

On Tuesday, February 28, 2023, 29 of the District's 33 school based after school programs participated in the Expanded Learning Office's <u>Planning with Data Workshop</u> as part of our continuous quality improvement (<u>CQI</u>) process. This workshop took participants through a

process of reflecting on program quality data from external and self-assessments with the goal of preparing participants to draft their After School <u>Quality Action Plans</u>. These Quality Action Plans will guide professional development through the end of the school year.

Planning for intersession programming--spring break and summer--is continuing in earnest. The District's first ever <u>Spring Break Camps</u> will be operating at Bayview, Coronado, King, Lincoln, Nystrom, and Peres the week of April 3rd. Sites are finalizing their student rosters and the spring break enrichment contracts came to the board on 3/1. The morning program will include small group academic intervention with Sylvan and the afternoon enrichments include STEM (Scientific Adventures for Girls and Calculus Roundtable), performing arts (Destiny Arts and Bay Area Creatives), and gardening (Growing Together Project).

The Expanded Learning Office is also ramping up planning for summer enrichment programs. Using external evaluation data from Summer 2022 we are looking at attendance patterns and anticipating hosting full day summer programming at 8 elementary sites across the District along with providing afternoon enrichment at the District's 4 elementary summer school sites. We are anticipating a summer program model that includes: A+B programming at the identified elementary summer school sites (academic instruction in the morning and enrichment in the afternoon); full day enrichment programming (YMCA Day Camp and STEM camps); CBO-led full day enrichment programming (AIM High and Freedom Schools); and off site enrichment programming in partnership with several CBOs.

## Positive School Climate, OAASA & Enrollment- LaResha Huffman (LaShante Smith)

Schools are beginning to wrap up administering the Student Resource Survey (closing date 3/3) and screening students using mySAEBRS (closing date is 3/10). Once the administration windows close, the Office of School Climate will begin to disaggregate data.

The intradistrict transfer period is now closed. Applications submitted by the end of day on February 28 are now being processed. Families will receive notification after their application is processed.

The Attendance Office continues to focus on increasing attendance through the month of March. They will be assisting schools with family conferences, determining what resources and support families may need in order to have their students attend school regularly.

The Office of School Climate and OAASA supported the African American Literacy Night on February 28. Resources were shared, games were played, books given away, and raffle prizes given out. It was a great night for all of the families who attended!
