Four WCCUSD football teams reach sectional playoffs; games start tonight - Marcus Walton The West Contra Costa Unified School District will be well represented in the North Coast Section

(NCS) Football Playoffs that begin Friday.

For the third consecutive year, four District high schools qualified for the postseason tournament with De Anza, El Cerrito, Kennedy, and Pinole Valley high schools all earning a berth.

The NCS Selection Committee notified the four schools on Sunday, led by Kennedy (7-2), who was seeded No. 3 in Division IV and El Cerrito (7-3) seeded No. 4 in Division III. Pinole Valley (10-0) was awarded the No. 6 seed and De Anza (5-5) the No. 7 seed in Division III.

De Anza hosts No. 11 Tennyson (8-2) tonight at 7 p.m., El Cerrito hosts No. 13 Tamalpais (6-4) and Pinole Valley hosts No. 11 Terra Linda (6-4) tomorrow night at 7 p.m.

Kennedy will host the winner of No. 6 Fortuna (5-5) and No. 11 El Molino (3-6) in the Division IV quarterfinals on Saturday, Nov. 10 at 7 p.m.



Pumpsie Green, who integrated Red Sox, opens up about trail-blazing career

This year's World Series pits the first major-league baseball team to integrate against the last, and Pumpsie Green takes great pride in breaking the color barrier for the shamefully intolerant Boston Red Sox of 1959.

Fifty-nine years later, however, Green makes one confession: He would rather have played for his hometown team, the Oakland Oaks of the old Pacific Coast League.

It's one of many stories that Green, who turns 85 Saturday, shared on a recent afternoon at his home in the El Cerrito hills.

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A pair of Chronicle sportswriters with an appreciation for Green's place in history had gone in search of the former infielder but had heard his health wasn't great and that he might be unable to do interviews. Still, they decided to pay their respects; if they couldn't see Green, they would deliver their best wishes through his family.

But after a knock on the front door and a long wait, a man emerged – a smiling, healthy-looking, bright-eyed, gray-haired gentleman.

"I'm Pumpsie," he said. "Come on in!"



For the next two hours, in his memento-filled den with sweeping views of Mount Tamalpais and San Francisco Bay, the baseball treasure held forth on his life and career, including overcoming prejudices to become the first African American on baseball's whitest team.

"I did the best I could with what I had," Green said. "I had a little success, and I enjoyed that. I always say to myself, 'I accomplished the first thing I set out to do because I always wanted to be ...' well, I didn't always want to be a *major-league* ballplayer, I've always wanted to be an Oakland Oaks ballplayer because that was the big team around here."

Growing up in Richmond and attending El Cerrito High School and Contra Costa College, Green was emotionally attached to the Oaks — the Pacific Coast League, consisting of the Oaks, San Francisco Seals and six other clubs, was the primary baseball presence on the West Coast until the Giants and Dodgers moved west in 1958.

"I grew up listening to Bud Foster," Green said of the Oaks' radio voice. "That was my team, down the street on 40th and San Pablo (in Emeryville). That was a heck of a league, my league. The major leagues weren't my first preference. If I could play for the Oakland Oaks, I wouldn't have played in the major leagues. I never got the chance."

Instead, Green made history by integrating the Red Sox. The Dodgers integrated the game when introducing Jackie Robinson in 1947, but the Red Sox were owned by Tom Yawkey, a known racist who resisted adding black players even though the team had opportunities to sign legends such as Willie Mays and Robinson.

Finally, 12 years after Robinson became a Dodger – and three years after he retired – the Red Sox had a non-white player. Green played four seasons in Boston and one with the New York Mets, then played two more minor-league seasons before retiring. Green's goal wasn't to make headlines for being a pioneer, which Robinson and others had done, but for simply playing ball. He had played on plenty of multiple-race teams in the Bay Area and in the minors, and the Oaks clubs he followed already were integrated and included celebrated shortstop Artie Wilson, who had been a Negro Leagues star and teammate of Mays on the Birmingham Black Barons.

"Well, not really because when I came along, the biggest thing was where will you stay, where are you going to eat, what are you going to do, where are you going to go?" said Green, noting he wasn't initially allowed to stay or eat with his white Red Sox teammates.

"It practically overshadowed a lot of things I might've enjoyed more, but the conditions I was in, it just took a lot away from me, but I never let it get to me. Well, except a couple times."

Including the time one of his teams passed through San Antonio, where a heckler sitting alongside the dugout directed constant racial slurs toward Green.

"He weighed about 300 or 400 pounds, and he sat and drank beer, and I guess his thing was to give me hell," Green said. "He talked about me like a dog. He said, 'You got sent down because you're not going to play with Ted Williams. Boy, what's wrong with you?'

"He was loud and belligerent. People had to move away from him. I guess they got tired of him."

Discrimination followed Green through the Red Sox's organization including in 1959 when he played magnificently in spring training but was denied an Opening Day roster spot. The Red Sox still weren't ready to break from their prejudiced practices. At the end of training camp, Green was returned to the minors.

"That was the best spring I've had in my life," Green said. "The best ball I ever played in my life. I had the whole package. I was a shoo-in. ... I didn't know I was that good."

Green got the word from manager Mike Higgins, who said, "There'll be no n- on this ballclub as long as I have anything to say about it," according to Boston sportswriter Al Hirshberg's 1973 book, "What's the Matter with the Red Sox?" Higgins was fired in early July, and Green finally got his call to the big leagues in late July.

