Bats at Audubon Canyon Ranch - Matt Duffy

The Contra Costa County Health Services Department has learned that 4th graders who recently attended overnight study trips at the Marin County Audubon Canyon Ranch may have been exposed to bats while sleeping in either of the two bunkhouses. Both bunkhouses have evidence of bats. As bats are carriers of the rabies virus, the Health Service Dept. have alerted families of the potentially exposed children and advised contacting their child's doctor or county health services as soon as possible.
