Despite Gov. Gavin Newsom's pledge to provide at-home rapid tests to all 6 million California students, only about half of them made it out to counties by Monday, the Los Angeles Times reported. West Contra Costa Unified only received its allotment of 28,000 tests Thursday afternoon, district spokesman Ryan Phillips said, as parents grew concerned about whether they would get the tests in time for school.

WCCUSD to require that staff wear KN-95 masks at school sites | Richmond Standard

The West Contra Costa Unified School District (WCCUSD) announced today that all staff members at school sites will be required to wear a medical grade KN-95 mask while at work starting Monday, Jan. 10. The district, which employs 3,000 classified and certificated employees and serves 28,000 students, "has ordered enough masks for each employee to have one KN-95 mask per week through the end of the school year," according to the school district. As the highly-transmissible omicron variant of COVID-19 surges across the U.S., the California Department of Public Health has recommended upgrading masks from the less-effective cloth versions to better prevent its spread. WCCUSD expects the KN-95 masks to arrive this week and to distribute them to school sites before Monday.

The district is also closing its three COVID testing sites on Monday. The district does not plan to offer online instruction during the temporary closure.

High absences prompt WCCUSD to close schools for two days | Richmond Confidential

With a flare in COVID-19 cases keeping many students and teachers out of school this week, the West Contra Costa Unified School District has decided to shut down on Friday and Monday. The district will take two "smoke days" that the state allows superintendents to use at their discretion, to deep clean its buildings, Superintendent Kenneth "Chris" Hurst said in a news release Wednesday. Hurst attributed the high absentee rate to the omicron variant of the coronavirus, which is raging across the country. There were more than 11,300 COVID-19 cases in Contra Costa County on Thursday, an increase of about 500 from the day before, according to county Health Services. And the infection rate is particularly high for middle- and high-school-age children.
