Contracts Update 5/28/21 – Tony Wold, ED.D., (Mary Kitchen & Team)

The Elementary Literacy Department is bringing forward 1 contract

• Reading and Writing Project Network:

Reading and Writing Project Network, LLC will partner with WCCUSD and provide: A Calendar of Conference Days: 12 days of conference days for each K-5 grade level. Leadership and Teacher Lead Days: A senior leader from the Reading and Writing Project (RWP) will work with K-5 principals for 2 full days to help support a closer alignment between school leadership and curriculum. RWP will work to plan a site-based K-5 2 day coaching; Which will give coaches an opportunity to practice replicable moves that they can use continually in all of their staff development, and it will help them to form a more field-based support group with each other. Each leader of this is able to work with approximately 25 coaches.

Homegrown Institute-Virtual: a 4 day-long event for the teachers and leaders of WCCUSD. This event will provide teachers with an opportunity to become vastly more knowledgeable as teachers of either reading or writing workshops. Sections are in grade cohorts of LK-2, 3-5, and 6.

School-Based PD: RWP will provide 10 days of professional development, 5 designed for K-2 and/or 5 for 3-5 in each of 3 schools.

The Expanded Learning Office is bringing forward one item and one increase:

The Expanded Learning Office oversees the District's 30 school-based expanded learning (historically referred to as "after school") programs. These state and federally funded Tier 1 programs are administered by the California Department of Education through the Expanded Learning Division and must begin on the first day of school and operate every day that school is in session, from the end of the core instructional day until 6:00pm.

These continuing service contracts are for the expanded learning lead agency partners who are charged with the day-to-day operations. While the number of students served varies by individual site's grant awards, the core components of the program remain the same: academic literacy and structured homework support; enrichment activities focused on skill development; nutrition; and physical activity.

The quality of these programs is overseen the District's Expanded Learning Office and ensured through the continuous quality improvement process (CQI) which relies on a evidenced based assessment tool, the School Age Program Quality Assessment (for grades K-6th) and the Youth Program Quality Assessment (for grades 7th-12th). The Expanded Learning Office works with an external evaluator to assess the experiences of student participants along with family satisfaction with the program.

What we are bringing forward at this time are the expanded learning contracts which share the same AMOs. The prices reflected are for 86% of the total grant awards which will go to direct services for WCCUSD students.

• Love Learn Success

Love.Learn.Success will provide a Tier 1 virtual summer enrichment program for 60 students at Grant ES from June 14-June 30, 2021 between the hours of 12:30-2:30pm. The program will serve students, grades 1st-5th, with priority enrollment for students who fall under the following categories: Identified Academic Needs, ELL, Newcomer, Identified Social Emotional Needs. Program offerings will include hip hop dance, visual arts, nutrition, sports, and drama. 60 students will be served. (1) 100% of students will participate in at least 30 minutes of light to moderate physical activity daily as measured by student attendance records in Hip Hop and Sports classes as inputted into Cityspan database; (2) 90% of students will state that they learned something new this summer on end of summer assessment.

Newsela is providing digital social studies content for all elementary students. Current events content is accessible in English and Spanish, in 5 different reading levels. The custom social studies package includes a full year of CA standards-based materials for grades 4-5. All teachers and students in grades K-6 will be able to access social studies materials to supplement current district adopted texts. Content includes primary sources, U.S. founding documents, biographies, and more.

WCCUSD students and teachers in grades K-6 will be able to access via the Clever Portal. Materials are available for the following sites: Bayview, Chavez, Collins, Coronado, Dover, Downer, Ellerhorst, Fairmont, Ford, Grant, Hanna Ranch, Harding, Highland, Kensington, King, Lake, Lincoln, Lupine Hills, Madera, Michelle Obama, Mira Vista, Montalvin, Murphy, Nystrom, Ohlone, Olinda, Peres, Riverside, Shannon, Sheldon, Stege, Stewart, Tara Hills, Valley View, Verde, Washington, and WC Mandarin.
