The California Healthy Kids Survey is currently being administered. The window will be open until Wednesday, June 7. All students in grades 3-12, school staff, and families are given the opportunity to take the survey. The results from the survey will be back in early July. The COPE (Counseling Options and Parent Education) program, continues to be run at 6 schools. Attendance conferences have begun with families and students are beginning to meet with counselors.

The Transfer Office is continuing to process applications. They are also working on using the district displacement procedures to determine if transfer students who are enrolled at an over-enrolled school will be displaced. They will work with principals at the sites when this situation occurs.


- Practicing mindfulness and relaxation techniques like meditation or yoga.

<u>eduCLIMBER Data Platform Pilot Update - Tracey Logan CTO - Morgan Matthews</u> (Research & Reporting)

Why are we piloting eduCLIMBER?

In response to ongoing data needs across our district and community, our Research & Reporting, Ed Services, Special Education, and Student Systems & Compliance teams have been exploring **how technology can help make student data more accessible, accurate, and actionable**. This winter and spring we have been setting up and piloting the eduCLIMBER platform with users, and the feedback so far is very positive.

What does eduCLIMBER do?

EduClimber is a self-serve data platform that makes our student data more easy to access, with the potential to increase and democratize data use across a wide range of users.

- A full rollout of eduCLIMBER next year would include:
 - teachers
 - o school staff
 - school administrators
 - o central office staff
 - o partner organizations
 - o executive leadership
 - o board, and
 - o community.
- eduCLIMBER stores much of our student data in one place, and helps users access multiple measures at the same time.
- Data measures in eduCLIMBER include key focal data on:
 - o attendance
 - behavior/discipline
 - o grades,
 - o assessment scores, and more.
- eduCLIMBER includes features for:
 - o automating updates to our data without manual work
 - o dashboards and charts,
 - o data walls/tables,
 - o intervention monitoring, and more.

Next Steps: After compiling the findings from our pilot, we anticipate bringing a recommendation to the board regarding eduCLIMBER in May.

Our ActivPanel pilot continues to receive rave reviews from teachers and students!


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
- Collins, Grant, and Lupine Hills all chose to add one more rotation of teachers for the pilot.
- Our Phase 2 schools (Ford, Riverside, Hercules Middle, Hercules High, Kennedy, Soskin) are completing their 3rd rotation. There will be one more rotation to finish off the year.

Throughout the pilot we've collected pre-implementation data from teachers and post-implementation data from teachers and students (grades 5 and up.) See a few data points.
