Multiple Annual Vendors and Services Providers - Business Services

During the 2021/22 School year the district performed a comprehensive evaluation of all contracts. Contracts for services interacting directly with Schools and Students where AMOs can be provided are brought to the board as individual contracts to allow for review of these measures. There are also a large number of continuing service contracts that are necessary to the functioning of the school district. In the review of all contracts during our budget reduction process, we moved these types of "fixed" cost contracts that are standard to the District Operations Budget. After we were able to reduce and eliminate several multiple non-essential contracts at that time the remainder were sustained to ensure essential

services. What we are bringing forward at this time are the contracts that do not have AMOs (such as Republic Services because the AMO would be if they took the trash, etc). As these are annual renewals we are just providing the summary since some of the annual contracts have already been approved by the board. For the most part, the prices reflected are those for the 2021/2022 School year that will need to be adjusted to reflect the Consumer Price Index (CPI) for the coming year. As we do every year, we are asking for approval of these contracts so that there is no lapse in services from one year to the next in order to continue with the normal operations of the School District. In the next two board meetings, we may bring additional annual contracts for services forward as part of the normal business actions done each May and June.
