW, BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED, that the West Contra Costa School District Board of Education supports and endorses the Contra Costa County Fire Protection Measure Q as placed on the November 2012 ballot calling to establish an annual parcel tax to generate revenue to provide fire protection and emergency medical services and ensure prompt response times for 9-1-1 emergency calls.

Subject: Full Service Community Schools Resolution

Background Information:

The West Contra Costa Unified School District envisions a future in which all district students are healthy, highly educated and confident as they successfully pursue their postsecondary education and/or career. The Safety Committee has worked in collaboration with the City of San Pablo to improve the Health/Wellness, access and outcomes for WCCUSD students and San Pablo residents. Over the past two years, the Healthy Richmond collaborative has been meeting to think through how to best provide health and wellness services in Richmond. As with other initiatives within the community, WCCUSD schools are seen as places where the needs of young people and opportunities to provide services in the community can come together. The Safety Committee has reviewed and discussed the direction of the full service community schools initiatives and is bringing a recommendation to the Board for adopting such a resolution. The resolution emphasizes creating schools to develop sets of general principles to guide their work and the work of WCCUSD in implementing Full Service Schools.

WEST CONTRA COSTA UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT PROPOSED RESOLUTION

WHEREAS the Board of Education is committed to the following goals:

- Student achievement
- Accountability
- Stewardship
- Safety
- Equity
- Community engagement

WHEREAS the West Contra Costa Unified School District ("WCCUSD") envisions a future in which ALL district students are healthy, highly educated and confident as they successfully pursue their postsecondary education and/or career;

WHEREAS many of the students of WCCUSD confront barriers to achieving this vision, including poverty, immigration/citizenship status, exposure to violence, homelessness, lack of health care access, racism, language and cultural barriers, negative peer pressure, and lack of accurate information and support for college and career;

WHEREAS there are many public and philanthropic organizations committed to eradicating poverty and other barriers to the success of children, youth and families;

WHEREAS there is ample evidence that Full Service Community Schools ("FSCS") provide the comprehensive, coordinated, holistic and integrated services that are necessary to build on the assets and strengths of our children, youth, families and communities while effectively removing barriers to wellbeing and academic/career success;

WHEREAS FSCS effectively support the following conditions for student and family success:

- Early childhood development programs that nurture learning and development
- Qualified teachers, challenging curriculum, high standards, and high expectations in every school and every classroom
- Students are motivated and engaged
- Physical, social, and emotional needs are met for youth and families
- Collaboration and respect characterize the relationship between families and schools staff
- Community is engaged with the school

WHEREAS achieving these conditions for learning requires districts and their public, nonprofit and community partners to fundamentally shift their practices, breaking down internal and external programmatic silos and shifting policies to create comprehensive and integrated services that support children and youth to be physically and emotionally healthy, academically successful, and responsible members of their community;

WHEREAS Full Service Community Schools are built on evidence-based practices in youth development, Preschool to higher education, community development, preventive health and family support in order to ensure optimal outcomes for children, youth and families;

THEREFORE, WCCUSD hereby resolves to create the policy and practice environment in the district that supports collaboration with county, city, community based and faith based organizations, and effective implementation of the Full Service Community Schools approach in the District, with the ultimate goal of becoming a Full Service Community Schools District that supports all children and families to be successful by:

- Working closely with Contra Costa County, West County Cities, higher education, and other backbone agencies to create an inclusive governance process that informs institutional policies and practices across the entire service spectrum;
- Developing a long term strategic plan that establishes the road map for transformation into a Full Service Community School District;
- ♦ Utilizing the Office of the Associate Superintendent K-12 Operations / or community partners to support deep and effective community partnerships that honor the primary role of parents in the education and guidance of their children;
- Creating shared governance approaches that empower students, parents/caregivers and community to provide guidance and support for the FSCS strategy and to collectively share the goals and outcomes being sought by WCCUSD;
- Creating and funding an Director of Student Support Services that works to integrate the wide variety of student and family support services across the district;
- Promoting and supporting effective strategies within the Full Service Community School linkages of school and community resources and alignment of those resources with student learning and the identified needs of students and families.
- Building on and honoring the early adopter(s) Full Service Community School efforts already underway in WCCUSD;
- Increasing collaboration and mutually accountable partnerships with community based organizations, public agencies, the business community, institutions of higher learning, and faith based organizations that are dedicated to effective services and supports for children, youth and families;
- Working with partners to make WCCUSD facilities and resources available to become community service hubs that operate during the school day and out-of-school time in a manner that is responsible and sustainable;
- Working effectively with partners to develop data sharing agreements that protect the confidentiality of students and families while ensuring effective and efficient delivery of needed services and supports;
- Supporting and encouraging longitudinal strategies that ensure that all students are known as unique individuals by caring adults and receive the encouragement and support from WCCSUD and its partners to attend school regularly and be successful in transitioning from grade to grade and across the grade span;
- Provide district staff, principals, teachers and other school staff with the professional development, supervision and professional learning communities that reduce staff turnover, ensure high quality instruction in every classroom, with special emphasis on achieving equity for traditionally underserved students in low-income schools.
