## Curriculum, Instruction & Assessment Secondary-LaResha Martin (Gabriel Chilcott & team)

#### Math Department (Mark Lobaco & Team)

The Math Department continues to work to align the math course sequence with recommendations from the CDE and considerations from the UC Board of Admissions. Common Core middle grades mathematics carries additional coherence and rigor that was missing in previous state standards. This coherence and rigor includes standards from Algebra I and Geometry that are now in Grade 8, adding to a solid foundation of skills and concept knowledge that best prepares students for high school mathematics. We aligned the district course progressions with the California Department of Education's (CDE) Course Placement and Sequences. In addition, the new California Mathematics Framework is set to come out in May/June of 2022. A draft copy is available on the CDE website here, and Ch 7 reviews tracking and 8th grade standards rigor.

When the standards shifted and Math 7 and Math 8 became more rigorous, it was determined that we were skipping over some very important areas of learning when we accelerated before 9th grade. For students that wish to pursue taking a course such as Calculus, there will be multiple acceleration points afforded to them in high school. Here is the Math Parent Letter with a couple of examples of High School Acceleration for reference. In addition, we are considering new advanced courses to offer pathways other than Calculus.

#### Science (John Iwawaki & Team)

Judging for the 2022 WCCUSD STEM Fair for students in grades 6-12 was held on Tuesday, February 15. Many of our 39 judges come from local industry partners such as UC Berkeley, Chevron, USDA, Bio-Rad and others. This year's fair has been entirely virtual. Nearly 100 students from 11 sites around the district presented their projects in Zoom breakout rooms, using Google Slides to show their work, and answer judges' questions. The Awards Ceremony was held via Zoom on Thursday, February 17. The top projects from WCCUSD will have the opportunity to move on to the regional Golden Gate STEM Fair, and the California Science & Engineering Fair.

The African American Student of Honors celebration will be held on Thursday, May 19, 2022. The ceremony will be held in person for all eligible students grades 7-12. The criteria for this year's ceremony is as follows:

- Elementary Eligibility—ALL African American/Black elementary students will be recognized this year. Teachers will be asked to add a special recognition (attendance, behavior, above average test scores, etc.). If the special recognition for the elementary student is provided, it will be reflected on your child's certificate of achievement.
- Middle and High School Eligibility—Students with a cumulative unweighted grade point average of 3.0 and higher through the first three quarters of the school year will be recognized.

Please be on the lookout for school district, trustee area, AAPAC listening sessions. Along with the AASAT executive committee, the OAASA will be hosting sessions to learn and listen to our Black/African American families and students. The plan is for us to compile the information and present it to the AASAT as a whole and then the WCCUSD school board.

The consultant will provide mapping, demographic analysis, and community engagement support for the WCCUSD Independent Redistricting Commission's 2020 Census Board of Education Trustee Area Redistricting process that meets Federal and California Voting Rights Act requirements. Consultant's work under this Agreement shall be performed by Loren Collingwood, Sean Long, and other research associates who work with Collingwood Research under direct supervision of Loren Collingwood.

Teacher Job Fair Planned For Pinole, Hercules Area Schools - Patch

The pandemic has taken a toll on the teaching profession with distance learning, mask requirements, vaccine mandates and COVID testing. Finding enough regular and substitute teachers has put a strain on Pinole and Hercules schools and districts throughout the Bay Area.

In response, the Contra Costa County Office of Education has scheduled a county-wide Certificated Job Fair on Saturday, Feb. 26.
