Special Education Information System (SEIS) – Steve Collins

SEIS is the Special Education Department's online management system of Individual Education Programs (IEPs) and Special Education records. We now offer on-going trainings and refresher courses for teachers throughout the year on designated Saturdays. Included in this Friday Memo are pictures of the Saturday, October 28 training that was held at Pupil Services Center.

Background on SEIS:

SEIS provides centralized online management of IEPs and Special Education records.

Teachers and Service Providers can edit IEP forms at any time, from any device with internet access. The IEP forms are pre-populated with information from the SEIS Student Record, eliminating repetitive data entry. SEIS has a built-in California Special Education Management Information System (CASEMIS)* error check utility which can be used at any time. This error check also runs automatically during the IEP approval process so that CASEMIS errors are found and corrected as part of the IEP process.

All CASEMIS and IEP information is collected and stored in SEIS from the time the student is first entered into the system. The student's records, and all of their historical information and IEPs, moves with the student when they transfer to any of the nearly 1,000 districts in California using SEIS, even when transferring to a different SELPA!

*CASEMIS is the system that the California Department of Education (CDE) uses to collect data from each SELPA for Federal reporting purposes, and SELPA/District compliance with State and Federal laws.
