*CI C.18 NCLB Supplemental Educational Services (SES) Tutoring Contracts

Comment:

The No Child Left Behind (NCLB) Act of 2001 requires school districts to set aside an amount equivalent to 20% of the Title I entitlement for the purposes of providing Transportation for Choice and Supplemental Educational Services (SES). In WCCUSD 20% of the entitlement is \$1,559,201. Of this amount, \$70,000 is needed for Transportation for Choice leaving \$1,489,201 available for SES tutoring.

Federal guidance regarding Supplemental Educational Services was released on January 14, 2009. The guidance specifies the roles and responsibilities of the U.S. Department of Education, the State Board of Education and the Local Educational Agency. The guidance has been used to inform the implementation of this initiative in WCCUSD. Each year the Department of Education sets the official per pupil allotment (PPA) for each district, which represents the maximum amount to be expended per participant. The official rate for 2012-13 is \$1,269.58 per student; therefore, approximately 1,172 eligible students may be served.

Parent/guardians of all students participating in the free and reduced lunch program at the 25 Title I schools in year 2 and beyond of NCLB Program Improvement were informed of the opportunity to receive these tutoring services. An informational catalog and application were created in English and Spanish with descriptions of the programs offered by the State-approved providers. These materials were mailed to all eligible families in August. In addition, catalogs are available in the front office of all participating schools. Furthermore, many of the participating schools hosted provider fairs for their school communities.

*CI C.21 Ratification and Approval of Negotiated Change Orders

Comment:

Staff is seeking ratification of Change Orders on the following current District construction projects: Coronado ES Interim Housing, Kennedy HS ADA Upgrades, Collins ES Fire Alarm, De Anza HS Replacement Campus, Nystrom ES Interim Housing/Site Package, and Pinole MS MPR Audio-Visual. Change Orders are fully executed by the District upon signature by the Superintendent's designee. Board ratification is the final step required under state law in order to complete payment and contract adjustment.

In addition to normal ratification, approval of the noted Change Orders for the Coronado ES Interim Housing, Nystrom ES Interim Housing/Site Package and Pinole MS MPR Audio-Visual projects is required by the Board, with special findings as noted, because these projects are in excess of the Public Contract Code limit of 10% of the original contract value. In accordance with Public Contract Code 20118.4, the Board, by approving and ratifying these Change Orders, finds that it would have been futile to publicly bid the work in question because of the tight time frames to complete this work without affecting the operations of the District, and that the public is best served by having this work completed by the contractor on the project.

*CI C.22 Ratification of Staff Awarded Contract: Coronado Elementary School Reconstruction Demolition Project

Comment:

WLC Architects, Inc. has prepared plans and specifications for the project. Scope of work includes demolition of the existing campus buildings, walkways, fencing, walls, concrete stairways, selective salvage and inventory of selected windows, doors, frames and hardware as identified in the plans and specifications. Work also includes hazardous material abatement and site grading.

The District received nine bids for the project: Wreck Age Demolition, Inc., \$403,955; Cleveland Wrecking Company (non-responsive), \$453,500; Applied Water Resources Company, \$464,500; Joseph J. Albanese, Inc., \$462,710; S&H Construction, Inc., \$552,300; Evans Brothers, Inc., \$493,700; Vila Construction Co., \$505,261; PARC Services, Inc., \$526,668; and Cal-Pacific Construction, Inc., \$703,390.

In consideration of the need to complete the work expeditiously, the Superintendent's designee authorized award of a contract for the project to the lowest responsive, responsible bidder: Wreck Age Demolition, Inc. for \$403,955.

The Education Code requires the Board to ratify this award action by the Superintendent's designee.

*CI C.23 Ratification of Staff Awarded Contract: Pinole Middle School Security Raceway Infrastructure Project

Comment:

Security by Design has prepared plans and specifications for the project. Scope of work includes provision and installation of conduit, junction boxes, pull strings, labels and miscellaneous parts to create a raceway infrastructure for future security installation of access control, video, and alarm systems.

