The Director, Community Engagement will play an instrumental role in fostering community partnerships to develop a full service community school district. This position also will create, develop and coordinate community and district resources to engage families in the educational process such that all students have equitable opportunities for learning and are prepared for post K-12 success. This position follows WCCUSD Strategic Plan.

Ultimately, this position will make it substantially easier for community partners (businesses, families, and parents) to work with the district such that the district can clearly communicate with and develop relationships with its community.

*CI C.9 2014-2015 Salary Schedules, as of July 1, 2014, for the following groups: UTR Local One SSA Confidential Management WCCAA

Comment:

These salary schedules are the result of the union ratified and Board adopted agreements. We are requesting the Board enter them into the record. Recent CalPers and STRS audits experienced by other districts indicate that placing these schedules into the permanent Board record will assist staff and future retirees when salary schedules are needed for review.

These salary schedules reflect the new salary increments, which were effective on July 1, 2014 to all bargaining units, unrepresented management, and confidential employees. The salary schedules also reflect the complexity of each bargaining unit agreement, along with the different classifications, days worked, and uniqueness of each bargaining unit.

*CI C.10 2014-15 Consolidated Application for Funding

Comment:

The Consolidated Application is the vehicle used by the California Department of Education to gather routine district data regarding categorical programs and compliance with NCLB requirements.

The Consolidated Application includes basic information about student demographics which is used to report and calculate state and federal allocations for Title I, Title II, Title III, Title III – Immigrant, and Economic Impact Aid (EIA) for Limited English Proficient.

*CI C.11 Data and Wireless for Pinole Valley High School

Comment:

The District prepared plans and specifications for the technology equipment and services project for the Pinole Valley High School site located at 2900 Pinole Valley Rd., Pinole, CA 94564. The scope of work included providing and configuring switches, VoIP phones, mounting wireless access points and "rack and stack" services ("Project").

The District solicited competitive bids for the Project. The Request For Proposals (RFP) for the Project was advertised on June 9, 2014 and closed June 24, 2014. Three firms submitted bids. NWN was deemed unresponsive because it failed to include SmartNet Maintenance and failed to specify labor costs as

specified in the RFP. AEKO Consulting submitted a bid for \$636,762.54. PTI submitted a bid for \$484,585.34.

Based on District staff's evaluation of the bids received, it was determined that the lowest responsive, responsible bid was from PTI.

<u>Recommendation</u>: Ratify the award to the lowest responsive, responsible bidder: PTI

<u>Fiscal Impact</u>: \$484,585.34. Funded from Bond Funds.

*CI C.12 Ratification and Approval of Engineering Services Contracts

Comment:

Contracts have been initiated by staff using previously qualified consulting, engineering, architectural, or landscape architectural firms to assist in completion of the referenced projects. Many of the firms are already under contract and the staff-initiated work may be an extension of the firm's existing contract with the District. Public contracting laws have been followed in initially qualifying and selecting these professionals.

<u>Recommendation</u>: Ratify and approve contracts

<u>Fiscal Impact</u>: Total for this action: \$2,053,959. Funding sources are Bond Fund.

*CI C.13 Approval of Negotiated Change Orders

Comment:

Staff is seeking approval of Change Orders on the following current District construction projects: Coronado ES New School; Helms MS Sports Field & Landscaping. Change Orders are fully executed by the District upon signature by the Superintendent's designee. Board approval is the final step required under state law in order to complete payment and contract adjustment.

In accordance with Public Contract Code 20118.4, the Board, by approving these Change Orders, finds that it would have been futile to publicly bid the work in question because of the tight time frames to complete this work without affecting the operations of the District, and that the public is best served by having this work completed by the contractor on the project.

<u>Recommendation</u>: Approve negotiated Change Orders as noted

<u>Fiscal Impact</u>: Total approval by this action: \$76,900.87

*CI C.14 Ratification of Staff Awarded Contract: Nystrom Elementary School Modernization Project

Comment:

Interactive Resources has prepared plans and specifications for the project. Scope of work includes: the modernization of an existing main classroom building, including selective demolition and abatement of existing exterior wood siding, wood trim, molding and reconstruction of the addition connecting the two existing wood framed buildings including but not limited to new concrete slab; new flooring, doors, frames, hardware; new mechanical, plumbing, electrical and low-voltage systems/equipment; in addition to related site work, ac paving, parking improvements, striping, concrete curbs, landscaping, sod playfield and playground equipment/improvements. Also included in this scope is replacement of the fire alarm system in the existing multi-purpose building with a new fire alarm system and demolition of selected temporary structures.

