Learner-Centered Design - Sarah Breed & Alison Makela

We wrapped up our year long Equity Centered Deeper Learning Community of Practice for Principals on May 24th. Principals from the schools with Hewlett Funded Deeper Learning projects came together to reflect on their Equity Leadership, to share best practices for Deeper Learning, and to integrate concepts of Deeper Learning into their preparation for Summer School and Re-Opening. Our partnership with Eastern Carolina University supported this year long Community of Practice. The Equity Centered Deeper Learning practices of personal narrative, dynamic mindfulness, and consultancy were the focus for adult learning in this collaborative space for school leaders. Project Based Learning, Academic Discourse, Exhibitions, Portfolios, and Student Led Conferences were among the focal areas for the 18 schools who participated. We are grateful to the Hewlett Foundation for the support for this Community of Practice this year and look forward to deepening the work in the coming years.

In partnership with the Stanford Graduate School of Education and the Gardner Center for Youth and their Communities, we participated in a research study focused on Learner Centered Design at Harding Elementary School this year. Many thanks to Linda Takimoto for supporting this Participatory Action Research focused on Learner Centered Math Practices. The final Learner Centered Design Research Report is linked here for your reference.

In April, we concluded our Year Long course <u>Deeper Learning 101: A self paced study into Deeper Learning and Learner Centered Design</u>. Open to all members of the WCCUSD community and held in a salon format, participants engaged in learning and discussing concepts and principles of Deeper Learning.

The Office of Learner Centered Design is supporting the planning and design of the WCCUSD Virtual School. Concepts of Personalization, Deeper Learning, and Learner Centered Design are integrated into the planning process with staff.
