

We are thrilled to announce that we now have a full team to support our College and Career Pathways programs. John Iwawaki and Cherie Noland are joining the College and Career Department this year, shifting from former roles on the Teaching, Leading, and Learning team. And three new hires round out our team: Ariel Kirshenbaum, Cheyenne Pronga, and Josette-Neal-DeStanton.



The College and Career Pathways Support Team provides technical support to teachers in our 17 College and Career Pathway programs throughout the district. In addition to providing direct support to Pathway Lead Teachers, our Industry Connectors engage with colleges, business, industry, and other stakeholders to create career educational opportunities in each of the sectors they support. Ariel supports Health,

Cherie supports Law and Media, Cheyenne supports IT and John supports Engineering and Manufacturing. Josette, our new Work Based Learning Liaison, is working to develop system-wide protocols for Work Based Learning, including in-class experiences and our Summer Internship Program. In an effort to increase communication about available Work Based Learning experience opportunities, the College and Career Pathways Team has created and shared a regular newsletter that is shared with teachers. Check out our first issue <u>here</u>.

Intra-District Requests - Tony Wold (Julio Franco and Anne Shin)

As of September 11, 2020, the transfer office processed over 955 intra-district requests. The schools with the most requests for transfer destination included the following:

- Elementary Stewart, Washington, & West County Mandarin
- Secondary Korematsu & El Cerrito High.

The school sites with the most requests to leave included the following:

- Elementary Stege & Bayview
- Secondary DeJean & Kennedy

A total of 718 number of intra-district requests were approved for first-choice schools with 73 being given a second choice school or alternative option. 164 have been given denial notices due to a lack of space or seats at the targeted school sites. We do maintain a waitlist for these schools and are doing rolling admission as seats become available.

For special programs 183 students have been approved for DLI based transfers.

The September 23 board summary has three items for review. The Bright Futures Afterschool program will build academic skills, support homework completion and accelerate progress to and through grade level mastery. In the past Bright Futures has supported students from the following schools (and we anticipate students from these schools will attend again): Bayview, Crespi, DeAnza, Downer, Ellerhorst, Hanna Ranch, Hercules Middle and High, Middle College, Murphy, Olinda. Pinole Middle, Shannon, Stewart and Valley View.

Seneca Family of Agencies will provide trauma informed care, helping children and their families through the most difficult times of their lives at Ford, Verde, Stege, Montalvin and Ford Elementary Schools.

Scientific Adventures for Girls will provide virtual, hands-on, out-of-school time STEM programs at Tara Hills, Downer, Stege, Sheldon, Murphy, Coronado and Bayview Elementary Schools. We are committed to identifying partners to support our students during this period and are supporting sites to utilize their discretionary resources to maintain additional connections for each student we serve.