The District will conduct a public bid process for the project. Bids will be opened on July 8, 2014. Total bid is the sum of base bid and unit pricing.

Determining the award is based on two components; the lump sum base bid and unit cost multiplied by quantities to be determined in the field. This benefits the District by locking in unit pricing to be used in negotiating future change orders. The contract award is only associated with the lump sum base bid.

<u>Recommendation</u>: Ratify the award to the lowest responsive, responsible bidder at the expiration of the bid protest period.

Fiscal Impact: Funded from Bond Fund

*CI C.15 Ratification of Staff Awarded Contract: Ohlone Elementary School Playground & Parking Lot Completion Project

Comment:

Powell & Partners Architects has prepared plans and specifications for the project. Scope of work includes: selective demolition and construction necessary for the Ohlone Elementary School Hardscape Play Area including associated civil, architectural, structural and electrical work as indicated in the Drawings and Specifications. Work in this Contract comprises general construction necessary for the site preparation for new asphalt and concrete paving for completion of the existing parking lot, coating and striping for completion of paving for the existing play area, underground utilities (electrical conduits, storm and fire water), new site lighting, landscaping including concrete planter boxes, irrigation, fencing, a new play structure, a new fire hydrant and In addition the contractor shall provide all electrical and civil installations as shown on the drawings and in the specifications.

The District conducted a public bid process for the project. Bids were opened on July 1st, 2014. Four contractors submitted bids, CWS Construction \$699,000; Maggiora & Ghilotti, Inc. \$794,497; BHM Construction, Inc. \$878,300; WR Forde Associates \$957,000. The apparent lowest responsive, responsible bidder is CWS Construction.

Recommendation:

Ratify the award to the lowest responsive, responsible bidder at the expiration of the bid protest period.

Fiscal Impact: Funded from Bond Fund.

At the April 23, 2014 meeting, Mr. James Ghidella, at the request of President Ramsey, spoke to the Board during public comment to suggest that the Board consider renaming Portola Middle as the Fred Korematsu Middle School. Mr. Ghidella, a 1964 graduate of El Cerrito High School, provided an extensive rationale for the honoring the remembrance of Fred Korematsu. President Ramsey appointed Madeline Kronenberg and Randy Enos as committee members to consider the possibility of renaming Portola in honor of Fred Korematsu. When Ms. Kronenberg was unable to serve, Mr. Ramsey assigned himself to serve on the committee and named Mr. Ghidella as chair.

The committee conducted four public hearings:

- June 17: Fairmont Elementary School
- June 26: Harding Elementary School
- July 1: Stege Elementary School

Each of the meetings was well attended. Additionally, a postcard was mailed to all in the Portola attendance area and Connect Ed (autodailer) messages were sent to families of current and future students.

At the end of the July 1 public hearing, the committee voted unanimously to recommend that Portola be renamed as Fred T. Korematsu Middle School.

Background Information:

Interactive Resources has prepared plans and specifications for the project. Scope of work includes: the modernization of an existing main classroom building, including selective demolition and abatement of existing exterior wood siding, wood trim, molding and reconstruction of the addition connecting the two existing wood framed buildings including but not limited to new concrete slab; new flooring, doors, frames, hardware; new mechanical, plumbing, electrical and low-voltage systems/equipment; in addition to related site work, ac paving, parking improvements, striping, concrete curbs, landscaping, sod playfield and playground equipment/improvements. Also included in this scope is replacement of the fire alarm system in the existing multi-purpose building with a new fire alarm system and demolition of selected temporary structures.

The District will conduct a public bid process for the project. Bids will be opened on July 8th, 2014. Total bid is the sum of base bid and unit pricing.

Determining the award is based on two components; the lump sum base bid and unit cost multiplied by quantities to be determined in the field. 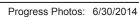
