





WCCUSD's Guidelines to Reopening Schools

State Color	Status and Restrictions
	Widespread Many non-essential indoor business operations are closed
	Substantial Some non-essential indoor business operations are closed
	Moderate Some indoor business operations are open with modifications
	Minimal Most indoor business operations are open with modifications

To the left is the State Color Reopening Chart. Schools can reopen after being in the Red for 14 consecutive days. However, WCCUSD is not reopening until Contra Costa County is in Orange and all zip codes within the District are also in Orange.

Once the county moves to Orange, the District criteria also requires that the counties surrounding Contra Costa must also be in compliance with the District policy to consider reopening.

The guidelines are as follows:

 **3% OR LESS**
PERCENTAGE OF POSITIVE TESTS

The percentage of positive tests must be 3% or less by Zip Code in West Contra Costa County and surrounding counties where our employees live.

THE 21 DAY COUNTDOWN

Once all groups enter the Orange tier, the twenty-one day count down would start prior to any consideration and would need to remain in place without any surges. The twenty-one day criteria would need to be met before the possible reopening discussions would begin.

REOPEN SCENARIOS

Once all of the above criteria have been met the District would begin the process of possible reopening scenarios. It should be noted, that the District facilities will not allow for appropriate social distancing being implemented for 100% of students to attend school in-person simultaneously and would not be possible until the State enters the green tier and removes these requirements.
