California Uniform Public Construction Cost Account Act (CUPCCAA) - Luis Freese

The California Uniform Public Construction Cost Accounting Act is also known as CUPCCAA. The Act is legislation enacted in 1983 to help promote "uniformity of the cost accounting standards and bidding procedures on construction work performed or contracted by public entities in the state" (Public Contract Code Section 22001). The Act is a voluntary program available to all public entities in the State, but it applies only to those public agencies that have "opted in" to the provisions set forth by the Act using the processes outlined in the Act. The District has participated in the Program since the original Board adoption of Resolution#90-0809. Many participating agencies appreciate the program because it has given them more leeway in the execution of public works projects under a certain dollar amount; sped up the award process; expedited project delivery; reduced the time, effort, and expense associated with bidding projects under \$200,000; and simplified administration for those projects. The District will present a list of delegated CUPCCAA projects to the Board for ratification throughout the year.