The District received four bids for the project: AM Woo Construction, \$96,900; Arthulia, Inc., \$106,000; ERA Construction, \$107,500; and B-Side, Inc., \$110,000.

In consideration of the need to complete the work expeditiously, the Superintendent's designee authorized award of a contract for the project to the lowest responsive, responsible bidder: AM Woo Construction for \$96,900.

Fund Grants program affects the lives of nearly 10,000 students.

WCCUSD Board of Education Meeting Agenda – November 14, 2012

This year The Ed. Fund awarded \$35,000 in grant money to 48 amazing projects destined to ignite imagination and create change in our schools. The Ed. Fund was able to award grants to 27 different schools throughout the District. This is by far the most diverse set of awardees we have had in terms of the distribution of grants to different schools.

Mr. Medrano asked for clarification of the Restorative Justice, BEST, and ToolBox programs used for character building by various school sites. Mr. Collins and Ms. Rashidchi clarified.

Mr. Thurmond offered congratulations and remarked about setting high expectations and providing resources to meet those expectations. He said he would like to hear what schools do to assist students who need additional help. Ms. Rashidchi responded with information about the 31 afterschool tutoring programs and supplemental afterschool programs. He further asked about the component of teacher training. Mr. Medrano commented on Montalvin Principal Wendy Forrest and her contract to dye her hair blue once students achieved their improvement goals.

- Adoption and effective date of amendment. This amendment of the 403(b) Plan Adoption Agreement is intended as a good faith effort to comply with the Internal Revenue Code 403(b) written plan procedures requirement. The amendment shall be effective as of the date indicated below.
- 1.2 <u>Employer's Election.</u> As of the effective date, the Employer adopts the provisions as elected under Article II. These provisions will remain in effect until a document incorporating the provisions of this amendment is adopted or the provisions become obsolete.
- 1.3 <u>Supersession of inconsistent provisions.</u> This amendment shall supersede the provisions of the Plan Adoption Agreement to the extent those provisions are inconsistent with the provisions of this amendment.

Effective Date. The Effective Date of these amendments are the 1st day of March, 2012.

- 4.a. <u>Eligible Plan Contributions</u>. The Plan permits Roth (after-tax) 403(b) contributions are allowed by all eligible employees in addition to pre-tax elective deferrals which are also permitted. Subject: NCLB Supplemental Educational Services (SES) Tutoring Contracts

Background Information:

The No Child Left Behind (NCLB) Act of 2001 requires school districts to set aside an amount equivalent to 20% of the Title I entitlement for the purposes of providing Transportation for Choice and Supplemental Educational Services (SES). In WCCUSD 20% of the entitlement is \$1,559,201. Of this amount, \$70,000 is needed for Transportation for Choice leaving \$1,489,201 available for SES tutoring.

Federal guidance regarding Supplemental Educational Services was released on January 14, 2009. The guidance specifies the roles and responsibilities of the U.S. Department of Education, the State Board of Education and the Local Educational Agency. The guidance has been used to inform the implementation of this initiative in WCCUSD. Each year the Department of Education sets the official per pupil allotment (PPA) for each district, which represents the maximum amount to be expended per participant. The official rate for 2012-13 is \$1,269.58 per student; therefore, approximately 1,172 eligible students may be served.

Parent/guardians of all students participating in the free and reduced lunch program at the 25 Title I schools in year 2 and beyond of NCLB Program Improvement were informed of the opportunity to receive these tutoring services. An informational catalog and application were created in English and Spanish with descriptions of the programs offered by the State-approved providers. These materials were mailed to all eligible families in August. In addition, catalogs are available in the front office of all participating schools. Furthermore, many of the participating schools hosted provider fairs for their school communities.

Permission is requested of the Board of Education to approve contracts between the District and named State-approved SES providers per parental choice for the period of November 26, 2012 through June 30, 2013 per the attached list.
