Curriculum, Instruction & Assessment - Rubén Aurelio (Gabriel Chilcott & team) Science-John Iwawaki & Team

Elementary teachers in grades K-5 are using Mystery Science, both synchronously and asynchronously. Every Mystery Science lesson supports our model of "phenomena-based instruction" where students make an observation, ask questions, and work to figure out the science behind it. Mystery Science offers NGSS-aligned "full lessons" or shorter grade-agnostic "mini-lessons." They have also provided adaptations and recommendations for use in distance learning. Several of the mini-lessons cover contemporary topics like:

- "How do vaccines work?"
- "Do masks really stop the coronavirus?"
- "How does hand sanitizer kill germs?"

Math- Mark Lobaco & Team

K-8 Math Assessments--The midyear window for district math assessments in grades K-8 came to a close prior to Presidents' week break. K-1 assessments this year are site-determined and data is not collected centrally. A district-provided, standards-aligned, distance learning-friendly K-1 assessment has been created by the Math Department to support teachers in collecting and analyzing data to determine intervention needs. Grades 2-8 are using the Star Math assessment this year, and after this testing window, growth data can begin to be analyzed to celebrate successes and identifying needs. The Math Department has provided an informational slide deck on Star Math's growth reports with suggested actions for teachers and administrators

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CTE Teacher Credentialing - Rubén Aurelio (Allison Huie & team)

The Department of College and Career hosted an information session this week for all interested in learning about the CTE credentialing requirements and process. Bond Program Audit Schedule - Tony Wold & Luis Freese (Melissa Payne and Margarita Romo) Each year that a school District is operating with Bond Funds, the District is required to complete a Performance and a Financial Audit of the active Bond Program, in addition to the District-wide financial audit. The District is currently working with third-party auditors to complete all three audits to meet the statutory completion date of March 31, with the Audits brought to the Board in April.

In addition to the three compliance audits, the District has engaged two auditors to complete supplemental Bond Program audits to verify the implementation of historical recommendations that stem from the 2016 Forensic Accounting Investigation. Staff believes that it is essential to finalize the verification process. The proposed audit schedule previously targeted March 2021 to initiate the supplemental audits. Based on existing resources, the staff recommends that the supplemental audits' initiation is postponed until mid-April to allow the team to focus and complete the compliance audits. These audits do not have a

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statutory deadline and will ensure that they are completed appropriately by starting after we finalize the required annual audits.