Green played his first nine games on the road and made his Fenway Park debut on Aug. 4 against the Kansas City A's in the opener of a doubleheader. Green led off, three spots ahead of Ted Williams — whom he befriended — and played second base. The crowd was far bigger than normal and included a large contingent of African American fans.

"There were a lot of blacks there that wanted to get into the park, but (the Red Sox) had seasonticket holders, so (many black fans) couldn't all get in," Green said. "So they roped a part of center field off. There were about 500 blacks sitting out there. They wanted to get in to see me, I guess. "That's the first time I remember being nervous. I did a lot of talking to myself. I said, 'Well, just do what you've been doing, you know how to play this game so just go play.' I got a standing ovation running out to second base."

Then came Green's first at-bat, leading off the bottom of the first inning.

"The place was rocking," he said. "I took a deep breath. I looked at the umpire. He said, 'Pumps, how are you doing?' I said 'fine.' I hit a line shot to left-center field, high off the Green Monster. I kept running toward second. I saw the ball still in the outfield. I just kept going, and I slid into third very easily.

"Another standing ovation. I thought the stands were going to break down."

Green scored on a ground ball, and the Red Sox won 4-1. He called his first Fenway hit his greatest baseball memory.

Six decades later, Green sits on a recliner in his den with well-worn baseball caps of two bigleague teams, the Red Sox and Giants, on a nearby table. He lives with his wife, Marie, and isn't far from his daughter Keisha, granddaughter Brittany, and three great grandsons, all of whom live nearby. Green was the oldest of five sons, including Cornell, who was a Pro Bowler with the Dallas Cowboys, and Credell, who was drafted by the Green Bay Packers.

Pumpsie was named Elijah after his father, but his mother called him Pumpsie. Green said his mom told him it was rooted from childhood neighbors in Oklahoma whose name rhymed.

"Their name was Lumpsie," Green said. "That sprung Pumpsie, so my mother said. They were such a good friend of mine, so they called me Pumpsie."

The family moved west during World War II, first to Oakland before settling in Richmond. Green never forgot his roots. After retirement, he became a baseball coach at Berkeley High School and remained active in the community. These days, he doesn't get out much as he battles diabetes but closely follows the Giants and 49ers — they arrived in the Bay Area before the A's and Raiders, after all.

Among the items hanging in Green's den is a team picture of the Oakland Oaks, his beloved hometown team for which he never got to play — even though he signed with them as a teenager and played with two of their farm teams in Wenatchee, Wash., and Stockton.

Green was stunned when the Oaks sold him to the Red Sox before the 1956 season, but he had no choice but to go, and he obviously made the best of an unfortunate time in baseball history. Breaking the Red Sox's color barrier was momentous and historic even if he had preferred to stay home and play for the Oaks.

"That was big-time baseball to me," Green said.

Tell us about your job and your background.

I am the principal at Kennedy High School. I actually am a graduate of Kennedy High myself, class of 1984. I had a passion for science, so after high school I attended Harvard University and studied engineering. After graduation, I worked in the telecommunications industry before realizing my calling to be a teacher. I feel very humbled and proud to return to my hometown to lead the school that helped me become the person I am today.

What inspired you to become an educator?

Teaching has been an ever-present theme in my life. While I was in high school, one of the most impactful experiences was volunteering at Martin Luther King Elementary tutoring fifth graders in math. After high school, I spent the summer before college working as an intern at Chevron's Richmond Technology Center as part of the Mathematics, Engineering, Science Achievement (MESA) Summer Jobs program doing research on solar cells. This was an amazing opportunity that further solidified my love of engineering and math.

How is it being back at Kennedy?

I realized that I could give back to the school that gave me so much and I thought, why not? Kennedy High has certainly changed a lot and I am committed to continue the school's ascent back to a place of pride. There is great potential on this campus to grow and raise leaders.

Tell us about some of your ideas for the school year.

Our vision is to make Kennedy the heartbeat of the south Richmond community. We want it to be the place where parents are proud to send their children, where teachers and staff want to work and where students want to learn. We have a lot of great partnerships that help us achieve that goal. Chevron provides STEM education opportunities to our students and the YMCA of the East Bay provides after school programs and health services.

What career advice would you give to students?

The one thing I say to our students is that we want them to develop the habits of a scholar. They need to attend school every day, on time and be ready to learn. We have an obligation to expose our students to as many career and college opportunities as possible. I tell them to find an area of study they are passionate about, develop good study habits and get involved outside of the classroom. We want students to be fearless in how they explore those interest areas.

How can community members support students?

We are always looking for ways to showcase the great work that is happening here and for the community to engage with us in as many ways as possible. We can always use more volunteers. We rely on the expertise and advice of our community to participate in our annual college and career days.

What do you love about Richmond?

The people here are so genuine. I'm taken with the many stories of how folks landed in Richmond, be it African Americans who can trace their arrival in Richmond to WWII activities, or people who are new who have intentionally chosen Richmond because this is the City of Pride and Purpose – the arrival stories are so rich. There are opportunities to enjoy all of the things that this community has to offer – from 23rd Street offerings to Point Molate nature hikes to the Cinco de Mayo and Juneteenth festivals – there are a lot of great things happening here that are open to everybody.
